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Omicron Restrictions/Guidance Changes

There has been much updated guidance both locally and nationally in the last couple of days. All will be reviewed again at the end of the month. The points we would like you all to note are:

- Masks are to be worn by all adults in the environs of the school. If medically exempt please let the Office know.
- If your child has symptoms or a positive LF test please keep them off school until they get a PCR result. If they are negative they can return to school, if positive they need to isolate for 10 days (the national option for individuals to test on day 6 & then day 7 or 2 negative LFTs in 24 hours does not apply to our pupils as we cannot limit close contacts in days 8 to 10 and PH Cumbria have agreed this).
- If your child lives in the same household as a positive PCR Covid individual they have to selfisolate for 5 days then take a PCR test.

Further information on Covid can be found later in the newsletter plus a letter from the Director of Public Health.

Outdoor Development

Further to the upgrade to the adventure playground we are now well on the way to completing an upgrade to the outdoor classroom. Fund raising over the years has enabled us to enhance the outdoor environment and hopefully add to the children's fun, enjoyment and excitement at school.

The paths around the school continue to be

hazardous due to the unthinking and inappropriate use of it by dog owners who are not picking up their poop. There is now a lot of dog dirt and it has already been brought into school on the

shoes of some of the users of the path. Dog owners at the very least should be bagging their dog's poop as the paths are used by children and families from the school and should quite rightly be **free from dog mess.**

Please report dog mess to Allerdale. This can be done by phone or through the 'Allerdale App' on an iPhone or Android phone. The more reports they receive the more likely it is that action will be taken.

Recently, hot on the heels of complaints from pupils,



the Allerdale enforcement officers visited the school. They demonstrated how easy it is to report dog fouling (we would urge all parents to do it) and they promised to clean it and then enforce. They also delivered a poster to remind dog owners of their responsibilities.

School Meals

Despite the price increase this term (£2.50 for a KS2 meal and £1.80 for a Nursery one) we understand our meal prices are still amongst the lowest in the area and are in line the national average cost.



We continue to urge you to take the school meal option. The cook has worked out that the cost of a nutritional packed lunch is more than the cost of a school dinner even with the 10p a day increase. So, without all the hassle for you as a parent to make up lunches every

night, you can opt for school dinners, still save money and be comforted in the knowledge that your child is having a hot meal that complies with nutritional guidelines for a healthy life in the future.




Circuits

Safeguarding Children - A Place of Safety

Running after school clubs and after school care requires robust systems to ensure safety at all times. Any system however is subject to human error either by an adult who in the highly busy end of the day time forgets to give out a lanyard or a child forgetting a club or a number of other

factors. We do try and have fail safes in place but we recently had 2 children who for different reasons set off to walk home when they should have been in school. We have tried to impress on all the children in assemblies that if they then realise something is amiss e.g. a parent is not in the place they said they would be then they MUST come back to school and we will help them from there. The front of the school is ALWAYS open even if the back gates get locked. Please stress this to them if they use clubs/care after school.

Safeguarding/Child Protection

Full details on the county's policies, procedures and processes with regard to safeguarding plus analysis of outcomes of serious case reviews can be accessed through the Cumbria LSCB website at

In addition to the above the school has a 'Safeguarding Zone' on its website which contains the above link as well as relevant school policies, further information and



a diagram showing how we keep your child safe in school. It is well worth a look.



Sharing information is in the best interests of children and their safeguarding. The school reserves the right to share and receive information from other agencies that may have had dealings with your child.

If you ever have any concerns about the safety or wellbeing of a child, then you can ring your concerns through to the County's 24 hour 'Safeguarding Hub' number and you can remain anonymous if you wish. Callers can outline their concerns and the Safeguarding Hub will give advice (consultation) and if necessary undertake an assessment of need.





There is now also an adult NSPCC helpline where any concerned adult can seek advice if they are concerned about a child and would like advice on whether to make a referral. The number to call is

Domestic Violence



Debbie Cook, our Educational Support Manager has trained

to be a 'Domestic Violence Champion' and is a resource available to any adult who would like to confidentially share incidents with her and is a very good source of advice. Just contact the School Office to get in touch with her.

Domestic violence is on the increase and causes terrible harm to victims and the associated children.

It is everyone's responsibility to ensure it is eradicated. We are working closely with the Police and the school will learn of any incidents to support any children whose lives are affected by such an occurrence.

Security Thank You

A neighbour of the school reported suspicious activity at the school on New Year's Day. It turned out to be a false alarm but we are very grateful to that person for letting the Police know...better safe than sorry!

Christmas Technology

We understand some children, as a result of Christmas, now have access to phones/tablets. We strongly urge you to please keep your child away from social media apps. They have a minimum legal age for a reason. These apps can cause upset when being used at such a young age and children can type things out of context and without thinking that can cause upset and also could haunt them in later life as once posted the messages are always there.

Please note: Social media sites have a legal MINIMUM age for a reason, children's brains are not mature enough to understand texts out of context or share things that are inappropriate.

The minimum ages are shown below:



We strongly urge you not to let your children use these sites.


Police Advice for parents and carers on the use of technology.

Latest Covid Update

The responsibility for following up positive Covid cases lies with NHS track and trace and not with schools. As a result, unless there is what is classed as an 'Outbreak' there will be no class sent home due to cases unless directed to the school under Public Health guidance if there is an 'Outbreak'.

In addition the local authority can advise closure if adult:pupil ratios become an issue due to staff absence.

Clearly we wish to avoid either scenario or our priority is to keep the school open. We need your help with this and your support in complying with the procedures and protocols as described in this newsletter.

Please can all parents note that Cumbria continues to have its own guidance for schools that differs from national and is classed as 'enhanced local guidance'

Please also note advice changes regularly. All school procedures will undergo a full review at the end of this month.

The current courses of action are described below:

- If your child is PCR positive (following absence due to symptoms or a positive LF test) then they will need to isolate for 10 days (the national option of LF testing from day 6 and having 2 negative LFs in a 24 hour period does not apply).
- If there is a positive case in a household then all children need to isolate for 5 days and then have a PCR test and if negative the children can return to school. The original exception for children who have already had Covid has been withdrawn as the new Omicron variant can reinfect. The option for daily LF testing and attending school does not apply to a Primary pupil at this school.

The reasons for this approach are to help address the continuing high levels of Covid in the area as can be seen in the latest figures at the top of the next page, and to keep the school open.

If your child has to isolate due to Covid their attendance will be marked as Covid related and this will not count towards their attendance figures. In addition you will be asked whether you would like remote work set daily for your child. We are happy to provide this but there have been a number of cases recently where families have found this unhelpful as they or their child are too ill to complete the work and it adds to stress levels.

Additionally if your child is eligible for free school meals and are missing out on their meal at school we will provide vouchers for the duration of their isolation.



Face Masks

Thank you to all for now wearing face masks on the paths around school and also in the school grounds again. It is to minimise the risk of Omicron spread to each other and to staff. We are aware there are some parents who cannot wear them for health reasons, please ensure you make yourselves known to the School Office.

Visits to the School

All visitors will be required to show proof of a negative LF test that day or will need to do one before entering the building.

What are the Symptoms of Covid?

Lateral flow tests are available for asympotamitic testing for yourselves or other adult family members, these are not advised for Primary aged children. These are available by post from Gov.uk, some pharmacies or from Allerdale house.

If you suspect you or any member of your family including children have Covid then you should go for a PCR test.

Preventing the spread of COVID-19: Guidance for parents and carers

Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you for supporting our local COVID-19 control measures and for helping to keep staff, children, and young people safe.

Cases of the Omicron variant of COVID-19 are rapidly increasing in Cumbria. We want to limit the spread of COVID-19 to reduce the risk of outbreaks and staff absences, this will help maintain face-to-face learning where possible.

The updated national and local guidance for people who are contacts of someone with COVID-19 are outlined below. This letter is long, but please take time to read it carefully (depending on the ages of your children, some sections may not be relevant).

National guidance

From Tuesday 14 December, the national guidance for contacts of people with COVID-19 infection changed. Further details of this guidance can be found in the national <u>stay at home guidance</u> and guidance for contacts of people with confirmed COVID-19 infection who do not live with the person.

This guidance says:

- Children aged 5 years and over who are a close contact of someone with COVID-19 should conduct daily lateral flow (LFD) tests.
- For children who live with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 (household contacts), the LFD tests should be taken every day for 7 days, or until the household member who has COVID-19 reaches the end of their self-isolation period if this is earlier.
- For children who are a contact of someone with COVID-19 who they DO NOT live with, the LFD tests should be taken every day for 7 days, or until 10 days after their last contact with the person who tested positive if this is earlier.
- Each LFD test should be taken before the child leaves the household for the first time that day. If
 they test negative on their LFD tests, they can continue to attend their education setting, and do not
 need to self-isolate.
- Anyone who receives a positive LFD test result, or who develops COVID-19 symptoms, should
 immediately self-isolate and take a PCR test. If the PCR result comes back positive, contacts must
 continue to self-isolate and follow the <u>stay at home guidance</u>. If the PCR result comes back
 negative, contacts can leave self-isolation but should continue to take daily LFD tests for the
 remainder of their daily testing period.
- Children under the age of 5 who are contacts of a positive case do not need to self-isolate or take
 part in daily LFD testing. However, children under 5 who are household contacts of a positive case
 will still be advised to get a PCR test. They do not need to isolate while waiting for the results.

Additional local guidance for Cumbria

The guidance for children attending educational settings in Cumbria is now largely the same as the national guidance. However, there are a couple of important exceptions, which are outlined below.

This is because case rates remain high in school age children, and we have continued to see a significant number of outbreaks in education settings. These have a significant impact on children and their families, affect staffing levels, and risk causing additional outbreaks in the local community.

1. Children in early years settings (aged under 5 years)

Children who are close contacts of a positive case in their household.

- Our local guidance remains that children under the age of five who live in the same household as someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 are advised to stay at home for 5 days, starting from the onset of symptoms in the household contact who has tested positive (or test date if the positive case had no symptoms).
- Children are exempt from this local guidance (and can attend the setting as normal) if there
 are significant concerns about the impact of exclusion on the child. Children may also be
 contacted by NHS Test and Trace and advised to get a PCR test.

Children who are close contacts of a positive case that they do not live with

- Children under the age of 5 who are close contacts of a positive case that they do not live with should follow the national guidance. They are not required to isolate or take part in daily LFD testing.
- If the child develops symptoms of COVID-19, they should immediately isolate and get a PCR test

2. Children in primary, infant, and junior schools (aged 5 years and above)

Children who are close contacts of a positive case in their household

- Children in primary, infant, and junior schools (aged 5 years and above), who live with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 can choose to follow the national guidance on daily LFD testing outlined above.
- If they test negative on their LFD tests, they can continue to attend their education setting, and do not need to self-isolate. Anyone who receives a positive LFD test result, or who develops COVID-19 symptoms, should immediately self-isolate and take a PCR test.
- As a local alternative to daily LFD testing, children who live in the same household as someone who has COVID-19 still have the option to stay at home. Five days after the symptoms began in the household contact who tested positive (or test date if the positive case had no symptoms), the child should get a PCR test. If the PCR is negative, they can return to school, but should isolate again immediately and get another test if they develop symptoms of COVID-19 later.
- Children are exempt from this local guidance if there are significant concerns about the impact of exclusion on the child.

Children who are close contacts of a positive case that they do not live with

 Children aged 5 years and over who are close contacts of a positive case that they do not live with should follow the national guidance on daily LFD testing.

 If they test negative on their LFD tests, they can continue to attend their education setting, and do not need to self-isolate. Anyone who receives a positive LFD test result, or who develops COVID-19 symptoms, should immediately self-isolate and take a PCR test.

3. Pupils in secondary schools (aged up to 18+6 months)

- Pupils attending secondary schools who are either a close contact of a positive case in their household or who are a close contact of someone they do not live with should conduct daily LFD testing as outlined in the national guidance.
- If they test negative on their LFD tests, they can continue to attend their education setting, and do not need to self-isolate. Anyone who receives a positive LFD test result, or who develops COVID-19 symptoms, should immediately self-isolate and take a PCR test.

Additional advice

- Anyone who develops symptoms of COVID-19 should get a PCR test and stay at home until the
 result is known. Individuals informed by Test & Trace to isolate should stay at home for the time
 advised
- Outside of daily testing periods, we encourage all secondary school aged children to self-test twice weekly with lateral flow devices.
- Until further notice, secondary school aged children are encouraged to wear face coverings in classrooms, indoor communal areas and on dedicated school transport unless they are exempt.
- We also recommend anyone eligible in your household gets any recommended doses of the <u>COVID-19 vaccine</u> if they have not done so already.

Supply of LFD tests has been a national problem recently, although the government are confident that there should be adequate supply to provide for the testing mentioned above. If you have tested positive and are not able to 'test-to-release' because you do not have a test kit. please continue to isolate until the end of the period, or until you are able to LFD test negative for 2 days in a row if earlier.

The additional local measures outlined in this letter are guidance from Cumbria Public Health, they are not law. However, we strongly advise parents and carers to follow them, or at the very least, follow national guidance.

The additional local control measures will continue to be reviewed every 2 weeks and I will write to parents and carers again when they are revised or removed.

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

Nursery Intakes

Children born between 1 January 2019 and 31 March 2019 can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week Nursery education from April 2022.



Children born between 1 April 2019 and 31 August 2019 can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week from September 2022.

Children born between 1 September 2019 and 31 December 2019 can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week from January 2023.

If you know of any children with birth dates between these times and would like their child to come to this school, then please ask them to get in touch with the School Office <u>as soon as possible.</u>

At the Governor's meeting in December we discussed Governor visibility and we were all in agreement that we don't really share what the Governing Body is doing to support the school, the pupils and their education. So, we decided that each newsletter would contain a short blog from one of the Governors as a way of sharing ideas and information from our meetings. We hope you find this useful.

The Governing body currently has two main areas of focus:

- School continuity Since the beginning of the global Covid pandemic, the majority of our meetings have focused on pupil and staff wellbeing and the school's resources to cover the impact created by Covid. We have also looked at the impact on pupil outcomes after the disruption they have experienced due to the virus.
 - On the whole the school is in a good place given the circumstances. Pupil and staff morale are high, attendance percentages are good and although slightly awry, pupil outcomes are good when compared with other primary schools. The pupils of Beckstone are certainly not the 'lost generation' the press talk of. Covid costs and the budget are concerning but the school and Governors are closely monitoring this.
- The future of the school Even with the all of the obstacles Covid continues to put in the school's way, the staff and Governors still have an eye on the future of the school.

Over the past 12 months the school and the Governing body have been working to develop "Beckstone 2025". This is an improvement programme with the simple question 'What do we want Beckstone Primary to look like in 2025?' All improvement actions are being developed, recorded and tracked to ensure Beckstone is able to adapt to the changes and challenges the future will hold.

This brings me nicely to my next item. Mr Warbrick has stated in the newsletter that the Governing Body has a parent vacancy. If you would like to support the school by helping to shape school polices and the development of Beckstone 2025 please apply. As stated in the newsletter our skills review indicates someone with accountancy experience would be advantageous but it's certainly not essential for joining the team. If you would like any more information please contact the school, a Governor you know or myself and we will be happy to answer any questions that you may have.

Finally, the Governors want to pass on a massive thank you to the staff, pupils and parents of Beckstone. Without the continued support, adaptation and hard work shown during this pandemic the school would not be in its current position.

As we move through 2022 with all the unknowns this virus could continue to bring, please stay safe and ask if you require any support.



Learning Times Tables



It is essential that children know their times tables off by heart. It is a life skill and is something that is needed throughout life.

The National Curriculum states that children should know the 2 X, 5X and 10 X tables by the end of Year 2. The term 'knows' includes being able to manipulate and also know the inverse e.g. what is 65 divided by 5. By Year 4 all children should know every table up to the 12 X table. Indeed at the end of the school year they will face a national tables check.

Following recent pupil progress meetings internally within school our tracking data is showing that times tables are not known as they should be by a great many children.

We are now asking for your help. Your child(ren) need to know their times tables and we are asking you to help your child learn their times

Information on how to support learning of times tables and strategies to use can be found in the KS1 & KS2 Curriculum Zone of our web site or follow the QR code. It also contains information on 'Times Table

tables.




