

School Milk

Milk is vital for growing children as it strengthens bones and teeth. Children in Reception and Nursery are entitled to free milk as are children who are eligible for free school meals and clothing vouchers (not the universal free meal for all FS & KS1 children). The cost of milk for the first half term in the Spring is **£8.00** and needs to be paid by Friday, 11th January. Due to the administrative burden of checking attendance and the inability to change the order daily unfortunately milk money cannot be refunded for absence.

Safeguarding is
everyone's
responsibility.



Full details on the county's policies, procedures and processes with regard to safeguarding plus analysis of outcomes of serious case reviews can be accessed through the Cumbria LSCB Web Site at www.cumbrialscb.com. The site also has a parental information zone. In addition to the above the school has a 'Safeguarding Zone' on its web site which

contains the above link as well as relevant school policies, further information and a diagram showing how we keep your child safe in school. It is well worth a look.

Sharing information is in the best interests of children and their safeguarding. The school reserves the right to share and receive information from other agencies that may have had dealings with your child.



If you ever have any concerns about the safety or well-being of a child then you can ring your concerns through to the County's 24 hour 'Safeguarding Hub' number and you can remain anonymous if you wish. Callers can outline their concerns and the Safeguarding Hub will give advice (consultation) and if necessary undertake an assessment of need.

They are a team of social workers, police and health workers who will give you advice or take action if required. You don't need to give your details. All calls are taken seriously.

Nursery Intakes



Children born between **1 September 2015** and **31 December 2015** can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week Nursery education from **January 2019**.

Children born between **1 January 2016** and **31 March 2016** can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week from **April 2019**.



Children born between **1 April 2016** and **31 August 2016** can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week from **September 2019**.

Cinema Nights








Facebook

Please ensure you are reading daily with your children and at least 5 times a week. We trust parents to be honest when signing that their child has managed 5 sessions! Some tips to help your child with reading are at the top of the next page.

All children across the school in every Key Stage should be reading daily!



Ways a Parent Can Help with READING

1 Let your child see you reading!

Have magazines and books in your home.

2 Help your child find appropriate word & reading games on the computer.

Keep a dictionary on hand. Help your child look up new words they read or hear.

3 Read mysteries with your child and try to figure out the clues together.

4 Movie version coming out?

Read the book together first, then talk about which you each liked better.

5 Set aside a time and place for your child to read -

like a comfy chair and a reading light in a quiet place

6 Visit your public library regularly.

Look for and read together the books that were your favorites when you were a kid.

7 Encourage your child to write -

letters, thank you notes, emails, journals, lists, stories about their own trips, events, and daily life

8 Ask your child questions about what he or she is reading, such as:

- What is the story about?
- Who are the important characters in the story?
- Where does the story take place?
- Why do you think the character made that choice?
- Why did that happen?
- How did you know about...?
- Would you recommend this book to your friends?

9 Ask your child to draw a comic strip about what happens in the story.

Provide word searches, crossword and other word games and puzzles, or help your child make his/her own



Share with your child about what you're reading... and encourage your child to do the same






