# Latest Covid Update

At the time of writing the guidance for local schools remains unchanged despite the lifting of many national restrictions.



Please can all parents note that Cumbria continues to have its own guidance for schools that differs from national and is classed as 'enhanced local guidance'

Please also note advice changes regularly and it is more than likely there will be further changes before Easter

The current courses of action are described below:

- If your child is positive (either by PCR or LF test) then they will need to isolate for 10 days (the national option of LF testing from day 6 and having 2 negative LFs in a 24 hour period does not apply).
- If there is a positive case in a household then all children need to isolate for 5 days and then have a PCR test and if negative the children can return to school. The original exception for children who have already had Covid has been withdrawn as the new Omicron variant can reinfect. The option for daily LF testing and attending school does not apply to a Primary pupil at this school.

If your child has to isolate due to Covid you will be asked whether you would like remote work set daily for your child. We are happy to provide this but there have been a number of cases recently where families have found this unhelpful as they or their child are too ill to complete the work and it adds to stress levels. Additionally if your child is eligible for free school meals and are missing out on their meal at school we will provide vouchers for the duration of their isolation.

# Safeguarding/Child Protection

In addition to the above the school has a 'Safeguarding Zone' on its website which contains the above link as well as relevant school policies, further information and a diagram showing how we keep your child safe in school. It is well worth a look.

Sharing information is in the best interests of

children and their safeguarding. The school reserves the right to share and receive

information from other agencies that may have had dealings with your child.



If you ever have any concerns about the safety or wellbeing of a child, then you can ring your concerns through to the County's 24 hour 'Safeguarding Hub' number and you can remain anonymous if you wish. Callers can outline their concerns and the Safeguarding Hub will give advice (consultation) and if necessary undertake an assessment of need.



There is now also an adult NSPCC helpline where any concerned adult can seek advice if they are concerned about a child and would like advice on whether to make a referral. The number to call is

#### **Domestic Violence**

Debbie Cook, our Educational Support Manager has trained to be a 'Domestic Violence



Encompass

Champion' and is a resource available to any adult who would like to confidentially share incidents with her and is a very good source of advice. Just contact the School Office to get in touch with her.

Domestic violence is on the increase and causes terrible harm to victims and the associated children.

It is everyone's responsibility to ensure it is eradicated. We are working closely with the Police and the school will learn of any incidents to support any children whose lives are affected by such an occurrence.

# Nursery Intakes



Children born between 1 January 2019 and 31 March 2019 can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week Nursery education from April 2022.

Children born between **1 April 2019** and **31 August 2019** can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week from **September 2022.** 

Children born between **1 September 2019** and **31 December 2019** can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week from January 2023.

# If you know of any children with birth dates between these times and would like their child to come to this school, then please ask them to get in touch with the School Office <u>as soon</u> <u>as possible.</u>

Forms for applying for any of these intakes can be downloaded from the Cumbria County Council website <u>https://www.cumbria.gov.uk/childrensservices/schoolsa</u> <u>ndlearning/lss/schooladmissions.asp</u> (or use the QR code) ring the School Office and we can post them out. When returning the form we need to see the Birth Certificate and a proof of address.

This runs every Thursday afternoon from 1.30 to 3pm and is a very popular club. It is a great way to meet new



# Hot Cross Scones



These light and fluffy, well portioned scones are a great snack for kids to make over Easter. With no yeast, you won't have to worry about proving the mixture, making them an easier and quicker alternative to the usual hot cross buns

#### **Skills Check**

Follow a recipe; follow food safety and hygiene rules; tidy away; use a timer to cook correctly; crack an egg; beat an egg; rub fat into flour; handle and roll pastry; cut out rolled pastry; glaze pastry; use measuring spoons and jug; use weighing scales; use the oven (with adult supervision)

#### Equipment

20 x 30cm ovenproof dish/baking tray, weighing scales, measuring spoons, measuring iug. medium mixing bowl, wooden spoon, rolling pin, cookie cutter, small bowl, fork or whisk, pastry brush, piping bag or teaspoon.

Allergens (Please note the allergens listed are indicative only. Allergens vary depending on brand; check the labels on the products you use): Wheat | Gluten | Eggs | Milk | Sulphites

#### Ingredients (makes 8):

- 225g self-raising flour
- 30g butter
- 15g sugar
- 30g raisins
- 125 ml semi skimmed milk
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1/2 tsp cinnamon
- 1/2 tsp mixed spice
- 2 small eggs

#### For the crosses:

- 45g plain flour
- 30ml water

#### Method

- 1. Pre-heat the oven to 220C/200C (Fan) and butter a 20 x 30cm oven dish or baking tray.
- 2. Combine the flour, salt, mixed spice and cinnamon in a medium mixing bowl. Add the butte and rub in until combined
- 3. Add the sugar, raisins and one of the eggs. Stir to mix.
- 4. Add just enough milk, little by little, to form a stiff dough.
- 5. Roll out the dough to a 2.5 3cm thickness and use a 5cm (2 inch) round cookie cutter to cu out 8 circles. Place in the prepared baking tray.
- 6. Beat the remaining egg and using a pastry brush glaze the top of each scone with the beate egg
- 7. Mix the flour and water together to make a paste, and pipe a cross onto each scone.
- 8. Bake in the preheated oven for 15 minutes.

# Food & Drink



• School meals £2.50 a day or £12.50 a week

 Milk is vital for growing children as it strengthens bones and teeth. Children in Reception and Nursery are entitled to free milk as are children who

entitled to free milk as are children who are eligible for free school meals and clothing vouchers (not the universal free meal for all FS & KS1 children). The cost of milk for the half term after the Easter holidays is £7.50 and needs to be paid



by Friday, 22<sup>nd</sup> April via ParentPay NOT cash or cheque. If you need help with this please see the School Office. Due to the administrative burden of checking attendance and the inability to change the order daily unfortunately milk money cannot be refunded for absence.

We continue to urge you to take the school meal option. The cook has worked out that **the cost of a nutritional packed lunch is more than the cost of a school dinner**. So, without all the hassle



for you as a parent to make up lunches every night, you can opt for school dinners, still save money and be comforted in the knowledge that your child is having a hot meal that complies with nutritional guidelines for a healthy life in the future.

All children in Reception and Key Stage 1 have free lunches and the cost in KS2 is only £12 per week (£2.50 per day) and the Nursery meal for the 30 hour pupils is £1.80.
