

Free School Meal Children & Holidays

The issue of meals for those children who are eligible for benefits related free school meals dominated news bulletins at the start of half term. It had been hoped that the voucher

scheme that had been successfully run by the Government over Easter, Summer half term and the Summer holidays would continue. Just before the school broke up however the House of Commons voted not to continue with this action.

This left those most in need at this very difficult time with no support. It was felt by the Chair of Governors and leading school members that it was morally right to support those more in need in our school community. The decision was taken to issue £15 supermarket vouchers to all FSM children to support them.

The cost of this action has to be met from the school budget at a time when the budget was extremely tight at the start of the financial year prior to Covid now it is in dire straits following the increased staffing costs of the various staggers and lunchtimes, additional cleaning and a large of loss of income from having no care services for 6 months. The following text was put out on our Facebook page:

The school is supporting free school meal children over half term as it is felt it was morally

right to do so with £15 supermarket vouchers for food. The school budget is under immense pressure due to Covid costs and additional staff costs to cover the changes in the school day. As a consequence we would welcome any donation towards the cost of this support to some of our school community as this is an unforeseen expense. Any donation, small or large, would be very much appreciated if you could help. Donations can be made via ParentPay – Supporting Free School Meal Families or contacting admin@beckstone.cumbria.sch.uk for bank paying in details. Thank you so much in advance.

The response from our school community has been magnificent and over half the cost of providing the supermarket vouchers has been met with donations. It is really heart-warming to see how our community support each other. It is not too late to contribute to help the school by using the details above to make a contribution. Every donation is highly valued as the budget has been

decimated and is in a very perilous position and the school does not want to make stringent cutbacks at a time when all children need to be fully supported and given the opportunity to 'catch up' on their learning.



Thank you to all who have donated or are about to donate.

Finally the Town Council then supported our FSM families by providing them with a kid's meal from Superfish or Moorclose Fisheries from Tuesday to Friday.

Free School Meals & Christmas

It looks likely there may be a further vote and the national picture may change by the time the next holidays come along.

If there is no change then the school does not have the resources to continue with the supermarket voucher scheme every holiday. It is important in this position that we find a longer term sustainable support package. We will be in touch if that is what is needed, one suggestion is to prepare food hampers/boxes for all FSM families that can be filled with donations of non-perishable items

from the school community. We will keep you informed.

Foodbank Changes



Recent events have shown that the school can be a

focal point for supporting some of our more vulnerable school families. To this end we are now proposing that the donations to the foodbank collection point are distributed within our school community. If there are families struggling with food (whether FSM or not) then if you could make yourself known to Debbie via a phone call to school (totally confidential obviously) then the school will work with you to provide regular food donations.



Free School Meal Entitlement

With all that is happening it is perhaps more important than ever to claim free school meals If you are eligible. **PLEASE DO MAKE A CLAIM**. Even if your child is in Key Stage 1 or Reception and receives Universal Free School Meals making a claim will enable us to support you, help the school budget and provide other entitlements.



Details of how to claim free school meals can be found at the internet address at the top of the next column or speak to the School Office who will help you with your claim. Indeed eligibility for Free Meals brings other benefits such as a uniform grant, free milk, free instrumental hire and also provides the school with additional funding. We urge that ALL ELIGIBLE PARENTS OF PUPILS FROM RECEPTION UP TO YEAR 6 apply online through the Cumbria County Council 'Citizen Portal'. Packed Lunches



The school has sent a reminder to the families of packed lunch children as there are guidelines for the nutritional

content of packed lunches just as there are strict guidelines to follow for school meals. We have noted there are items in some bait boxes that do not comply with these guidelines. Please can you ensure this does not happen as your child will not be able to consume such food for their lunch.

Food and drink in packed lunches: what the policy states

- The school will provide appropriate and attractive facilities for pupils eating packed lunches
- The school will work with parents to encourage packed lunches to meet the standards listed below.
- As fridge space is not available, pupils are advised to bring packed lunches in insulated bags with freezer blocks where possible.

Packed lunches should include:

- at least one portion of fruit and one portion of vegetables every day.
- meat, fish, eggs, or a non-dairy protein (e.g. lentils, kidney beans, chickpeas, houmous, peanut butter, falafel) every day.
- oily fish, such as salmon, at least once every three weeks.
- a starchy food such as any type of bread (white or wholegrain rolls, pitta bread or wraps), pasta, rice, couscous, noodles, potatoes or another cereal every day.
- a dairy food such as milk, cheese, yoghurt, fromage frais or custard every day.
- a drink of water, fruit juice or smoothie (maximum portion 150 mls), semi-skimmed, 1% fat or skimmed milk, yoghurt or another milk drink.

Packed lunches should NOT include:

- salty snacks such as crisps instead include nuts, seeds, vegetables and fruit with no added salt, sugar or fat.
- confectionery such as chocolate bars, chocolatecoated biscuits, cereal bars, processed fruit bars and sweets.
- sugary soft drinks, such as squash and fizzy drinks (even if labelled as 'sugar-free', 'no-added sugar' or 'reduced sugar' as these drinks can contribute to tooth decay and provide little nutritional value).

There is a misconception that crisps or salty snacks are allowed in packed lunches (often quoted as a Friday treat). **This quite simply is not the case** as can be seen from the guidleines above. See the image below for the harm it can cause to young developing hearts.



Finally please can all note that the weakest point in all our Covid secure operations are packed lunches.


If the school is striving to minimise what comes backwards and forwards to prevent any Covid spread then the question has to be are lunch boxes essential? Indeed we also cannot store them at refrigerated temperatures so other health issues come into play. They are also a concern as some children cannot open the sachets, pots or packets which is placing a dilemma on lunchtime staff as they feel the need to help children whereas their guidance says touching articles in these boxes can lead to cross contamination and they shouldn't do it.

Please, please try to move your child to school meals to minimise risk and keep school pupils and staff safe – Thank You!



School meals only cost £2.20 a day or £11 for the week in Key Stage 2 and payment has

never been simpler using the Parent Pay facility. Your child will receive a nutritionally balanced meal with a wide range of choices and you can rest assured they are eating healthily and plentifully. Service speeds have now speeded up following the Covid changes and portion sizes are now plentiful. The menu is available on our web site.



Governors' Board



Summary of Governors' AGM – Tuesday 13th October 2020


- Mr Nick Whitehead elected Chair
- Mrs Vicki Martin elected Vice Chair
- Parental feedback on lockdown and re-opening was shared as was the detailed re-opening guidance. The board were happy with the way the school has managed the Covid issues to date.
- A detailed financial report showed that the increased staff costs for managing the Covid secure day plus the increased cleaning staff and consumable costs plus the loss of care service income was having a dramatic impact on the school budget. The net effect is that the agreed 2020/21 budget from March now has ~£80,000 less than was foreseen. The October budget submission to County was agreed but now shows a significant deficit in Year 3.
- The 'Pupil Premium Strategy Report' and the' Impact of the Sports Premium Report' were both noted and are now published on our web site.
- The average of 92%+ remote learning interaction during lockdown was discussed and the support to those not able to access.
- The Health and Safety Management Plan and the Covid Risk assessments and Governor H&S visit reports on these were shared.
- The current school roll of 372 was noted as was the average attendance rate of 96.49% and 0 exclusions. It was noted that the school's attendance on the first day of opening at 99.2% was one of the best in the country.
- The following updated policies were agreed: Safeguarding, Pupil Premium, Fundamental British Values, SMSC, Pay & Appraisal.
- The meeting dates for the year were agreed with the next meeting on the 1st December 2020

Governor Vacancies

As you will see from the 'Governor Gallery' above there are currently 3 vacancies on the Governing Body. The Governors are undergoing a re-structure and will be aiming to fill these vacancies once the structure has been agreed.



Outdoor recreation encouraged, you can meet one person outside your household School will therefore operate as normal. Please do try to maintain social distancing at all times and ensure you and your family follow all guidance so as not to put other pupils or staff at any risk.

- 3. Face Masks Thank you to all for now wearing face masks on the paths around school and also in the school grounds. We are aware there are a couple of our parents who cannot wear them for health reasons and they have made themselves known to school staff so please do not think they are not following the protocols.
- 4. Symptoms There is a simple video that explains what to look for with regard to Covid symptoms as compared to other illnesses. It can be seen by clicking on

5. Winter, Covid Guidance & Heating



The current Government guidance to schools is very clear that they should be well ventilated and have

windows open to ensure a free flow of air. There are of course some issues that arise from this guidance once the air temperature outside falls.

Firstly, the school will naturally be colder than normal so it is perhaps prudent for your child to wear a vest or T-shirt under their usual uniform. We are allowing children to wear navy fleeces on top of their uniform in class for added warmth if needed. Ones with a school logo on can be ordered here:

Emergency Planning Experience Please note that children may be sent home with no notice e.g. a child had a test and was notified it was positive during the school day. We have a



detailed action plan for every eventuality **but all parents need one too** as there is a possibility you will be contacted to come to school immediately to collect your child for an isolation period of 14 days. It is perhaps prudent to let employers know this may occur if you don't have other child care arrangements.

Children isolating due a confirmed case in the household or sent home from school will be set work online to be completed in an exercise book that will be sent home tomorrow – please keep this in a safe place in case of need. In addition Covid isolating free school meal children will receive a supermarket voucher for online shopping.

If your child is showing symptoms in school you will be asked to collect your child and their sibling(s) for selfisolation until there has been a negative test or they have isolated for 14 days. Classmates' families will get a text to inform them this has happened to keep an eye out for symptoms, **YOU DO NOT** have to keep them at home.

Dog owners at the very least should be bagging their dog's poop as this path to the rear is being increasingly used by children and families from the school and should quite rightly be free from dog mess.





The Rae Way – Back Path

Please be careful using the back path in frosty weather as it was an issue last year with frost making the tarmacked parts of the path slippy. We will try our best to grit it this year but this is not common practice

as it is not our land however as the paths are being used extensively for staggered school access we will do what we can. Again the grit for doing this will be an additional cost to the school budget which again wasn't budgeted for.





Milk is vital for growing children as it strengthens bones and teeth. Children in Reception and Nursery are entitled to free milk as are children who are eligible for free school meals and clothing vouchers (not the universal free meal for all FS & KS1 children). The cost of milk for this half term is **£9.00** and needs to be paid by **THIS Friday**, 6thNovember, **via ParentPay**

NOT cash or cheque. If you need help with this please see the School Office. Due to the administrative burden of checking attendance and the inability to change the order daily unfortunately milk money cannot be refunded for absence



Snack money for Nursery and Reception can now also be paid by ParentPay and is due by Friday (£7...£1 a week)

And

Fruit money from Year 1 up can also be paid this way $(\pounds 7, again \pounds 1 a week)$.

Parents' Evenings



We hope these worked well. Feedback to date has been very positive and the 'Calendly' system appears to have worked well. Those families who we were unable to contact will be contacted in the very near future. It is very important for home and school to work closely together so if you need to speak to your child's teacher please

book a call through the School Office.

The next parents' evenings will take place in the week beginning the 22nd February, the week after Spring half term. We are as yet unclear whether these will have to be completed by phone or can be in school as yet. The focus however will shift more to the academic progress your child is making and you will receive a data sheet in advance of the meeting/phone call.



We would also urge all nursery parents to ensure their child has a nasal vaccination. These are available through your GP surgery.

<u>Coats</u>



We are now asking all children to wear their coats at lunchtimes and playtimes over the winter months. Please ensure they come to school with a coat and one that has their name in – thanks! School coats which are fully waterproof and have a hood and reflective strips are

available from the School Office at a competitive price of just £22.40 (sizes 3-4 up to 11-12); extra small adult upward sizes are £28.15.

Nursery Intakes

Children born between **1 September 2017** and **31 December 2017** can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week Nursery education from January 2021.

If you know of any children with birth dates between these times and would like their child to come to this school, then please ask them to get in touch with the School Office <u>as soon as possible.</u>

Children born between 1 January 2018 and 31 March

2018 can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week from **April 2021.**



Children born between 1 April 2018 and 31 August 2018 can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week from September 2021.



If you ever have any concerns about the safety or well-being of a child, then you can ring your concerns through to the County's 24 hour 'Safeguarding Hub' number and you can remain anonymous if you wish. Callers can outline their concerns and the Safeguarding Hub will give advice (consultation) and if necessary undertake an assessment of need.
