

WhatsApp, Children and Inappropriate Use

There are legal minimum ages for many social media apps, these are reproduced below:



As can be seen WhatsApp has a minimum age of 16. The reasons for minimum ages are because children are not mature enough to understand messages on online media that are out of context. Many messages can be misconstrued and can lead to fallings out and damage to mental health. In addition when groups are formed the public nature of it adds peer pressure to any fallings out or arguments which further heightens tensions based on out of context misunderstandings.

Children often tell their parents 'Everyone' has it...that is not true and as a parent you have the responsibility to ensure your child is operating within the law. We would strongly urge you to not let your child join these groups and if the genie is out of the bottle and they are

using them then you check their messages to ensure all is ok for your child and their wellbeing.

For the last few years there have been a number of issues that spill in to school as a result of WhatsApp groups, mainly in Year 6. This has again happened this year despite covering the dangers of social media regularly in newsletters, covering online safety as part of our curriculum and focusing on it in curriculum evenings. There is an excellent section on our web site called 'Social Media and our Child' that has a lot of links to advice with regard to apps and an excellent video from Ms Gorman on how we ask parents not to let their children get involved in social media in UKS2, well worth a watch.

The amount of time in resolving disputes arising from social media is immense and the school does not have access to these WhatsApp groups which makes finding the truth hard. We are going to



review our behaviour policy with regard to this and will let you know changes when they have been agreed that will aim to sanction users that cause upset that comes into school and to ensure parents take responsibility for any misuse of media by their child.

Social Media & Parents

If you have an issue with the school then please do not air it on social media but discuss it with school. The school staff are a welcoming and supportive group of people who will do their utmost to resolve any concern you may have.

In addition, please do not name any children in any posts or indeed share images of children who are not your own either from your own camera or from our learning platforms, Seesaw and Tapestry.





Industrial Action

The industrial action will continue, the next strikes are on Thursday 27th April and Tuesday 2nd May. The Government made an offer but this was well below the offer made to teachers in Scotland and Wales plus given a real terms significant fall in wages since 2020 this was rejected by 98% of National Education Union returns in a ballot. At the time of writing the intentions of other teaching unions are unknown (e.g. NASUWT< NAHT etc) so we will have let you know what will happen. If other unions become involved then there is the potential of a full school closure to pupils on those days so please be prepared. Please do not assume if the school was open to your child previously this will still be the case. Indeed changes are more than likely and due to changes in teachers striking it is unlikely the offer to Y6 and Y2 pupils will continue. The teachers realise and understand the disruption partial closure has but received many messages of support from families. It is hoped the next proposed strike days will persuade the Government to at least match the offer to teachers in other areas of the United Kingdom.

Let us all hope however that the dispute is resolved as soon as possible for everyone's benefit.



Coronation Celebrations

To mark the Coronation of King Charles the Third we are planning a school parade on Friday 6th May through Harrington, down the school



hill and down to the railway arches and back to the school field.

The proposals at this stage are

- The parade will be led by our own King and Queen Consort (Y6 pupils)
- o There will be accompanying drums.
- All children to be dressed in red, white, blue or kings/queens...we need parent support with this
- All children to have crowns (made in classes from gold card with fake jewels on)
- All children to have Union Jack flags to wave.

Parents will be invited to line the route and then are welcome to come up to the school field for some refreshments, some entertainment and a community patriotic singing session. Further information will be released soon but please make a date in your diary.

Due to logistics of numbers etc if the weather is bad the event will be cancelled and there will be a scaled down version in school for the children only.



The recent governor challenge day proved very successful. In this instance, governors were able to update their own professional knowledge base, though in-house training as well as discussing key objectives and developments from the last meeting and how they can be implemented effectively moving forward. 
Living Eggs



It is everyone's responsibility to ensure it is eradicated. We are working closely with the Police and the school will learn of any incidents to support any children whose lives are affected by such an occurrence.

The parents' evenings were a great success and over 98% of parents attended. Thank you for complying with the one child one appointment policy, this ensures both parents hear the same message and also reduces the workload on teachers. We hope you liked the report format. This will be updated and form the basis of the end of year

school reports.

The 'Come & Play' sessions in Nursery are the equivalent of parents' evenings and staff will talk to you about your child's development and progress so please ensure someone from home attends.

Reminder - Helping with Living Costs

Everyone at Beckstone Primary School is doing their best looking at ways we can help support financial pressures on



families during the cost of living crisis. We have been limiting non-uniform days, dress up days, Christmas fair, subsidising school trips and offering free secondhand uniform to children as and when required.

The Government have issued a 'Food Poverty Grant' to all schools to be used at their own discretion. At Beckstone we looked at the best way of using these limited funds and we decided we wanted to support and help children's nutrition. We are doing this by offering the following from NOW until the end of the school year.

- free fruit to all children
- free fruit and snacks to children in Nursery and Reception provide KS2 children with a FREE school meal on a Monday at no cost to the parent



Nursery Intakes





Children born between 1 September 2020 and 31 December 2020 can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week from January 2024.

Children born between 1 January 2021 and 31 March 2021 can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week Nursery education from April 2024.

If you know of any children with birth dates between these times and would like their

child to come to this school, then please ask them to get in touch with the School Office as soon as possible.

Uniform

Please ensure your child attends in the appropriate uniform...dark trousers, navy sweatshirts, light blue polo shirts and if a sports day dark leggings and dark/black trainers.

Please also remember that that until we hear that Haig Embroideries are able to supply our uniform colours for polo shirts, sweatshirts and fleeces please do not purchase these items from them as they are not the correct colour. Some parents are still buying these items and the school uniform is no longer uniform in colour. The Governors are considering what to do about this as there is no point in having a uniform if it is different colours. We had asked Haig Embroideries not to sell these items until they had our colours, it is very disappointing this saga is continuing.

Our colours in these items are available with a logo from Border Embroideries or without the logo from Matalan, Asda etc. The logo is completely optional and we are trying our best to support families with uniform costs

Food & Drink



School Meals NOW cost £10.80 per week (£2.70 a day) payable on ParentPay as Monday Meals are FREE until the end of the school year. This is great value when you look at prices of goods in supermarkets for packed lunches.

Milk is vital for growing children as it strengthens bones and teeth. Children in Reception and

Nursery are entitled to free milk as are children who are eligible for free school meals and clothing vouchers (not the universal free meal for all FS & KS1 children). The cost of milk for this half term is £8.40 and needs to



be paid by Friday, 21st April 2023 via ParentPay NOT cash or cheque. The cost for the second half of the summer term is £9.90 payable by Friday 9th June. Due to the administrative burden of checking attendance and the inability to change the order daily unfortunately milk money cannot be refunded for absence.



Snack money for Nursery and Reception is now FREE until the end of the school year.



Fruit is now also FREE until the end of the school year.

A link to the new menu for this half term and up to the end of the school

year will go out by text soon. The menu is a result of much consultation with children in classes and the



School Council and we hope it caters to 'favourites' for the children.




