#### New Public Health Guidance

Due to the increasing rates of Covid-19 in the locality new guidance was issued last week to all residents. The guidance states that the 'rule of six' should only now contain members from only 2 households.

It is perhaps timely to remind everyone that whilst the school is working so hard on keeping 'bubbles' separate such work is negated if pupils are mixing out of school in large cross age groups or having birthday parties, sleepovers etc. This is against guidance and should not be happening.



Covid Testing Update

We have been asked to share the following information with you from the Government:

It is important to share some information on how we can work together to make sure we can continue to give children and young people the best education in the safest way possible. One important part of ensuring the safety and wellbeing of pupils, parents and our communities is testing for coronavirus. We all have a duty to make sure that the right people have access to get tested at the right time. Every time a test is used inappropriately, a person with Covid-19 symptoms may miss out on getting tested. Therefore, we ask that you all follow these principles:

You should only book a test if your child has any of these three coronavirus symptoms:

a high temperature: any new high temperature where your child feels hot to touch on their chest or back (you do not need to measure the temperature but if you do guidance states temperatures over 37.8°C)

a new continuous cough: coughing a lot for more than an hour, or three or more coughing episodes in 24 hours

a loss of, or change in, sense of smell or taste: a noticeable loss of smell or taste or things smell and taste different to normal



Your child does not need a test if they have a runny nose, are sneezing or feeling unwell but do not have a temperature, cough or loss of, or change in, sense of smell or taste because these are not normally symptoms of coronavirus.

If you are unsure about whether to get a test, please check the official list of symptoms on the NHS website, which is reviewed regularly:

www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronaviruscovid19/symptoms/

Only the person with symptoms should get a test. You do not need to get a test for anyone else in the household unless they also have any of the three symptoms listed above. All members of the household need to self-isolate whilst waiting for the test result.

If the person with symptoms' test comes back positive, other members of their household should continue selfisolating for 14 days and only get a test if they develop coronavirus symptoms.

If a pupil in a class or bubble tests positive for coronavirus, anyone who is advised to self-isolate does not require a test unless they subsequently develop symptoms.

No one else in the same class or bubble as the symptomatic person needs to take any action unless advised by the school. Schools have detailed guidance and access to a Department for Education and Public Health England helpline for advice and support.

Contacts of a person who has tested positive must follow the guidance carefully and in full, which means they must stay at home for 14 days. This is because it can take several days following contact with an infected person before an individual develops symptoms or the virus can be detected. Students should only book a test if they get symptoms.



#### Emergency Planning

Experience from other schools is showing that children may be sent home with no notice e.g. a child had a test and was notified it was positive during the school day. We have a



detailed action plan for every eventuality but all parents need one too as there is a possibility you will be contacted to come to school immediately to collect your child for an isolation period of 14 days. It is perhaps prudent to let employers know this may occur if you don't have other child care arrangements.

If your child is showing symptoms in school you will be asked to collect your child and their sibling(s) for selfisolation until there has been a negative test or they have isolated for 14 days. Classmates' families will get a text to inform them this has happened to keep an eye out for symptoms, **YOU DO NOT** to keep them at home.

#### Parental Feedback

Thank you to all who have responded to the <u>feedback@beckstone.cumbria.sch.uk</u> Every single email is read thoroughly and feeds into our planning and procedures so we can try to make the best of a



challenging and difficult situation. We have had a number of good suggestions already that we have or are acting on. The positive and negative comments are also very useful so we can understand

the strengths and weaknesses from a parental point of

view. The email address will be open until the end of this week (Friday 9<sup>th</sup> October). If you haven't shared your views then please do.

#### 'Stage Bubbles'

In order for the school to function effectively the main protective unit is the class



bubble but that belongs within a wider 'Stage Bubble' i.e. Early Years, Key Stage 1, Lower Key Stage 2 or Upper Key Stage 2. The 'Stage Bubbles' share corridor areas, play spaces and toilet blocks. As a result the stages are self-contained and we have planned the school day so that there should be only very minimal contact with children from another stage or none at all.

Resources such as play equipment and sports equipment are shared in each separate bubble but there is a strict routine of hand washing after their use. The zoned areas of the school are shown below.



#### Health & Safety

The school is very fortunate to have a Parental Governor, Mr Nick Whitehead, who works in Health & Safety at Sellafield. He is a regular visitor to the school and checks that all our protocols and procedures are working in line with guidance which is re-assuring to us as well as to the parental community. He then issues a written report. This month he has contributed to the Governors' page which is overleaf.


#### Parents' Evenings

### Health & Safety Governor's Blog

Hi everyone,

Firstly, I would like to welcome everyone back to school for a new school year, particularly those who are attending our school for the first time this September!

Governors' Board

I don't think at the turn of the year anyone expected 2020 to turn out like this, I know I certainly didn't! Lockdown and the ongoing restrictions are taking its toll on our families in many different ways. In the height of the pandemic in spring, caring for our families whilst juggling commitments and home schooling was mentally and physically draining. On a positive note, the number of pupils in Beckstone who remained engaged in their education and completed home schooling activities was very high. On behalf of the governors, I would like to thank all of the pupils, parents and staff for all of their hard work. Having experienced it with my own 3, I understand how hard it was at times.

As you know the government announced a phased reopening of schools, starting with limited groups in the summer term and finally with all year groups returning in September. The guidance provided by the government prior to each phase was often late and confusing. It required the school to reconsider all aspects of the school day, this was to ensure pupils and staff were as safe as possible. The staff have worked tirelessly to ensure the school is Covid secure, whilst retaining the warm, safe, learning environment our children left in March. The school also considered the consequences of a second wave and new restrictions being imposed, be it locally or nationally. Pupils now have access to online learning apps, staff have been provided with tablets and action plans are sat on a shelf ready to go. Fingers crossed this isn't required!

I have visited the school to review the implementation of Covid controls on behalf of the governing body each time the number of pupils attending school has increased. During my visits I have been very impressed by the new arrangements and the way that both the staff and pupils have adjusted. I can confirm the school is meeting the requirements set out in the government guidance and the school has received positive feedback from Cumbria County Council. Although the way things are set up is different, the atmosphere and the feel in the school is like normal. I personally think this is really important.

I understand some of the new arrangements are challenging, especially for dropping off and collecting children, but they are vital for the school to remain compliant and open. While collecting my own children, I have witnessed parents being patient and complying with social distancing rules. I would just like to say thank you for this. It's a very stressful time for the staff while they ensure our loved ones arrive and leave school safely. If we all do our bit, it is one less thing for the staff to worry about.

*Finally, I would just like to say take care, stay safe and remember to follow the Covid rules in all walks of life!*



#### **Packed Lunches**

#### The weakest point in all our Covid secure operations are packed lunches.

This has now been picked up in a recent Health & Safety inspection.

There are schools in Workington that have banned them but we have not gone down that route as yet however they are a major concern. If the school is striving to minimise what comes backwards and forwards to prevent any Covid spread then the question has to be are lunch boxes essential? Indeed also cannot store them at refrigerated we temperatures so other health issues come into play.

They are also a concern as some children cannot open the sachets, pots or packets which is placing a dilemma on lunchtime staff as they feel the need to help children whereas their guidance says touching articles in these boxes can lead to cross contamination and they shouldn't do it.

Please, please try to move your child to school meals to minimise risk and keep school pupils and staff safe - Thank You!

#### Winter, Covid Guidance & Heating

The current Government guidance to schools is very clear that they should be well ventilated and have windows open to ensure a free flow of air. There are of course some issues that arise from this guidance once the air temperature outside falls.

Firstly, the school will naturally be colder than

normal so it is perhaps prudent for your child to wear a vest or Tshirt under their usual uniform. We are allowing children to wear navy fleeces on top of their uniform in class for added warmth if needed. Ones with a school logo on can be ordered here:



Secondly, the school is facing enormous added costs for additional cleaning, additional staff hours to cover the staggered lunchtimes, protective equipment and cleaning materials, oodles of paper towels etc etc. On



top of this once the heating goes on the rooms will never reach ambient temperature due to the open windows so the heating bills will be enormous. There is little that can be done about this however if schools do not receive additional funding then there will have to be major cutbacks over the coming years.

#### School Photographer

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We hope you liked the proofs you received of your child's photo. These have to be ordered online using the details on the order form.

We would like to apologise to all the families who had asked about sibling photos and were told these were going ahead. It was only as guidance

changed that this part of the photographer's usual visit had to be cancelled. We understand it is a shame and if conditions allow we will try to have another session for family photographs later in the school year.

#### Nursery Intakes

Children born between 1 September 2017 and 31

**December 2017** can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week Nursery education from **January 2021**.

If you know of any children with birth dates between these times and would like their child to come to this school, then please ask them to get in touch with the School Office <u>as soon as possible.</u>

Children born between **1 January 2018** and **31 March 2018** can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week from **April 2021**.

Children born between **1 April 2018** and **31 August 2018** can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week from **September 2021.**

Our extended services include the Breakfast Club (£4.00 from 7.30am, £3.50 from 8am) Last entry is at 8.30am; Educare (our popular

afternoon child care provision for morning Nursery children - see table) with pick up times at 2.15pm and 3.15pm. Please note that unfortunately we are unable to offer facilities for packed lunches for Nursery children.



Beckstone Xtra (again £3.50 an hour) runs from the end of the school day until 5.15pm with an earlier pick up time of 4.15pm if required.

The prices for our extended services are extremely competitive to support families in these difficult economic times. The price per hour is only £3.50. This is very good value and an extremely competitive rate for child care.



#### Sharing information is in the best interests of children and their safeguarding. The school reserves the right to share and receive information from other agencies that may have had dealings with your child.



If you ever have any concerns about the safety or well-being of a child, then you can ring your concerns through to the County's 24 hour 'Safeguarding Hub' number and you can remain anonymous if you wish. Callers can outline their concerns and the Safeguarding Hub will give advice

(consultation) and if necessary undertake an assessment of need.



There is now also an adult NSPCC helpline where any concerned adult can seek advice if they are concerned about a child and would like advice on whether to make a referral. The number to call is

Debbie Cook, our Educational Support Manager has trained to



#### <u>QR Codes</u>

QR stands for 'quick response'. QR Codes, if you don't know, are those funny black and white boxes you see in newspapers and magazines such as the image alongside. These are placed within this newsletter at relevant points to give you quick access to websites mentioned. All you have to do is install a free QR code reader to your phone/tablet, just search the App/Play store using 'QR', and simply scan the code or you can just use your
