#### **Sporting Success**


The ongoing Sporting Success at school continues. We

#### Parental Courtesy

Please can all parents ensure that any concerns and issues they may have regarding



other children's behaviour in school are resolved through school, not by approaching parents directly in person or by phone/text.

Also please do note that the school will not tolerate any family member being disrespectful to any member of staff in person or by phone.

All school staff are committed to helping and supporting your child and put every effort into doing so. All members of the school community have a right to expect that their school is a safe place to work and learn. There is no place for threatening behaviour or abuse in schools. Failure to abide by this simple rule will lead to a ban from the School site.

If you have any concerns or worries please raise them politely and courteously and be a good role model for your child.

#### **Latest Covid Update**

The responsibility for following up positive Covid cases lies with NHS track and trace and not with schools. As a result, unless there is what is classed as an 'Outbreak' there will be no class sent home due to cases unless directed to the school under Public Health guidance if there is an 'Outbreak'.

In addition the local authority can advise closure if adult:pupil ratios become an issue due to staff absence.

Clearly we wish to avoid either scenario or our priority is to keep the school open. We need your help with this and your support in complying with the procedures and protocols as described in this newsletter.

Please can all parents note that Cumbria continues to have its own guidance for schools that differs from national and is classed as 'enhanced local guidance'

#### Please also note advice changes regularly.

The current courses of action are described below:


- If your child is PCR positive (following absence due to symptoms or a positive LF test) then they will need to isolate for 10 days (the national option of LF testing from day 6 and having 2 negative LFs in a 24 hour period does not apply).
- If there is a positive case in a household then all children need to isolate for 5 days and then have a PCR test and if negative the children can return to school. The original exception for children who have already had Covid has been withdrawn as the new Omicron variant can reinfect. The option for daily LF testing and attending school does not apply to a Primary pupil at this school.

The reasons for this approach are to help address the continuing high levels of Covid in the area as can be seen in the latest figures at the top of the next page, and to keep the school open.

If your child has to isolate due to Covid their attendance will be marked as Covid related and this will not count towards their attendance figures. In addition you will be asked whether you would like remote work set daily for your child. We are happy to provide this but there have been a number of cases recently where families have

found this unhelpful as they or their child are too ill to complete the work and it adds to stress levels.

Additionally if your child is eligible for free school meals and are missing out on their meal at school we will provide vouchers for the duration of their isolation.



The rates in the locality have fallen considerably however without confirmatory PCRs the rates will be below previous. The rates however are still high in comparison to recent months so we all need to still be vigilant.

Finally, please also have contingency child care plans at the ready as schools have been advised to send pupils home if they are displaying Covid symptoms (see next page). A Covid Summary is available in the 'News & Events' section of our web site.

#### Visits to the School

All visitors are no longer required to show proof of a negative LF test that day which will enable class assemblies, parents' evenings etc to take place much more easily.

#### What are the Symptoms of Covid?

There is a simple video that explains what to look for with regard to Covid symptoms as compared to other illnesses. It still applies to the Omicron variant. It can be seen by clicking on the link in the noticeboard on the

Lateral flow tests are available for asympotamitic testing for yourselves or other adult family members, these are not advised for Primary aged children. These are available by post from Gov.uk, some pharmacies or from Allerdale house.

If you suspect you or any member of your family including children have Covid then you should go for a PCR test.

#### **School Matters!**

Please think of the importance of your child's education before booking holidays. When on holiday during term time they miss vital work and lose touch with their circle of friends.

#### **Safeguarding/Child Protection**

Full details on the county's policies, procedures and processes with regard to safeguarding plus analysis of outcomes of serious case reviews can be accessed through the Cumbria LSCB website at

www.cumbrialscb.com the site also has a parental information zone.

In addition to the above the school has a 'Safeguarding Zone' on its website which contains the above link as well as relevant school policies, further information and

a diagram showing how we keep your child safe in school. It is well worth a look.

Sharing information is in the best interests of children and their safeguarding. The school reserves the right to share and receive information from other agencies that may have had dealings with your child.



If you ever have any concerns about the safety or wellbeing of a child, then you can ring your concerns through to the County's 24 hour 'Safeguarding Hub' number and you can remain anonymous if you wish. Callers can outline their concerns and the Safeguarding Hub will give advice (consultation) and if necessary undertake an assessment of need.



There is now also an adult NSPCC helpline where any concerned adult can seek advice if they are concerned about a child and would like advice on whether to make a referral. The number to call is



#### **Domestic Violence**

Debbie Cook, our Educational Support Manager has trained



to be a 'Domestic Violence Champion' and is a resource available to any adult who would like to confidentially share incidents with her and is a very good source of advice. Just contact the School Office to get in touch with her.

Domestic violence is on the increase and causes terrible harm to victims and the associated children.

It is everyone's responsibility to ensure it is eradicated. We are working closely with the Police and the school will learn of any incidents to support any children whose lives are affected by such an occurrence.

#### **Online Safety**

February is the month for national initiatives regarding online safety. We spend a lot of time at school on this subject all the year round and sadly there are times when our work is undone by lack of supervision at home.


As a school we find we are increasingly dealing with issues that have arisen from previous evenings by misuse of social media or online gaming. For example in the last week there have been issues of nasty comments being shared by some Y4 girls on Snapchat and a threat of violence from a Y5 boy towards a Y3 boy during an online game of 'Rocket League'. These incidents have been dealt with but are becoming ever more commonplace.



There are minimum ages for social media sites such as Snapchat, Facebook, Instagram, Tik Tok etc. for a good reason. The minimum age is 13 for most of these and sometimes it is 14. As such **NO CHILD AT A** 

#### PRIMARY SCHOOL SHOULD BE USING THEM!!

Young children have not developed the mental capacity for sensible use of these sites and are not able to interpret the context in which some comments are written or realise that what they say is there for ever and could be used in a prosecution by the Police. We urge all families to take control of access to such sites and games and be really clear on what their children are doing.



There is great concern nationally that we are developing children dependent on the internet and unable to socially engage effectively as well as damaging their emotional health and wellbeing through being exposed to comments or images that are not appropriate.

As a parent please do not think you are depriving your child, you are in fact helping them with their childhood by ensuring they are not exposed to age inappropriate media. Children often respond by saying 'everyone else is allowed to use it', this is not the case and please just blame Mr Warbrick. We need the children to come to school in the right frame of mind to concentrate on their school work, not tired through late night gaming or worried about comments made about them on social media.

Keeping your children safe from online bullying or exposure to unsuitable material is a major parental responsibility. There is a zone on our web site called 'Social Media and Your Child' which contains extremely



valuable advice, and information detailing how to ensure your child is safe.









#### Advice for children

The following are some things that parents may wish to consider teaching their children about using the internet safely:

- Make sure you use the privacy settings.
- Always respect others be careful what you say online.
- Be careful what pictures or videos you upload. Once a picture is shared online it cannot be taken back.
- Only add people you know and trust to friends/followers lists online. When talking to strangers, keep your personal information safe and location hidden.
- Treat your password like your toothbrush keep it to yourself and change it regularly.
- Block the bully learn how to block or report someone who is behaving badly.
- Do not retaliate or reply to offending e-mails, text messages or online conversations.
- Save the evidence. Always keep a copy of offending e-mails, text messages or a screen grab of online conversations and pass to a parent, a carer or a teacher.

- Make sure you tell an adult you trust, for example, a parent, a carer, a teacher, or the anti-bullying co-ordinator or call a helpline like Childline on 08001111 in confidence.
- Most social media services and other sites have a button you can click on to report bullying. Doing this can prevent a bully from targeting you and others in the future. Many services take bullying seriously and will either warn the individual or eliminate his or her account.
- While you are on your mobile phone make sure you also pay attention to your surroundings.

#### Possible signs of cyber bullying

It is not always easy to spot the signs of cyber bullying as it can happen all the time, which is a feature that makes it different from other forms of bullying. Be alert to a change in your child's behaviour, for example:

- Being upset after using the internet or their mobile phone;
- Unwilling to talk or secretive about their online activities and mobile phone use.
- Spending much more or much less time texting, gaming or using social media.
- Many new phone numbers, texts or e-mail addresses show up on their mobile phone, laptop or tablet.
- After texting or being online they may seem withdrawn, upset or outraged.
- Not wanting to go to school and/or avoiding meeting friends and school mates.
- Avoiding formerly enjoyable social situations.
- · Difficulty sleeping.
- Low self-esteem.

#### What to do if you suspect a child is being cyber bullied

If you suspect a child or young person is being harassed or bullied either over the internet or via mobile phone, ask them to give you details. If your child tells you that someone is bothering them online, take it seriously. Offer practical as well as emotional support. Print out the evidence for future reference. Talk to a teacher at your

child's school if other pupils at the schools

are involved.

There are many resources to help e.g. 'Block 'Em' is an easy to use app that can be installed on phones that quickly

and easily block any unwanted calls or messages.

#### **Nursery Intakes**

Children born between January 2019 and 31 March 2019 can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week Nursery education from April 2022.



Children born between 1 April 2019 and 31 August 2019 can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week from September 2022.

Children born between 1 September 2019 and 31 December 2019 can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week from January 2023.

#### Revisewise



#### **Cyclewise**

#### Food & Drink

- School meals £2.50 a day or £12.50 a week
- Milk is vital for growing children as it strengthens bones and teeth. Children in Reception and Nursery are entitled to free milk as are children who are eligible for free school meals and clothing vouchers (not

the universal free meal for all FS & KS1



children). The cost of milk for the next half term is £7.50 and needs to be paid by Friday, 25th February via ParentPay NOT cash or cheque. If you need help with this please see the School Office. Due to the administrative burden of checking attendance and the inability to change the order daily unfortunately milk money cannot be refunded for absence.



- Snack money for Nursery and Reception is also paid by ParentPay and is also due by Friday, 25th February the cost is £6 for next half term
- Fruit tuck shop money from Year 1 up is again also paid this way, £6 for this half term, again payable by Friday, 25<sup>th</sup> February



#### **School Meals**

We continue to urge you to take the school meal option. The cook has worked out that the cost of a nutritional packed lunch is more than the cost of a school dinner. So, without all the hassle



for you as a parent to make up lunches every night, you can opt for school dinners, still save money and be comforted in the knowledge that your child is having a hot meal that complies with nutritional guidelines for a healthy life in the future.

All children in Reception and Key Stage 1 have free lunches and the cost in KS2 is only £12 per week (£2.50 per day) and the Nursery meal for the 30 hour pupils is £1.80.



There will be a new menu after half term to reflect the favourites the children have. The menu is balanced nutritionally over the week to ensure your child has quality food that will also support their health and growth. The new menu is on the next page and is also on our web site.

You will however note that all doors are locked and all blinds closed and the Office is empty. If you come across this situation we ask you kindly to leave the site promptly and return after 15 minutes.



trainers. Ideally apparatus work will be in bare feet, floor work may be in plimsolls as it needs the flexibility. Plimsolls are also very easy to get on and off as was witnessed in a fire drill last week when the class doing gymnastics had bare feet, those with

plimsolls could easily slip them on before going out into the cold.



Please be careful using the back path in frosty weather as it was an issue last year with frost making the tarmacked parts

of the path slippy. Unfortunately, the school is unable to grit this access path as H&S regulations only allow the school to grit pathways into the building within its grounds. The local Council sadly do not have the resources to employ gritters. In cases of bad frost, it is therefore advisable to access the school from the front entrance if you feel the Rae Way is too dangerous.

and start promptly at 9.05am. Parents are welcome to attend. We film the assemblies and DVDs or password protected downloads can be ordered for £3 after the event.






