Lantern Making & Parade




There will be a lantern parade at 6pm on Thursday 4th November from school round the Nature Reserve on Moorclose Road and back to school (see route map

alongside). Pupils taking part will need to be at school by 5.45pm and can be collected/walk home from school after the parade (approximately 6.45pm).

The parade will be comprised of children from Years 5 and 6, some of whom will lead the parade with musical instruments followed by our lanterns. The lanterns all represent 'pollinators' as the parade is in conjunction with Workington Nature Partnership and their 'Get Buzzin' encouraging pollination initiative. Children are invited to take part with torches, lanterns or musical instruments. Pupils taking part in the parade will need coats (there are candles in the parade and adequate precautions will be taken but coats should also be fire retardant) and their hair tied back if they have long hair.

We would very much welcome supporters on the route and would like to invite children from all other years to line the route and to bring torches, battery lanterns etc. to be part of the experience. The whole event is being filmed by Haltwhistle films and will be shown as an example of a community working together to encourage wildlife and have fun!

Our thanks for what promises to be a spectacular event go to Susan Cammish, a Workington Nature Partnership Ranger and Di Larfynne, the artist behind the willow and tissue paper lanterns.





Remembrance Parade

The school will also be joining in another parade, the Harrington

Remembrance Parade in the morning of the 14th November. The Parade will leave the British Legion at 9.15am and arrive at Church at 10am for a service and then a commemoration at the Cenotaph afterwards. We

Children in Need Dance

Police Dog

We had 2 very special visitors in assembly in mid-October. A new Police Labrador puppy and Sgt Aiden Bew to the school last week.

The school was invited to name the new Police dog as a 'Thank You' for its support of the local community. This really excited the children and each class had discussions and a vote for their favourite name. Some of the suggestions focused on the police and the dog's role like Bobby or Chase. Some were related to the dog's colour, names like Toffee, Fudge and Peanut were put forward. We had some totally random names as well, like Fishing Rod!

The winning name, chosen by the Police, was 'Beck'. This was the chosen name of class 3JWa and they chose this because it was the start of the name 'Beckstone'. The winning class received a treat and a photo with the dog.



All the children (and staff!) that wanted to were allowed to stroke the dog on the way out of assembly.



A spokesperson for Cumbria police said:

"Beckstone Primary School was chosen due to it being a community school and having strong links within the Allerdale community. The headteacher, David Warbrick, and all the staff at Beckstone have been extremely accommodating in helping the community during the pandemic and beyond.

"The opportunity arose to seek assistance in naming one of the constabulary's dogs, which is located in West Cumbria. The school was invited to be involved to say thank you for all that they have done for the community. Each class got to pick a name and then the constabulary's puppy walker family, who is currently caring for Beck, chose from this selection."

November Charities

November is typically a month where there are numerous charitable events and requests in advance of Christmas. We recognise also that times are hard and are striving to keep any financial requests to a minimum and to make them totally voluntary.

There will be the facility to make donations on ParentPay to Children in Need if you so wish, there will be a non-uniform day on that day (19th November) but there is no set fee to pay and no-one will ask children if they have paid.

There will be poppies for sale from today (1st November) up until the 11th November. We are suggesting a minimum donation of 20p for a poppy and there are also other items for sale at prices up to a £1. Poppies and the other items will be on sale at the front and back gates only. If children wish to purchase any items parents can buy at the front on Mrs Rosser's table or at the back gate and KS2 children who bring money can purchase there too.

The additional items on sale include snap bracelets, silicon wristbands, zip pulls and key rings as pictured below:





In addition to the poppy sales, all money taken will go to the Royal British Legion. There will also be sales of Pudsey badges from Monday 8th November up to Friday 19th November (Children in Need Day), again at the gates. These are 'eco-friendly' badges and whilst they may look plastic they are made of bio-degradable material. All money from these badges will go to Children in Need so this can be counted as your donation. The badges, costing £1 represent Pudsey and Blush and are limited in stock so the earlier purchased the more likelihood of getting a first choice.







Meet the Teacher 'Drop In's



We received a lot of positive feedback from this event and the children were so proud and delighted at showing their parents their classroom and their work. Thank you

for your support and given the restrictions over the past 18 months+ hopefully this event has enabled you to picture your child in school.

The next round of parent events is for Early Years parents with 'Come & Play' sessions in the week beginning the 22nd November. These are a chance to see your child in their learning environment and learn alongside them. These will be followed up by further Come & Play sessions in the Spring, a more formal progress meeting and then finally a meeting in the Summer to discuss your child's report.

In the main school the next event will be a formal parents' evening on the 23rd or 24th of February where a progress report will be shared at the half way point of the school year. This will be followed up with an end of year report in July.

All items will be available through ParentPay, please support them as best you can as the Christmas Fair was historically the main fund raiser for our funding supporter, 'Friends at Beckstone'.




In addition the following events should be taking place:

Circuits



'Circuits Days' will take place each half term this school year. They will be on a Thursday or a Friday depending on the day your child has their PE session. As they are now coming to school in PE Kits on those days anyway

there is no need for different clothing on these days. The dates are on the back of the newsletter and the next ones are at the start of December.

Takeover Morning

The Children's Commissioner encourages schools to allow its pupils to 'run' their establishments to give a taster of responsibility and accountability. These sessions give Y6 children an exciting insight into the working life of adults at the



school. Due to Covid these have not taken place recently and this year there is a gradual re-introduction with the morning of the 26th November as the time when the Year 6 children will take over the running of the school. This will involve children welcoming EY & KS1 children, taking assembly, taking lessons, working in the Office, working in the Canteen etc.



- School meals cost £12 per week or £2.40 a day payable on ParentPay
- Milk is vital for growing children as it strengthens bones and teeth. Children in Reception and Nursery are

entitled to free milk as are children who are eligible for free school meals and clothing vouchers (not the universal free meal for all FS & KS1 children). The cost of milk for the THIS half term is £9.00 and needs to be paid by THIS Friday, 5th



November via ParentPay NOT cash or cheque. If you need help with this please see the School Office. Due to the administrative burden of checking attendance and the inability to change the order daily unfortunately milk money cannot be refunded for absence.



- Snack money for Nursery and Reception is also paid by ParentPay and is also due THIS Friday, 5th November, the cost is £7
- Fruit tuck shop money from Year 1 up is again also paid this way, £7 for this half term by THIS Friday 5th November

someone else's blood donations to save their life at some point.




Latest Covid Update



there is what is classed as an 'Outbreak' there will be no class sent home unless directed to the school under Public Health guidance if there is an 'Outbreak'.

Please note however that the school has procedures it follows that are agreed with Public Health. The advice changes regularly and the details of the current courses of action are described below however in a nutshell if there is a positive case in a household then all children need to isolate for 5 days and then have a PCR test and if negative the children can return to school. The only exception is if a child had already had Covid they don't need to isolate.

The details of this approach to help address the continuing high levels of Covid in the area can be seen in the flow chart below.



Please also have contingency child care plans at the ready as schools have been advised to send pupils home if they are displaying Covid symptoms (see below). A Covid Summary is available in the 'News & Events' section of our web site

What are the Symptoms of Covid?

In addition Public Health Cumbria have issued the following flow chart to help parents ascertain whether it is possibly Covid that their child has:

Flowchart for managing non-standard symptoms in educational settings when the risk of COVID-19 infection is considered to be high (see above) Child/young person has symptoms of:

nausea, diarrhoea, or loss of appetite
headache
extreme or unusual tiredness
(fatique) Child/pupil/student also has any follow stay at home quidance and arrang pcR testing. a new continuous cough. a high temperature, a loss of, or change in their normal sense of taste or If the individual has diarrhoea or vomiting, advise exclusion from the setting until 48 hours after these symptoms have stopped and the individual feels well enough to return. Identify whether they have tested positive for COVID-19 within the past 90 days Individual HAS tested positive for COVID-19 in the past 90 days Individual has NOT tested positive for COVID-19 in the past 90 days Ask individual to consider a PCR tes (once nausea and vomiting have stopped if applicable) and to isolate pending the results. Lateral flow tests are available for asympotamitic testing for yourselves or other adult family members, these are not advised for Primary aged children. These are available by post from Gov.uk, some pharmacies or from Allerdale house.

If you suspect you or any member of your family <u>including children</u> have Covid then you should go for a PCR test.



Flu Vaccines

Parents of younger children may like to know that children aged 2 upwards and also in Nursery can receive their free vaccination through their GP or Harrington Pharmacy offers this Pharmacies. service and is very handy for school.

Flu vaccinations for adults are also available on request at Pharmacies or large supermarkets for an average £10 fee.

Winter, Covid Guidance & Heating

The current Government guidance to schools is very clear that they should be well ventilated and have windows open to ensure a free flow of air. There are of course some issues that arise from this guidance once the air temperature outside falls.

Firstly, the school will naturally be colder than normal so

it is perhaps prudent for your child to wear a vest or T-shirt under their usual uniform. We are allowing children to wear navy fleeces on top of their uniform in class for added warmth if needed. Fleeces with a school logo on can be ordered here:



Reading




As a reward for those reading at least 5 times a

Reading with Your Child



We want to promote 'Share a book every day' with children at home with their family and friends.

Sharing books with children is fun, it can be a time for closeness, laughing and talking

together and it can also help your child to become a lifelong reader and have a love of books.

There is no right or wrong way of doing it and it is never too early to start reading to your child

Tips for sharing a book

- Try and find somewhere away from noise and television and make sure you are not using your mobile phone
- Make sure you take time to look and talk about the pictures on the pages
- If your baby chews books to start with, it doesn't matter. They will soon enjoy helping you to turn the pages
- The use of sound effects for example animal noises will help to bring the story to life and make you both laugh
- Encourage family members such as siblings to join in and share a book with your child
- For older children, ask some questions when reading together, for example; what can you see on this page? How do you think Goldilocks felt when she saw the bears? What do you think is going to happen next?
- As your child's language develops encourage your child to tell the story. They

- can read the pictures to you and talk about what's happening on the page
- If you think you are not a brilliant reader it doesn't matter because just hearing and listening to your voice is comforting for your child.

How to read aloud to older children

1. Keep it fun

Reading shouldn't be a chore! When children's experiences are pleasant they are more likely to develop a life-long love of reading

2. Read with energy

Use lots of energy! Using facial expressions and emotion: different voices for different characters; and varying the tempo and volume that you read with will help to create an immersive storytelling experience your children will love.

3. Ask questions

Asking questions as you read can improve understanding and get the child to be an active participant in the reading experience

4. Explain as you go

Explaining what is happening on the pages and allowing time to talk about it as you go through the book can deepen your child's understanding and expand their vocabulary

5. Point out words

Pointing out words can really help younger children when it comes to learning to read. Scanning from left to right, as well as showing what a letter and a word is, has been shown to help develop advanced reading skills.

6. Look at the pictures/illustrations in the book
Talking about the pictures in the book is just as
important as reading the words


7. Get them to read along with you

This would work especially well with your favourite rhyming books that you have read so many times with them that they can remember parts

8. Reread the same book

This is linked to the above point as it will give them the confidence to join in and helps build fluency and a better understanding of rhythm and language

Encourage the child to retell the story to you
 When they are confident with the story see if they
 can recite parts of it to you or someone else on
 their own. This will improve their confidence and
 help develop their memory and speaking skills.



Extreme Weather/Heating Emergencies

Nursery Intakes


Children born between 1 September 2018 and 31 December 2018 can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week from January 2022.

Children born between 1 January 2019 and 31 March 2019 can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week Nursery education from April 2022.

Children born between 1 April 2019 and 31 August 2019 can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week from September 2022.

If you know of any children with birth dates between these times and would like their child to come to this school, then please ask them to get in touch with the School Office as soon as possible.

managed to receive donations of just over 1,500 tokens and can spend these in November. They should allow us to get some additional equipment for the gardening club that will resume in the Spring.




Social Media

There is a parental guidance video presented by our own Ms Gorman on our web site which is well worth a watch. It is in the 'Parent Info 'zone or follow the QR code.




Please protect their childhood and innocence. Please blame the school and if they say "Everyone is on them" then that is certainly not true! Tell them to say that to Mr Warbrick!!



Summary of AGM on 19th October

- Mr Nick Whitehead elected Chair
- The Governors discussed possible co-options with a view to Salterbeck representation and someone with a financial qualification.
- The Governors thanked Donna Hawley for her service for 4 years as a parent Governor.
- The Governors welcomed Laurie Black as a new parent Governor.
- The Governors discussed the way forward with the school's '5 Year Vision' and have developed a strategy linked to the school's mission...'Building Bridges...Promoting Learning & Excellence...Shaping the Future'. The development of action plans for these areas will be the focus of meetings for the rest of the year.
- The training strategy and available courses for Governors to enhance effectiveness was discussed.
- The Governors' zone on the web site was also analysed,
- The 'Annual School Review' that comments on school performance was discussed.
- The current school roll of 357 was noted as was the average attendance rate of 94% and 0 exclusions. It was noted that the school's attendance remains high despite high Covid levels in the locality.
