Latest Covid Update

The Government has moved Cumbria into Tier 4 but has stated Primary schools in this area, unlike some other Tier 4 areas, must open as normal. It is therefore essential, given the new variant strain, that everyone follows the guidelines in order to keep all our families and staff safe. The Tier 4 regulations are reproduced in full on the following page. Please take your time to read and absorb them. Of particular importance are the following:




- Keeping social distancing in and around the school grounds as it can get congested
- Wearing a mask when in and around the school grounds
- Not mixing outside school with any other households inside apart from a support bubble
- Reducing items that come backwards and forwards to school – particularly packed lunches
- Only mixing outside with one other person. This means your children cannot go out to play after school with their friends.
- There can be no ‘get togethers’, not even for children’s birthdays. We will have a birthday ‘day’ this half term for all those with birthdays to have a ‘special day’ further details later in the newsletter.

In addition to keep all safe at school the school will be stringently applying behaviour rules. Please ensure your children are aware of these from the home school

agreement and that touching each other or rough play is NOT allowed and will be dealt with seriously as it endangers safety.

Covid Map

There is a web site that will show the number of Covid cases in the vicinity of the school and will compare these with Allerdale. As

Emergency Planning

Please note that children may be sent home with no notice e.g. a child had a test and was notified it was positive during the school day. We have a detailed action plan for every eventuality but all parents need one too as there is a possibility you will be contacted to come to school immediately to collect your child for an isolation period of 10 days. It is perhaps prudent to let employers know this may occur if you don’t have other child care arrangements.





Isla from Year 4 was the overall winner and her card has been turned into a card that the Mayor will send out this year.

Domestic violence is on the increase and causes terrible harm to victims and the associated children.

It is everyone's responsibility to ensure it is eradicated. We are working closely with the Police and the school will learn of any incidents to support any children whose lives are affected by such an occurrence.

Children's Birthdays

We realise that due to restrictions many children have not had birthday parties this year. On Friday 11th December we hosted class parties for all those that had a birthday from the start of September to the end of December. The 'birthday' children came in non-uniform and hopefully had a great day. Following on from the success of these parties we will now hold half termly parties for the rest of the year so the children can have a 'special' day in school. This half term's birthday party is for all those that have a birthday from the start of January until the end of half term – Sunday 21st February. Children with birthdays in this period can come to school in party clothes on **Friday 12th February**. All birthday children will also receive a special 'birthday hat'.

Packed Lunches

Please can all note that the weakest point in all our Covid secure operations are packed lunches as guidance is to minimise items coming to and from school to prevent Covid spread.

THIS IS PARTICULARLY IMPORTANT AT THE MOMENT FOR EVERYONE'S SAFETY

Please can all packed lunch families give thought to moving their children to school meals NOW!

Please also refer to the nutritional guidelines in last month's newsletter for packed lunches. We follow the guidance of the children's food trust.



School meals only cost £2.20 a day or £11 for the week in Key Stage 2 and payment has never been simpler using the Parent Pay facility. Your child will receive a nutritionally balanced meal with a wide range of choices and you can rest assured they are eating healthily and plentifully. Service speeds have now speeded up following the Covid changes and portion sizes are now plentiful. The menu is available on our web site.

Parking

There are 2 ongoing issues with regard to parking;



1. Ensuring everyone's safety and resident's wellbeing by not parking in restricted areas e.g. on yellow lines, zig zags or by blocking drives etc.
2. On the other hand there is extremely limited places for parking around the school area.

A parent would like to set up a working party to look into ways these 2 issues could be tackled to find a solution that begins to resolve both issues. The proposal is to have a socially distanced meeting in a well ventilated Sports Hall if there is sufficient interest. Advertisements

If you run a business or know of someone who does (even baby-sitting services) then please do get in touch with the School Office. An advert costs £5 a month, goes to at least 500 local households (parents, staff etc.) and also provides much needed funds for the

The Rae Way – Back Path

Please be careful using the back path in frosty weather as it was an issue last year with frost making the tarmacked parts of the path slippery. We will try our best to grit it this year but this is not common practice as it is not our land however as the paths are being used extensively for staggered school access we will do what we can. The grit for doing this will be an additional cost to the school budget which again wasn't budgeted for.



School Milk, Snack & Fruit

Milk is vital for growing children



as it strengthens bones and teeth. Children in Reception and Nursery are entitled to free milk as are children who are eligible for free school meals and clothing vouchers (not the universal free meal for all FS & KS1 children).

The cost of milk for THIS half term is **£7.50** and needs to be paid by **THIS Friday, 8th January, via ParentPay NOT cash or cheque.** If you need help with this please see the School Office. Due to the administrative burden of checking attendance and the inability to change the order daily unfortunately milk money cannot be refunded for absence



Snack money for Nursery and Reception can now also be paid by ParentPay and is due by the same Friday, 8th January (£6...£1 a week)

and

fruit tuck shop money from Year 1 is now also paid this way (£6, again £1 a week) and again by Friday 8th January.

School Funds

We need donations to this fund as funds are getting REALLY tight as the school has had no extended services



or donations income since March so please help if you can. The school fund is purely donation based and is used to buy many consumable items and fun activities outside the remit of the school budget for the pupils as well as many other things for school that enable us to provide services free of charge.

Please have a ratch down the sofa or anywhere to find some spare money to donate to the school to support all the children.

Please help if you can by donating to this fund.



Now we have the ParentPay system we can offer the facility for families to make an automatic School Fund donation on a monthly basis, from their bank account even £2 per month would cumulate to a great fund to support activities in school. If you would like to support the school in this way please contact the School Office for further details on how to set this up or, if you would rather, for direct debit details.

Nursery Intakes

Children born between **1 January 2018** and **31 March 2018** can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week from **April 2021**.



Children born between **1 April 2018** and **31 August 2018** can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week from **September 2021**.

Children born between **1 September 2018** and **31 December 2018** can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week Nursery education from **January 2022**.

If you know of any children with birth dates between these times and would like their child to come to this school, then please ask them to get in touch with the School Office as soon as possible.

Beckstone's Extended Services



Our extended services include the Breakfast Club (£4.00 from 7.30am, £3.50 from 8am) Last entry is at 8.30am; Educare (our popular afternoon child care provision for morning Nursery children – see table) with pick up times at 2.15pm and 3.15pm. Please note that unfortunately we are unable to offer facilities for packed lunches for Nursery children. Beckstone Xtra (again £3.50 an hour) runs from the end of the school day until 5.15pm with an earlier pick up time of 4.15pm if required.



The prices for our extended services are extremely competitive to support families in these difficult economic times. The price per hour is only £3.50. This is very good value and an extremely competitive rate for child care



School Angel


