Pupil Numbers in the Town

Y6 Secondary applications

Due to increased pupil numbers Workington Academy was over-subscribed which meant 19 of our Y6 pupils who wanted to go there were not offered a place. This is pending appeal outcomes. They were offered places at St Joseph's school although a significant number are now going to Cockermouth. The school is doing all it can to lobby on behalf of future years for an extension to the Academy so it can accommodate the pupils in the town. If you feel strongly about this please write or email your local County Councillor, you should be able to find contact details on the internet.

Reception Intake

As hinted at in the last newsletter we are also over-subscribed with a larger than normal number of applications to Reception (more than we have in Nursery). In order not to have similar disappointments and to ensure all our Nursery children can indeed stay at the school we have applied to the County to accept all the applications and we will need to secure funding to extend some areas in the near future. This has taken a lot of work and financial modelling and we hope that all parents will be relieved and proud we are doing our utmost to support them.

St Joseph's Information



The Headteacher, Mr Nevitt has visited the school since the Year 7 allocations were made. He said he was happy to deal with any queries from parents and can be contacted at hello@sjchs.uk. He said he is very much looking forward to meeting you and your child in the very near future.

During the summer holidays there will be a special four-day summer school for the new Year 7 pupils. This is a brilliant opportunity for your child to take part in various fun activities, get to know the school site and get to know their year group. Previous pupil and parent feedback has highlighted how much this has helped with transition and made children feel more confident in September. The school recommend that all new pupils attend all days but understand that this may not be possible. This will take place towards the end of the summer holidays from Tuesday 27th to Friday 30th August. The school will be in touch closer to the time to give more details to all the Year 7 starters.

We have been very kindly offered an allotment area in front of the Key Stage 1 Yard. This will enable us to extend the play space for our Key Stage 1 children into the future and we are blown away by the land owner's generosity. There will be further information in subsequent newsletters.

Politeness to Staff

Very disturbingly we are still getting some abrupt responses from parents verbally and on the phone, often regarding unpaid items.



The school has clear behaviour policy that is on our web site. Section 12 applies to parents. Any parent that

disrespects staff will be subject to sanctions from the school which at its extreme will result in a ban from the premises and limited communication with the school to protect staff and their wellbeing.

It is less than 1% of our parent population that can cause upset in their attitude on the phone, in writing or in person. This will NOT be tolerated and action will be taken.

All we ask is that you treat all staff with respect. School staff strive hard to do their best in supporting your child with their personal and academic development. They do this in an ever challenging job. All staff do this with good heart as they find their roles rewarding in supporting children. They should NOT face disrespect in any form from a parent and this will not be tolerated and is grossly unfair when all are committed to provide the best service they possibly can.

We are very pleased that the 99% of you reading this do treat staff with respect and many are often praising the good work staff do.

Welcome back,

We hope you've had a nice break over Easter whether you've been relaxing at home, been away on holiday or taking advantage of some of the activities that have been running in the local area, regardless of how interchangeable the weather has been.

The lead up to half term, unfortunately, wasn't all good news.

The school Governors share Mr Warbrick's concerns over the recent announcement of secondary school places and this is something that is high on the agenda for the next time we meet.

As a governing body, we all agree that we must contact Cumberland County Council, to have these concerns recorded, in a hope that others have done / are doing the same.

To date, there seems to have been little consideration for the pressures that are being put on local infrastructure (and the lack of investment) as a result of approving more new housing developments.

We were saddened to learn that our crossing patrol officer had resigned on the grounds of the impact that the behaviour of a minority of road users had on her health. The employment of a crossing patrol took several years to gain approval and as a local resident, I know that there were a lot of people involved in trying to make this happen.

Having stayed in touch with Shelley, I'd like to reiterate that this was absolutely nothing to do with any children or families from Beckstone.

We will continue to engage with the council in search of approval for a more permanent solution.

On a more positive note, there was a good atmosphere in the school on the run up to half term due to the various events that were taking place and this is set to continue with the upcoming quiz night, that has been organised by the PTA for Wednesday 24th April.

These events wouldn't be possible without your participation or investment so, thank you for your continuing support of the school.

The teachers and staff are looking forward to welcoming your children back and we hope everyone is looking forward to the new school term.

Health

Following on from the NHS stall at the recent Parents' Evenings the following are further information flyers on some of the issues that were discussed.

10 Top Tips for Parents and Educators DEVELOPING HEALTHY SLEEP PATTERNS

Quality sleep is paramount for wellbeing as it impacts our cognitive function, emotional balance and overall health. A World Health Organisation study highlighted that 44% of young people reported difficulty sleeping – potentially affecting their mood, concentration and immune system. Our guide offers expert tips for helping children to sleep more healthily.

1 MINDFUL TECH USE

Encourage a balanced approach to screen time. While phones, laptops, tablets and so on can serve as a helpful means of stress relief, it's advisable to minimise their use right before bed. These devices can keep the mind racing long after they're switched off, impacting how easily and how well a person can sleep.

2 EFFECTIVE SLEEP PRACTICES

Offer practical advice on reinforcing certain habits that have a positive influence on sleeping patterns. Children could start keeping a diary which they add to each evening, for example – or they could use up excess energy by exercising during the day.

3 HYDRATION HABITS

Underline the importance of drinking plenty of water throughout the day, while limiting drinks close to bedtime to prevent disruptions during the night: it's a lot harder to switch off if you keep needing to get out of bed for the toilet. Avoiding caffeinated drinks later in the day also allows the body and brain to slow down naturally, without any chemicals firing them back up.

4 CONSISTENT BEDTIME SCHEDULE

Assist children in developing consistent bedtime routines that tell the body it's time to wind down, promoting a more relaxed state. Establish specific activities for young ones right before going to bed – such as brushing their teeth – to set up an association between that action and falling asleep.

5 OPTIMAL SLEEP ENVIRONMENT

Ensure that the bedroom is comfortable, dark and free from distractions, fostering an ideal space for quality rest. The room's temperature should also be suitable for sleeping – that is, not too hot and not too cold – while rooms should be kept as tidy and free of clutter as possible.

6 RELAXING EVENING ACTIVITIES

Recommend activities that have a calming effect on the mind – such as reading or gentle stretching – in the lead up to bedtime, to prepare the mind for a peaceful night's sleep. Doing something quiet, relaxing and low intensity signals to the brain that it's time to rest and makes falling asleep much easier.

7 PRIORITISING ADEQUATE SLEEP

Emphasise the crucial role of sleep in maintaining physical and emotional wellbeing. It's especially important to sustain a healthy sleep pattern during challenging and intensive periods in our lives: during the exam season for children and young people, for instance.

8 NUTRITIONAL BALANCE

Highlight the significance of a healthy, balanced diet – and its role in establishing a more consistent sleep pattern. Try to lean towards preparing meals with plenty of fruit and vegetables, served in reasonable portion sizes: not only is this a lot healthier, but it also reduces the chances of feeling too full to be comfortable in bed.

9 PARENTAL SUPPORT

Parents and carers, of course, are uniquely situated to support their children in establishing and maintaining healthy sleeping habits. Parents can review their own sleep habits (incorporating anything from this list that they don't do already) to model a balanced bedtime routine and reinforce the importance of self-care.

10 MILITARY SLEEP METHOD

Look up 'the military sleep method': it's a technique for falling asleep quickly, which incorporates deep breathing exercises. You could encourage children to try it or even use it yourself. While it can take a good deal of practice to perfect, eventually it will start to feel natural – and the results are often extremely impressive!

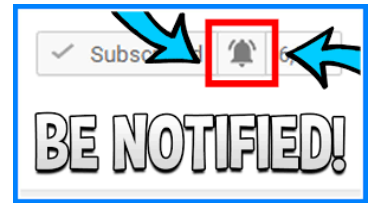

Y2 SATs

National Tests for Year 2 children
have been phased out. The Year 1
Phonics check continues but all
Years now apart from Year 6 will
be subject to internal testing, the
outcomes of which will be
reported to you in the end of Year report. There are
some Y2 SAT materials for internal use which schools
may use and we are going to do this but the results are
used in exactly the same way as per every other year
group.



Y6 SATs Revision

The 'revision' zone for pupils to use on
the web site is being updated and is
available to support your children to get
ready for the end of Year 1 (phonics – this also applies
to Year 2 children who did not achieve
the pass mark of 32 out of 40 last time
and will be sitting it again), Year 4 for
their times table check and at the end
of Key Stage 2.

Tickets are available on Parent Pay priced at £3.50 per person including quiz sheets, a drink and a hot dog.

Living Eggs

The school again incubated eggs this year and the hatchings were streamed live to classrooms. The resultant chicks were ever so cute and went on tour of the school, so all the children had close first hand experience of the chicks. They have now left the school and gone to a local farming family whose children go to the school so we will be kept in touch of their development.

Lambing Season

The same farming family, the Forsyths, are hoping to bring some lambs in to school soon so the children also get first-



hand close-up experience of lambs. If you think your child may be allergic, please let school know. The visit last year was a huge success.

Food & Drink

School Meals cost £14.50 per week (£2.90 a day) payable on ParentPay. This is still great value when you look at prices of goods in supermarkets for packed lunches. We would recommend a hot meal for all the children during the winter and would encourage those on packed lunches to make a change.



Please note that your child cannot change from packed lunches to school meals or vice versa without a week's notice.

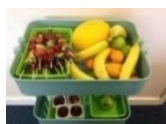


Milk for NEXT half term costs £7.00 payable by Friday 19th April 2024.

Milk is vital for growing children as it strengthens bones and teeth. Children in Reception and Nursery are entitled to free milk as are children who are eligible for free school meals and clothing vouchers (not the universal free meal for all FS & KS1 children). The cost of milk for the first half of the spring term is **£7.00** and

needs to be paid by **Friday, the 19th of April 2024** via ParentPay NOT cash or cheque. Due to the administrative burden of checking attendance and the inability to change the order daily unfortunately milk money cannot be refunded for absence.

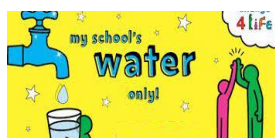
Snack money for Nursery and Reception is **£12** for this half term. This is paid on ParentPay and please pay by **Friday 19th April 2024**.



Fruit is **£7.00** for the second half of spring term, again payable on ParentPay by **Friday 19th April 2024**. This is for playtime snacks. Children in EY & KS1 also get fruit free during the day.

When using ParentPay please can you check your payment has gone through – you should get an email to confirm payment. The school does not receive notifications of attempted payments. Thank you!

Water



A reminder to all families that **ONLY** water is allowed as a rehydrating drink during the school day. This can be brought in via water bottles. Squash is available at lunchtimes for those that want it then. Please do ensure compliance as any squash/juice being drunk outside lunchtimes will be confiscated.

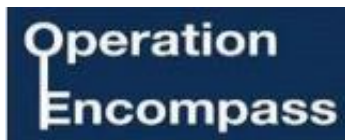
Safeguarding/Child Protection

Full details on the county's policies, procedures and processes with regard to safeguarding plus analysis of outcomes of serious case reviews can be accessed through the Cumbria LSCB website at

www.cumbrialscb.com the site also has a parental information zone.

In addition to the above the school has a 'Safeguarding Zone' on its website which contains the above link as well as relevant school policies, further information and a diagram showing how we keep your child safe in school. It is well worth a look.

Sharing information is in the best interests of children and their safeguarding. The school reserves the right to share and receive information from other agencies that may have had dealings with your child.



If you ever have any concerns about the safety or wellbeing of a child, then you can ring your concerns through to the County's 24 hour 'Safeguarding Hub' number and you can remain anonymous if you wish. Callers can outline their concerns and the Safeguarding Hub will give advice (consultation) and if necessary, undertake an assessment of need.



There is now also an adult NSPCC helpline where any concerned adult can seek advice if they are concerned about a child and would like advice on whether to make a referral. The number to call is:



Domestic Violence

Debbie Cook, our Educational Support Manager has trained to be a 'Domestic Violence Champion' and is a resource available to any adult who would like to confidentially share incidents with her and is a very good source of advice. Just contact the School Office to get in touch with her.

Domestic violence is on the increase and causes terrible harm to victims and the associated children.

It is everyone's responsibility to ensure it is eradicated. We are working closely with the Police and the school will learn of any incidents to support any children whose lives are affected by such an occurrence.

WhatsApp & Ongoing Concerns



WhatsApp has featured regularly in these newsletters as the minimum age is above Primary age and so technically no child at our school should be using it. Recently Meta dropped the minimum age to 13, still well above our top age of 11.

Now on at least a weekly basis there are items in the news concerning WhatsApp and its detrimental effect on children, particularly their mental health.

Quite simply young minds are not mature enough to deal with the issues WhatsApp raises.

Of huge concern is the news last Friday that in the North East a number of pupils at Primary schools have been added to malicious WhatsApp groups promoting self-harm, sexual violence and racism. Northumbria Police has issued warnings to thousands of parents. Of equal concern is that 'strangers' setting up these groups then have access to the children's WhatsApp groups and can target them individually.

It is well worth a read if your children have a WhatsApp account as what happens in the North East can very easily happen here. It makes sobering and very concerning reading.

Do you know your child is safe?

The solution is simple, please, please, please DO NOT let them have a WhatsApp account...check their phone very regularly and discuss dangers with them. Preserve their childhood and their childhood innocence and help them develop into the well balanced and thoughtful adults we all want them to be.
