A lot of thought has gone into classes for next year and friendship groups as well as grouping children

who work well together

have been the main focus of the groupings. It is important you support your child in their transition to their new class and be positive about their placement. Classes are full so there is no 'wriggle room' and no movement across classes. Do let your child settle into their new class and please be assured that we always strive to make sure your child is happy in school and in their class.

Please do not appeal against their placement.

A lot of thought has also gone into how the school is organised as the intake of a class and a half (45 pupils in general does not make for easy class groupings or straight year groups across the school). The school will be organised as follows:

Nursery – offering 30 hours for those eligible or a free 15 hours with an optional purchase of additional care of up to a further 15 hours

- 1 X Year 1 Class
- 1 X Year 1/2 Class
- 1 X Year2 Class
- 2 X Year 3 Classes
- 2 X Year 4 Classes



- 1 X Year 5 Class
- 1 X **Year 5/6** Class
- 1 X Year 6 Class.

Where there are mixed age classes these are being set up as mixed ability classes and not based on academic ability so are certainly not 'sets'.

Your child's class will have already been shared with them if they are in Years N to 1 to fully comply with the new Early Years Framework transition arrangements. All other children will visit their new classes on Thursday 14th July and again on Friday 15th July. Again, please do not appeal against their placement. Please rest assured that children's friendships have been closely considered and that school staff will have placed children well to ensure they can make maximum progress.

Curriculum Evening & Reports

There are 'Curriculum Meetings' on the last Monday of this term (Monday 18th July). Please make a note in your diary. We expect an adult from every family to attend so that you can meet your child's new teacher, learn about their areas of study in 2022/23 and what is expected from them and from yourselves. Your child's end of year report will be issued at these meetings (apart from Year 6 where they will be sent home with your child in a sealed envelope).

It is important that you attend and collect your child's report.

Phonics

A big congratulations needs to go to the Key Stage 1 children who had a phonics screening check recently. We are very proud of the progress they have made and the school achieved a pass rate of 80%, just above last year's national average and an improvement from last year's school outcome.



Key Stage Outcomes

until the issuing of reports on Monday 18th July. These will be given out at the Curriculum Evenings (see above and there will be a comparative data sheet with the Y2 and Y6 reports).

Bingo Night

from 5.30pm with the Bingo games starting at 6pm. The entry tickets allow for a Bingo book, a drink and a hot dog. Additional books can be bought for £1. On the night there will be ice creams/lollies on sale for £1, a Stand Up Bingo game with prizes costing £1 and a raffle.

Sports Day



This takes place **tomorrow**, weather permitting. If there is inclement weather we will then try to stage it on Thursday this week (7th). If possible please send your child in the colour of their house.

For the first time since 2019 we will be able to have spectators at this event. If you want to watch it then you can take a seat on the field after you have dropped your child off.

The fun starts at 9.20am and Nursery will leave after half an hour to an hour once their races are complete and the rest of the school should complete their events by around 11am. Towards the end there will be a women's race and a men's race — a short sprint so if you would like to take part do come out on the day.

In addition to the races there will also be a raffle on the day.

Sport Questionnaire

Thank you to everyone who recently completed the Sports Questionnaires. We had 59 responses. The outcomes and



comments are being analysed and will be incorporated into PE improvements at the school. What was very reassuring were the following responses: 'Beckstone promotes my child to be healthy?' – over 98% strongly agreed or agreed. In addition to the question – 'Does my child enjoy PE?' the response was 95% strongly agree or agree.

Finally of note was that 93% of respondents had never looked at the Sports Zone of our web site...it can be accessed via the Curriculum link, PE and then the 'View our Sports Page' button or from the Statutory Info drop down on the




Beckstone's Got Talent

School Meals

We continue to urge you to take the school meal option. The cook has worked out that the cost of a nutritional packed lunch is more than the cost of a school dinner. So, without all the hassle



for you as a parent to make up lunches every night, you can opt for school dinners, still save money and be comforted in the knowledge that your child is having a hot meal that complies with nutritional guidelines for a healthy life in the future.

All children in Reception and Key Stage 1 have free lunches and the cost in KS2 is currently only £12.50 per week (£2.50 per day) and the Nursery meal for the 30 hour pupils is £1.80.

Prices may be subject to change by September as the school meal provider is facing rising food and delivery costs given the rate of inflation. Equally the price of packed lunch items are also rising. It is a very difficult situation and everyone is under financial pressure. Please be assured the school will do its utmost in negotiations to get the cheapest deal that gives quality meals for our pupils and best value for our families.

Attendance Issues

- 1. Please can all families ensure they put their child's education first above holidays and other events.
- 2. If your child has Covid they can now return to school 3 days after the onset of symptoms. A negative test is not required for a return to school.
- 3. There is active discouragement of taking holidays in term time as it disrupts a child's learning.
- 4. Taking time off at the statutory testing time needs to be avoided completely.

Ivy from Nursery was awarded the Creativity Cup.







Calculation Policy

Perhaps use it to dip into and help your child with Maths over the summer to prepare them for their next class.

Holiday Homework

Your child will receive some basic skills tasks to learn in readiness for their new curriculum year before the end of term.



Please help them ensure they have the necessary skills to make a success of their next school year.

The most important homework of all is to ensure you read with your child for at least 20 minutes daily or ensure their day is structured to allow them to, read on their own, when they are able for sustained periods. Indeed reading to your child at bed time for example is



also extremely valuable. The world of books will develop your child's imagination, vocabulary and knowledge of the world around them. It is quite simply the

key to learning!

Taking part in the Library Summer Reading Challenge would go a long way to supporting your child with their holiday reading and it is FREE – see earlier article.

The following sites which can be used on a phone/tablet or PC are also extremely useful. Please check your child can access them, if there are issues then please get in touch with school.



Mathletics & Education City – Home Access



All children from Year 1 upwards have access to Mathletics at home (as well as Education City). They should all know their passwords; they are the same for both.

Times Tables Rock Stars

Your child should also have access to 'Times Table Rock Stars' and should know their log in details. They are able to make their own 'Rock Star Avatar' and every time they get a times table answer right (appropriate to their age) they will make money to buy things for their Rock Star. This is also available as an app from the Play Store of the App store, the children



then just need to log in with their normal school user name and password. We hope good use is made of it. Times Table testing is going to become a national statutory test for Year 4 children

from next year so this could prove to be a very worthwhile summer a



Software to help and encourage all children to learn their times tables is 'Times Table Rockstars'. Children from Year 1 upwards have their own 'Rock Avatar' and can earn points for their avatar and to work towards a series of certificates and badges that are awarded in assembly.

Teach Your Monster to Read

Teach your Monster to Read is a series of free games to practise the first stages of reading. Combining top quality games design with essential learning, the game is built on the principles of synthetic phonics and follows the teaching sequence of the Letters and Sounds programme. 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




Nursery Intakes





Children born between 1 September 2019 and 31 December 2019 can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week from January 2023.

Children born between 1 January 2020 and 31 March 2020 can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week Nursery education from April 2023.

If you know of any children with birth dates between these times and would like their child to come to this school, then please ask them to get in touch with the School Office as soon as possible.

Forms for applying for any of these intakes can be downloaded from the Cumbria County Council website https://www.cumbria.gov.uk/childrensservices/schoolsandlearning/lss/schooladmissions.asp (or use the QR code) ring the School Office and we can post them out. When returning the form we need to see the Birth Certificate and a proof of address.

Beckstone's Extended Services

Our extended services include the Breakfast Club (£4.00 from 7.30am, £3.50 from 8am) Last entry is at



8.30am; Educare (our popular afternoon child care provision for morning Nursery children – see table at the top of the next page – please note these places **MUST BE BOOKED IN ADVANCE**) with pick up times at 2.15pm and 3.15pm Please note that unfortunately we are unable to offer facilities for packed lunches for Nursery children.



Beckstone Xtra (again £3.50 an hour) runs from the



end of the school day until 5.15pm with an earlier pick up time of 4.15pm if required.

The prices for our extended services are extremely competitive to support families in these difficult economic

times. The price per hour is only £3.50. This is very good value and an extremely competitive rate for child care.

This runs every Thursday afternoon from 1.30 to 3pm and is a very popular club. It is a great way to meet new friends. There is no cost to join but a £3.00 levy is charged to cover the cost of

Herbs

There are herb pots again at the front of the school. Don't forget you are welcome to help yourself to a pinch of herbs to brighten up your home cooking (& drinking e.g. Mojitos). The sign above the herbs (in front of Ms McGill's class) to the left of the front door as you leave the building, gives tips on which herbs to use for what meals. Please make good use of them.



Food & Drink

 School meals £2.50 a day or £12.50 a week although this may be subject to change by September.



 Milk is vital for growing children as it strengthens bones and teeth. Children in Reception and Nursery are entitled to free milk as are children who are eligible for free school meals and clothing vouchers (not the universal free meal for all FS & KS1 children). The cost of milk for the first half

term after the Summer holidays is £9 term payable by Friday 9th September via ParentPay NOT cash or cheque. If you need help with this please see the School Office. Due to the administrative burden of checking attendance and the inability to change the order daily unfortunately milk money cannot be refunded for absence.

- Snack money for Nursery and Reception is also paid by ParentPay and the cost for next half term is £13 payable by Friday 9th September.
- Fruit tuck shop money from Year 1 up is £7 for this half term, again payable by Friday 9th September.



Be Sun Wise

As we are in July it is important that thoughts go to protecting children from the sun. The children at the school spend a lot of time outdoors during the school day and lunch times in particular are times when the sun is at its hottest. You may think it is cloudy but the sun can still break through.



Please help your child by applying sun screen before they get dressed in the morning (most sun tan lotions should last for the school day so children don't need to apply it at school). Also please ensure they have the minimum of skin showing and provide them with a hat to wear outside (we have legionnaire caps for sale at the School Office - £4.50. The school will provide these for Early Years Children) to protect their heads.

If you feel your child needs additional protection during the day if they have fair skin or susceptible to sun burn then you can send their own lotion into school in a named bottle and a bag (e.g. sandwich/freezer bag) and give to their class teacher. A staff member will re-apply sun cream as they go out for lunch in these cases. Please note that the responsibility for sun protection is with parents not the school.

Keeping Your Child Safe

We do a lot in school to support your child in keeping themselves safe through assemblies, circle times, Kidsafe etc. Please support us by regularly talking to your child about...

- Keeping safe from strangers. Explain to your child never to go with anyone they don't know. If they feel scared to go into the nearest shop and ask them to phone you (make sure they have your number) or have a phone with them if they are out and about.
- Keeping safe near roads, with warm and light nights they may be playing out. Please instil into them the Highway Code and NEVER to run into a road after footballs etc.
- Not to go near railway lines. The West Coast line has had a number of incidents with children getting injured. Please ensure they know to keep well away.
- Finally please ensure they are safe online. We continue to have to deal with issues that have resulted from children using social media sites that quite simply they are accessing illegally. Please have a good look at the chart below and ENFORCE

it for your child's safety and their mental health and to preserve their innocent childhood years:



We strongly urge you not to let your children use these sites.

Please Be Aware - Huggy Wuggy



This is Huggy Wuggy-a sinister character that children are coming across online via YouTube and TikTok. A number of

the children at school know about this character. The bear sings about "hugging and killing" and asks those watching to "take their last breath". One line says: "I could hug you here forever, til you breathe your last breath together."

The Police are aware of this issue.

Top Tips for helping your children:

- If your child hasn't mentioned Huggy Wuggy or Poppy Playtime, don't name it. You may pique their curiosity which in turn could lead to them searching out the content for themselves on platforms they might have access to.
- If you hear a child in your care mention Huggy Wuggy, pause and remain calm. It could be that they have overheard conversation about in school or online, it doesn't necessarily mean they have viewed content or have a full understanding of who Huggy Wuggy is.
- 3. Ask them about the content they enjoy watching online, and if anything they've seen has ever made them or their friends upset or scared.
- 4. If they have seen anything upsetting, reassure them that they are safe. It's important children know they can come and speak to you without

- fear of judgement. If necessary, ask them to show you the video or game, and follow appropriate reporting procedures if you are concerned.
- 5. If your child is having nightmares or is anxious about something they've watched, it's important to have a conversation about expressing their feelings. You can use our emotions journal to help your child express complex emotions.

As with all online material PLEASE PLEASE do make yourself aware of what your child(ren) are watching online.

Safeguarding/Child Protection

Full details on the county's policies, procedures and processes with regard to safeguarding plus analysis of outcomes of serious case reviews can be accessed


