
information about Sport at the school, match reports and stunning photos. The zone also details how the school's Sports Premium money has been allocated and will be updated again in the very near future.

Workington Amateur Swimming Club]


In relation to the above and to help with next year's team (!) we would encourage you to explore the possibility of enrolling your child in Workington Swimming Club

Organisation 2019/20



In September the school will be completely 'full' from Reception upwards (there are only Nursery places left), the Governors

have a strict policy of having no classes over 30 pupils. This is a result of the popularity of the school and the new housing in the area. Indeed the 'fullness' of the school is resulting in a number of disappointed families in the locality. There are already waiting lists for many year groups held by the School Admissions Team at the County who control admissions and sadly there is nothing the school can do to accommodate extra children. If you know any families with young children please encourage them to sign up for Nursery to avoid disappointment.

As a result of this there is no 'wiggle room' with regard to placements in classes. A lot of thought has gone into classes for next year. It is important you support your child in their transition to their new class and be positive about their placement.

Please do not appeal against their placement.

A lot of thought has also gone into how the school is organised as the intake of a class and a half (45 pupils in general does not make for easy class groupings or straight year groups across the school). The school will be organised as follows:

Nursery – offering 30 hours for those eligible or a free 15 hours with an optional purchase of additional care of up to a further 15 hours in our brand new exciting new classroom (see later)

- 2 X Reception classes
- 1 X Year 1 Class
- 1 X Year 1/2 Class
- 1 X Year2 Class
- 2 X Year 3 Classes
- 2 X Year 4 Classes
- 1 X Year 5 Class1 X Year 5/6 Class
- 1 X Year 6 Class.

Foundation: Mrs White Key Stage 1: Mr Fleming Years 3 & 4: Mrs Yoxall Years 5 & 6: Ms Gorman Where there are mixed age classes these are being set up as mixed ability classes and not based on academic ability so are certainly not 'sets'.

Your child's class will have already been shared with them if they are in Years N to 1. All other children will visit their new classes on Friday 12th July and again on Monday 15th July. Again, please do not appeal against their placement. Please rest assured that children's friendships have been closely considered and that school staff will have placed children well to ensure they can make maximum progress.

If you ever have any concerns about the safety or well-being of a child, then you can ring your concerns through to the County's 24 hour 'Safeguarding Hub' number and you can remain anonymous if you wish. Callers can outline their concerns and the Safeguarding Hub will give advice (consultation) and if necessary undertake an assessment of need.



There is now also an adult NSPCC helpline where any concerned adult can seek advice if they are concerned about a child and would like advice on whether to make a referral. The number to call is

Debbie Cook, our Educational Support Manager has trained to








Year 5 & 6 Public Health Survey


Most of the children in Year 5 & 6 took part in an anonymous online questionnaire to help the health service target resources towards that age group.

Of interest in the outcomes was the finding that many of the pupils used social media despite being under minimum ages, many did not have parental controls and many did not have parents who checked their activity. More worryingly some are conversing with people they do not know! The results are below.

Clearly these results highlight a concern we have had as a school for a long time and one that has been referred to many times in these newsletters.

Parents, please ensure your children are safe, this sadly is not the default on today's online activity. Do attend the cyber safety training, it will help you support your children.

To keep them safe DO NOT let them join social media apps such as Instagram, WhatsApp, Facebook etc. All have **MINIMUM** ages above **13.** Do not let your child pressurise you and say everyone has them...blame Mr Warbrick and state the school wants to keep you SAFE!




The lost property box will be emptied of all unclaimed clothes at the end of term.



Calculation Policy

The school has a detailed calculation policy that reflects the National Curriculum as well as the methods taught in school for calculation.

The Policy is available on the school web site in the policies section and should prove to be a valuable reference point for parents to support their children with Maths at age appropriate levels. The relevant sections for your child will be shared at the Curriculum meeting on Tuesday 16th July with your child's new teacher.

Perhaps use it to dip into and help your child with Maths over the summer to prepare them for their next class.

Holiday Homework

Your child will receive some basic skills tasks to learn in readiness for their new curriculum year before the end of term.



Please help them ensure they have the necessary skills to make a success of their next school year.

The most important homework of all is to **ensure you** read with your child for at least 20 minutes daily or ensure their day is structured to allow them to, read on their own, when they are able for sustained periods. Indeed reading to your child at bed time for example is



also extremely valuable. The world of books will develop your child's imagination, vocabulary and knowledge of the world around them. It is quite simply the

key to learning!

Taking part in the Library Summer Reading Challenge would go a long way to supporting your child with their holiday reading and it is FREE – see earlier article.

Mathletics & Education City – Home Access



All children from Year 1 upwards have access to Mathletics at home (as well as Education City). They should all know their passwords; they are the same for both.

Your child should also have access to 'Times Table Rock Stars' and should know their log in details. This is also available as an app from the Play Store of the App store, the children then just need to log in with



their normal school user name and password. We hope good use is made of it. Times Table testing is going to become a national statutory test for Year 4 children from next year so this could prove

to be a very worthwhile summer activity.



Software to help and encourage all children to learn their times tables is 'Times Table Rockstars'. Children from Year 1 upwards have their own 'Rock Avatar' and can earn points for their avatar and to work towards a series of certificates and badges that are awarded in assembly.

Children can earn badges for good reading behaviours, be coached in their understanding by their personal 'Reading Buddy', take quizzes and record all the reading they do. Everything is captured so that your child's teacher can see how they're getting on.



Eatwell Guide

Related to the above is the 'Eatwell Guide' that has been issued by Public Health England'. A copy is reproduced below. The picture shows the proportional amount of each food type a child over 2 years old should be eating over the course of a day to ensure it grows into a healthy adult with a long lifespan. It shows that fruit and vegetables should be eaten in similar amounts to carbohydrates, a lesser amount on protein based foods, less again on dairy and very little on oils and butters.

A school dinner is designed to help your child achieve such a healthy balance and this is why it is strongly recommended.
