Latest Covid Update

The country is moving into a 'Living with Covid' phase and for this has repercussions schools.



Current guidance is guite simple and straightforward. If you or your child have Covid symptoms then isolate and take an LF test. If positive then adults, must selfisolate but can return to work 5 days from the day after taking the test (no need to have a negative test to return) if well enough. For children the same applies but the time period is only 3 days. No-one needs to isolate due to other positive cases in the household.

Hopefully these changes will be less disruptive to school life. Please however continue to let school know if your child has Covid.



Our Cook, Susan Armstrong, recently was awarded 'Chef of the Month' by Caterlink.

School Meals

We continue to urge you to take the school meal option. The cook has worked out that the cost of a nutritional packed lunch is more

than the cost of a school dinner. So, without all the hassle for you as a parent to make up lunches every



night, you can opt for school dinners, still save money and be comforted in the knowledge that your child is having a hot meal that complies with nutritional guidelines for a healthy life in the future.

All children in Reception and Key Stage 1 have free lunches and the cost in KS2 is only £12.50 per week (£2.50 per day) and the Nursery meal for the 30 hour pupils is £1.80.



School Meal Menu

The menu for the Summer term is reproduced on the following page and is on our web site.. There is a huge range of choices across the 3 week cycle with 5

choices a day so there should be meals for all tastes. All meals adhere to nutritional guidance and are an investment in a healthy child into the future.

Herbs

There are herb pots again at the front of the school (thank you to Mrs Sue Murray for cultivating these for

everyone). Don't forget you are welcome to help yourself to a pinch of herbs to brighten up your home cooking (& drinking e.g.



Mojitas). The sign above the herbs (in front of Ms McGill's class) to the left of the front door as you leave the building, gives tips on which herbs to use for what meals. Please make good use of them.

Food & Drink

- School meals £2.50 a day or £12.50 a week
- Milk is vital for growing children as it strengthens bones and teeth. Children in Reception and Nursery are entitled to free milk as are children who

are eligible for free school meals and clothing vouchers (not the universal free meal for all FS & KS1 children). The cost of milk for the half term after the Easter holidays is £8.50 (the price has risen



since the last newsletter due to the rising cost from the supplier) and should have been paid by Friday, 22nd April £9 term payable by Friday 10th June via ParentPay NOT cash or cheque. If you need help with this please see the School Office. Due to the administrative burden of checking attendance and the inability to change the order daily unfortunately milk money cannot be refunded for absence.

Snack money for Nursery and Reception is also paid by ParentPay and £6 was also



due by 22nd April. The cost is £7 for next half term payable by Friday 10th June.

Fruit tuck shop money from Year 1 up was, £6 for this half term, again payable by 22nd April with next half term costing £7 term payable by Friday 10th June.




Be Sun Wise

As the days get hotter (hopefully!!) it is important that thoughts go to protecting children from the sun. The children at the school spend a lot of time outdoors durina the school day and lunch times in particular are times when the sun is at its hottest.

Please help your child by applying sun screen

before they get dressed in the morning (it should last for the school day so children don't need to apply it at school and given chemical content staff aren't allowed to). Also please ensure they have the minimum of skin showing and provide them with a hat to wear outside (we have legionnaire caps for sale at the School office - £4.50) to protect their heads...remember

Safeguarding/Child Protection

In addition to the above the school has a 'Safeguarding Zone' on its website which contains the above link as well as relevant school policies, further information and a diagram showing how we keep your child safe in school. It is well worth a look.

Sharing information is in the best interests of children and their safeguarding. The school reserves the right to share and receive



information from other agencies that may have had dealings with your child.

If you ever have any concerns about the safety or wellbeing of a child, then you can ring your concerns through to the County's 24 hour 'Safequarding Hub' number and you can remain anonymous if you wish. Callers can outline their

concerns and the Safeguarding Hub will give advice (consultation) and if necessary undertake an assessment of need.



There is now also an adult NSPCC helpline where any concerned adult can seek advice if they are concerned about a child and would like advice on whether to make a referral. The number to call is

Domestic Violence

Debbie Cook, our Educational Support Manager has trained to be a 'Domestic Violence

Champion' and is a resource available to any adult who would like to confidentially share incidents with her and is a very good source of advice. Just contact the School Office to get in touch with her.

Domestic violence is on the increase and causes terrible harm to victims and the associated children.

It is everyone's responsibility to ensure it is eradicated. We are working closely with the Police and the school will learn of any incidents to support any children whose lives are affected by such an occurrence.


Beckstone Xtra (again £3.50 an hour) runs from the end of the school da




