Nearer the time we will also be selling reindeer dust and hot chocolate stocking fillers amongst other things after school. You will be notified in advance.







Food & Drink





- School Meals cost £13.50 per week (£2.70 a day) payable on ParentPay. This still represents good value when you look at prices of goods in supermarkets for packed lunches.
- Milk is vital for growing children as it strengthens bones and teeth. Children in Reception and Nursery

are entitled to free milk as are children who are eligible for free school meals and clothing vouchers (not the universal free meal for all FS & KS1 children). The cost of milk for next half term is £8.50 and needs to be



paid by Friday, 6th January 2023 via ParentPay NOT cash or cheque. If you need help with this please see the School Office. Due to the administrative burden of checking attendance and the inability to change the order daily unfortunately milk money cannot be refunded for absence.



 Snack money for Nursery and Reception is also paid by ParentPay and is due also by Friday, 6th January 2023, the cost is £13 for next half term.



• Fruit tuck shop money from Year 1 up is also paid this way, £8 for next half term by Friday 6th January 2023.

PE Kits

Following on from last month a reminder that PE Kits consist of pale blue T shirts and at this time of year tracksuit trousers and dark trainers without any designer labels. This uniform policy remains unchanged over many years. We don't wish to add any additional costs and if you have inadvertently strayed from this policy with regard to tracksuit trousers or trainers then please ensure when you get new ones that they are dark with no labels. We are aiming for parents to source them from cheap suppliers to help with the cost of living.

After a re-visit of our PE curriculum the children no longer need plimsolls in school and can do indoor gymnastics in their bare feet.

Finally, the staff and Governors have recently reaffirmed the decision to allow children to come to school in their PE Kits on their PE days (apart from Early Years where they are taught to dress themselves) as this adds a lot of additional time to both ends of a PE lesson.

Uniform Issues

There have been a couple of issues with some new uniform clothes recently. Border Embroideries issued some PE tops that were a different colour blue to our usual uniform colour. They have tried to put this right by sending 19 shirts of the right colour to replace those ordered with the wrong colour batch. It then came to light that another firm Haig Embroideries were issuing our uniform without contacting the school. This has resulted in a further shade of blue and sweatshirts and fleeces a different colour too.

We have been working hard to try to put all this right, there is little point to a uniform if it is not the same colour. Let us hope we can return to uniform colours soon.

Uniform Exchange

The Governors have set up a uniform exchange where donations of nearly new uniform can be donated but most importantly parents can order replacement uniforms for free if they wish. It is a very discrete service and all you have to do is email uniforms@beckstone.cumbria.sch.uk or use the QR code in the flyer belowand send in your request, if we have clothing of sizes needed we will bag them up and you can collect them from the School Office.



Names in Clothing

We are not long into the school year and we already have lots of lost property. Please, please, please put your child's name in their clothing. When this happens their clothing is easily returned. The amount of money some families lose by not doing this is staggering when you see how much is left unclaimed!

We will soon be asking all children to wear their coats at lunchtimes and playtimes. We have an

All Year 6 children should be attending one of the sessions




Safeguarding/Child Protection


Full details on the county's policies, procedures and processes with regard to safeguarding plus analysis of outcomes of serious case reviews can be accessed

Sharing information is in the best interests of children and their safeguarding. The school reserves the right to share and receive





If you ever have any concerns about the safety or wellbeing of a child, then you can ring your concerns through to the County's 24 hour 'Safeguarding Hub' number and you can remain anonymous if you wish. Callers can outline their concerns and the Safeguarding Hub will give



advice (consultation) and if necessary undertake an assessment of need.



There is now also an adult NSPCC helpline where any concerned adult can seek advice if they are concerned about a child and would like advice on whether to make a referral. The number to call is



Domestic Violence

Debbie Cook, our Educational Support Manager has trained to be a 'Domestic Violence



Champion' and is a resource available to any adult who would like to confidentially share incidents with her and is a very good source of advice. Just contact the School Office to get in touch with her.

Domestic violence is on the increase and causes terrible harm to victims and the associated children.

It is everyone's responsibility to ensure it is eradicated. We are working closely with the Police and the school will learn of any incidents to support any children whose lives are affected by such an occurrence.

Nursery Intakes

Children born between 1 September 2019 and 31 December 2019 can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week from January 2023.

Children born between 1 January 2020 and 31 March 2020 can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week Nursery education from April 2023.

Children born between 1 April 2020 and 31 August 2020 can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week from September 2023.

If you know of any children with birth dates between these times and would like their child to come to this school, then please ask

them to get in touch with the School Office <u>as</u> soon as possible.

Forms for applying for any of these intakes can be downloaded from the Cumbria County Council website



https://www.cumbria.gov.uk/childrensservices/schoolsandlearning/lss/schooladmissions.asp (or use the QR code) ring the School Office and we can post them out. When returning the form we need to see the Birth Certificate and a proof of address.

Beckstone's Extended Services

Our extended services include the Breakfast Club (£4.00 from 7.30am, £3.50 from 8am) Last entry is at 8.30am; Educare (our popular afternoon child care provision for morning Nursery children – see table at the bottom of the next page – please note these places **MUST BE BOOKED IN ADVANCE**) with pick up times at 2.15pm and 3.15pm Please note that unfortunately we are unable to offer facilities for packed lunches for Nursery children.

Beckstone Xtra (again £3.50 an hour) runs from the end of the school day until 5.15pm with an earlier pick up time of 4.15pm if required. Beckstone Xtra is available



from 3.15 to 5.15pm for anyone who books in advance via

bookings@beckstone.cumbria.sch.uk
Or simply use the QR code.

The prices for our extended services are extremely competitive to support families in these difficult economic times. The price per hour is only £3.50. This is very good value and an extremely competitive rate for child care.

Carer & Toddler Club

This runs every Thursday afternoon from 1.30 to 3pm and is a very popular club. It is a great way to meet new friends. There is no cost to join but a £3.00 levy is charged to cover the cost of refreshments etc.



Attendance

It is of the utmost importance to your child's education that they attend school consistently as

learning is planned in a progressive way and one day follows on from the next in each subject. Of course there will be times when a child is too poorly to come to school or they have to isolate (the latter does not count as an absence on their attendance records). However these should be **rare events** as prompt regular attendance will really help your child do well at school. **Planning holidays in term time is to the detriment of your child's education**. Please see letter from the Council later in this newsletter.

Term Time Holidays & Tests

There is active discouragement of taking holidays in term time as it disrupts a child's learning – see article above.

Taking time off at the statutory testing time needs to be avoided completely.

The Government however have recently announced an additional Bank Holiday on Monday 8th May, the start of the Y6 SATs week!! We are awaiting further details but hope to fit the SATS into the 4 days of that week that remain.



LEAVE OF ABSENCE IN TERM TIME

Absence from school due to family holidays taken in term time can be disruptive to children's education. It can also be disruptive to other pupils in the class. In addition, I am concerned that there could be some misunderstanding of the law in relation to absence from school because of holidays taken during term time

Any absence from school should be avoided unless for medical reasons, as it can have a serious effect on your child's educational progress, and can create difficulties for them on their return to school, particularly if they are joining a new school or class. It is important to note that only the Headteacher can authorise absence from school. Parents/carers cannot authorise the absence themselves.

Changes to legislation have removed the discretionary 10 day period of absence which covered family holidays. Schools can only grant requests for a leave of absence in term time in exceptional circumstances. If you believe that your circumstances are exceptional you can make a request to the school. In considering your request, the school will take into account the child's age, the time of year of the absence and the nature of the visit. The Headteacher will also consider the child's stage of education and progress and the child's overall attendance record. It is highly unlikely that leave will be authorised if examinations or other important tests will be missed. Headteachers will not authorise absence unless they believe your circumstances are exceptional. In all cases it is best to have a discussion with the Headteacher in order to look at the issues as they affect your child.

All unauthorised absences, including holidays that have not been sanctioned by the Headteacher, are accumulated and parents who fail to ensure regular attendance of their children at school can be issued with a Fixed Penalty Notice. The amount is £80 if paid within 21 days and £120 if paid between 21 and 28 days. It is therefore essential that parents take this into account if they are thinking of a family holiday in

The Department for Education define persistent absenteeism as below 90% attendance and schools may wish to use this figure to determine whether or not to pursue legal action such as the issuing of a Fixed

Many people are working very hard to help your child to succeed. I trust you will support us in this matter, in partnership with your child's school.
