## **WALK OF REMEMBRANCE**

Monday 1 October - Friday 30 November 2018

**St. Mary's Church (C of E)**  
Main Road, Harrington

*Open: 10.30am - 3pm on Tuesdays and Thursdays during the walk*

There has been a church on the site since Norman times and it has been rebuilt twice – firstly in 1634 and then early in the 19th century. The church is now a Grade II listed building.

The churchyard contains a large war memorial dedicated to servicemen from the area. The war memorial was originally unveiled on the 8th November 1925 with Lt. Colonel Sousby, Border Regiment, in attendance.

The Remembrance Parade for the village ends at the churchyard and the Remembrance Service is then carried out at the war memorial.

### Remembrance Parades



The school will also be joining in the Harrington Remembrance Parade in the morning of the 11<sup>th</sup> November. The Parade will leave the British Legion at 9.15am and arrive at

Church at 10am. We will then be taking part in the Workington parade at 2pm. The itinerary for this is as follows:

- Assemble at Pow Street at 1.45pm
- Parade begins at 2pm using the following route, Pow St > Finkle St > Vulcans Lane > Vulcans Park for 2.15 for a sort service and laying of wreaths.
- The Parade then moves to Corporation Rd and passes Town Hall for an 'eyes right' salute then Oxford St > James St > Washington St > St John's Street
- Arrive at St John's Church for Remembrance Service at 3pm

### School Milk

change the order daily unfortunately milk money cannot be refunded for absence.

## Harassment Online

It is becoming increasingly worrying that there are more and more children coming into school and complaining that they are being harassed by their peers online.

Children have entered our setting upset because one of their peers has used threatening and abusive language towards them whilst playing online games the night before.

It is concerning that a child has to start their school day worried and at times afraid of the repercussions of what has been said the night before.

Anxiety is a major barrier to learning.

Cyber bullying is an offence and peer on peer abuse is totally unacceptable.

**Harassment** - This is the act of sending offensive, rude, and insulting messages and being abusive. Nasty or humiliating comments on posts, photos and in chat rooms.

### Threatening behaviour

Anyone who makes threats on the internet could be committing a criminal offence. It's against the law in the UK to use the phone system, which includes the internet, to cause alarm or distress. It could also be against the 1997 Harassment Act. If threats are made against your child then it's essential they know to confide in their parents or someone they trust so that they can make a complaint to the police. If you can't print out the threats use the "print screen" button or snipping tool to take a snapshot of the computer screen and then save that somewhere safe. Or if you have a phone or tablet, use the screenshot function and keep these images safe.

You can help us and your child by considering these questions

- Do you know who your child is talking to online?
- Can you hear or see what your child is saying?
- Are they playing age appropriate games?

Callers can outline their concerns and the Safeguarding Hub will give advice (consultation) and if necessary undertake an assessment of need.

Domestic violence is on the increase and causes terrible harm to victims and the associated children.

It is everyone's responsibility to ensure it is eradicated. We are working closely with the Police and the school will learn of any incidents in order to support any children whose lives are affected by such an occurrence.



**Do you have concerns about a child or young person?**

If you have a concern about the safety or well-being of a child or young person, you should contact the County Triage Team. They are a team of social workers, police and health workers who will give you advice or take action if required.

You don't need to give your details. All calls are taken seriously.

### Anti-Bullying Week



The school will have a big focus on 'anti bullying' during the week beginning the 12<sup>th</sup> November and the children will be involved in learning and discussing strategies to combat any incidences of bullying be it in or out of school or indeed reality or virtual bullying (e.g. by text etc) at a whole school level.

The theme for Anti-Bullying week this year is #choosekindness. The Behaviour Intervention Group [BIG] (consisting of pupils and staff) will visit classrooms to help deliver a session in which the children are encouraged to consider how small acts of kindness and appreciation can change lives and that by being kind, we are modelling positive behaviour for children who might be showing bullying behaviour. The session will be planned for shared teacher and BIG group delivery. The class will then be invited to write 'thank you' notes to someone in school who deserves appreciation. These will be posted in the 'Appreciation Station' post boxes. These will be emptied every day and the notes distributed at home time.



### UK Parliament Week



It is also 'UK Parliament Week' in the week beginning the 12<sup>th</sup>

November. Classes from Reception to Year 6 will be learning about how British Democracy works at a level appropriate to their age. This is the first time the school has had a focus on this national topic and it is hoped the children will learn a lot from it.

### Packed Lunch Policy

The Governors agreed a new 'Food & Drink' Policy at their last meeting. The policy can be found in the policy zone of our web site.

There is agreement that packed lunches should be healthy and comply with Government nutritional guidance in the same way that school meals have to. Research has shown that nationally only 1 in 100 school packed lunches do so.

There is a healthy snack swap chart at the top of the next column to give guidance on how packed lunches can be made healthier.

It is sometimes assumed that packed lunches are cheaper than school dinners. The cost for a week's school dinners is **£11** however the following costs are for items for Aldi for a week's worth of packed lunches:

Butter	£0.46
Filling – Ham, cheese or tuna	£2.97
Savoury snack	£0.99

Fruit – apples, grapes or carrots	£2.84

### Parents' Evenings

The Parents' Evenings this term are towards the middle of this month (Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> and Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup>). As well as asking you to complete a questionnaire about mailing and payment preferences plus an educational visit consent form the meeting will focus on a detailed report of your child's progress given the changes outlined above. In addition to updating you on your child's progress, you will also receive their coloured ratings for effort, behaviour, attendance and many other things as per last year. We will also be asking you to support your child by setting targets for you to support them at home and these will be reviewed at the next Parents' Meeting.

**Finally there will be 'taster' stations for School Meals so you will be able to taste for yourself how tasty they are!**



### School Reports

The termly report that builds up to a completed end of year report will be shared at parents' evenings later this month. The format of the reports from Year 1 upwards has been 'slimmed down' in order to simplify them. This term and next term you will only receive page 1 of the report with page 2 being added in the Summer which will include details of your child's attainment and effort in all subjects.

The 'Traffic Light', red, amber and green ratings remain and are on the front page. If your child is not receiving a green rating for any aspect of their school life please support them to put this right by the time the reports are re-issued in the Spring.

The report will show the stage and half term your child was working at the start of their year (we are calling it their 'Baseline') and their current attainment level for Reading, Writing and Maths. Children from Year 2 upwards are also being assessed on their spelling and vocabulary formally now and this will also show on the reports but without a baseline or target as this is new. Your child's class teacher will help you to understand what these figures mean and will also explain how this feeds into their end of key stage target.

For children in Year 2 and Year 6 who are at the end of their Key Stage and have nationally reported results at the end of the year then their outcomes in the summer will be reported on an additional page as follows:

For Maths (Y2 & Y6) & Reading (Y2 & Y6) and SPAG (Spelling, Punctuation & Grammar – Y6 only) each Y2 & Y6 child will get:

- A raw test score (how many marks they got on the test)
- A scaled score (where your child's score is compared to all taking the test nationally where a score of 100 is the average mark)
- Notification of whether they are at the nationally expected standard or not.

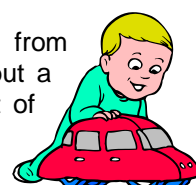

### Cinema Nights

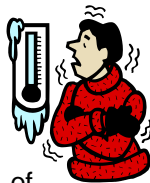

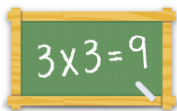
