Industrial Action



Dear Parents,

Half term is just over two weeks away and we will actually be half way through the school year in the week before half term! School has been so busy with so many things happening time has just flown!!



Thank you for your understanding and support with the teacher's strike, the National Education Union (one of many teaching unions but

the largest) took strike action. We fully followed Government guidance for yesterday's strike however this may not be possible for future strike days as many factors are subject to change. My union (National Association of Head Teachers) got an overwhelming strike vote but had less than 50% return of voting slips so their members couldn't strike despite wanting to myself.

In the second half of this term there will be Parents' Evenings, please make a note of the dates (on back page). I would urge each family to ensure they attend as this is an opportunity to learn about your child's academic progress. All educational research shows that where school and home work closely together the child flourishes.

We hope you find this newsletter informative and useful and would very much welcome feedback either verbally or in writing. Please use the Parent Suggestions box at the top of the school hill or indeed the 'Parents' Online Suggestion Box' on our web site. If ever you wish anything to be included in a newsletter then please do let me know

Industrial Action



Along with many areas of the public sector there is

currently an ongoing industrial dispute over pay. The real term salaries of staff working in education has fallen significantly since 2010 and the impact of the high rate of inflation has caused a further squeeze on the living standards of the workforce. In addition, school budgets have not been compensated for increased costs (e.g. 391% increase in gas prices for this school) and as a result there is immense financial pressure on the school. In this context there were strike ballots by all the major teaching unions, all of which had a clear majority for strike action but only the National Education Union got over 50% of its membership voting.

The first strike was yesterday, the 1st February, and the school followed the DfE and County guidance to the letter opening for Pupil Premium children, Looked After children, Education Health Care Plan pupils and pupils of essential workers (who had to register by the deadline of last Monday so plans could be out in place).

The other planned strike days if there is no settlement are:

Tuesday 28th February (North West Region)

Wednesday 15th March & Thursday 16th March – both national strike days.

At the time of writing it is unclear as to what form these days will take. Some of the teaching unions are looking to re-ballot, unions representing non-teaching staff may also ballot and guidance may change. Please do

not assume if the school was open to your child yesterday that this will be the case for every strike day. It may be prudent to be prepared and have childcare in place for the dates shown.

Let us all hope however that the dispute is resolved before any more action has to be taken.

Uniform

There will be a RAG rating for uniform and PE Kit compliance on your child's Spring report that will be shared with you at the March Parents' Evenings (see later article). There has been some slippage in basic uniform recently so please can we have your support in ensuring that:

- No children are wearing nail varnish
- Dye in hair is only a natural colour
- The ONLY jewellery allowed is STUD earrings and watches. NO bangles, necklaces or dangly earrings.
- Footwear including trainers on sport days are dark, preferably black and not white, pink etc. This was explained in September and hopefully time has elapsed so replacements are correct.
- Sports leggings are plain and dark...no jazzy leggings etc

Also, please remember that that until we hear that Haig Embroideries are able to supply our uniform colours for polo shirts, sweatshirts and fleeces please do not purchase these items from them as they are not the correct colour. There is little point in having a uniform if it is not all the same colour. Our colours in these items are available with a logo from Border Embroideries or without the logo from Matalan, Asda etc. The logo is completely optional and we are trying our best to support families with uniform costs.

Finally, please can as many of you make use of the uniform exchange as you can. Simply email uniform@beckstone.cumbria.sch.uk and if we have the items in stock then you can collect them in the Office FREE of charge.



Additional Funding for Nutrition

The Government has provided additional funding for all schools to support nutrition for children amidst the cost of living crisis. Whilst the funding is not large it is a welcome development and there are proposals going to Governors next week about this



funding and we will let you know the outcomes as soon as we can. It is hoped to support/subsidise certain items after half term.

Safeguarding Children - A Place of Safety

Running after school clubs and after school care requires robust systems to ensure safety at all times. Any system however is subject to human error either by an adult who in the highly busy end of the day time forgets to give out a



lanyard or a child forgetting a club or a number of other factors. We do try to impress on all the children in assemblies that if they realise something is amiss e.g. a parent is not in the place they said they would be then they MUST come back to school and we will help them from there. The front of the school is ALWAYS open even if the back gates get locked. Please stress this to them if they use after school clubs/Beckstone Xtra,

Safeguarding/Child Protection

Full details on the county's policies, procedures and processes with regard to safeguarding plus analysis of outcomes of serious case reviews can be accessed through the Cumbria LSCB website at

www.cumbrialscb.com the site also has a parental information zone.

In addition to the above the school has a 'Safeguarding Zone' on its website which contains the above link as well as relevant school policies, further information and a diagram showing how we keep your child safe in school. It is well worth a look.

Sharing information is in the best interests of children and their safeguarding. The school



reserves the right to share and receive information from other agencies that may have had dealings with your child.

If you ever have any concerns about the safety or wellbeing of a child, then you can ring your concerns through to the County's 24 hour 'Safeguarding Hub'

number and you can remain anonymous if you wish.

Callers can outline their concerns and the Safeguarding Hub will give advice (consultation) and if necessary undertake an assessment of need.



There is now also an adult NSPCC helpline where any concerned adult can seek advice if they are concerned about a child and would like advice on whether to make a referral. The number to call is



Domestic Violence

Operation Encompass

Debbie Cook, our Educational Support Manager has trained to be a 'Domestic Violence Champion' and is a resource available to any adult who would like to confidentially share incidents with her and is a very good source of advice. Just contact the School Office to get in touch with her.

Domestic violence is on the increase and causes terrible harm to victims and the associated children.

It is everyone's responsibility to ensure it is eradicated.

We are working closely with the Police and the school will learn of any incidents to support any children whose lives are affected by such an occurrence.



Site Safety

The gates at the top of the road hill are only closed when there are pedestrians and children using the areas. The separation of cars and pedestrians is a very important safety measure. Recently


there have been parents opening these gates and driving in or out. This is HIGHLY DANGEROUS. Please do not open the gates. There are staff deployed to open the gates and they do this once these areas are free of people. Thank you in advance for your co-operation in this matter.

In addition, please DO NOT come onto site in the morning until the gates are opened by a staff member.



Easter & Summer Holiday Play Scheme

Attendance

It is of the utmost importance to your child's education that they attend school consistently as learning is planned in a progressive way and one day follows on from the next in each subject. Of course, there will be times

when a child is too poorly to come to school (there is guidance on illness related absence at the top of the next page which we hope you will find useful) or they have to isolate (the latter does not count as an absence on their attendance records). However, these should be **rare events** as prompt regular attendance will really help your child do well at school.

Planning holidays in term time is to the detriment of your child's education.



Term Time Holidays & Tests

There is active discouragement of taking holidays in term time as it disrupts a child's learning – see article above.

Taking time off at the statutory testing time needs to be avoided completely.

The Government however have recently announced an additional Bank Holiday on Monday 8th May, the start of the Y6 SATs week!! We are awaiting further details but hope to fit the SATS into the 4 days of that week that remain.

The key dates this school year are:

May – KS1 SATs Month Week beginning 8th May – KS2 SATs 3 weeks from week beg. 5th June – Y4 Times Table tests Week beginning 12th June – Y1 Phonics Screening Check

Food & Drink



- School Meals cost £13.50 per week (£2.70 a day) payable on ParentPay. This still represents good value when you look at prices of goods in supermarkets for packed lunches.
- Milk is vital for growing children as it strengthens bones and teeth. Children in Reception and Nursery

are entitled to free milk as are children who are eligible for free school meals and clothing vouchers (not the universal free meal for all FS & KS1 children). The cost of milk for next half term is £7.50 and needs to be



paid by Friday, 3rd March 2023 via ParentPay NOT cash or cheque. If you need help with this please see the School Office. Due to the administrative burden of checking attendance and the inability to change the order daily unfortunately milk money cannot be refunded for absence.



 Snack money for Nursery and Reception is also paid by ParentPay and is due also by Friday, 3rd March 2023, the cost is £10 for next half term.



 Fruit tuck shop money from Year 1 up is also paid this way, £6.25 for next half term by Friday 3rd March 2023.

Cyclewise

Children in Year 5 who were given consent from parents will be taking part in Cyclewise week during the week beginning the 6th March 2023.



All children taking part will need warm and waterproof clothing. They will also need a cycle helmet (the instructors will have spares if they forget). In addition, all bikes need to be road worthy and have air in their tyres and brakes that work!

Bikes should be locked up against the fence in the Infant yard at the start of each day. If you wish your child to leave their bike on site during the week then they can bring it in at the end of the day and leave it in the corridor.

Year 4 children who have parental consent will have their beginner Cyclewise session either on Thursday 9th March or Friday 10th March in the same week. The

Emergency Drills

The school strives to ensure that health and safety is paramount. As part of our vigilance we ensure that every half term we have fire drills and ingress drills at various times to ensure all are aware what to do in an emergency. These drills are almost always when there are no parents on site however if you are collecting a child or are on site for any reason then please follow the procedures below. Thank you.

- **Fire Drill** You will hear an alarm (a constant fire bell). The muster points for the school are in the back yard so please head there.
- Ingress Drill You may hear a claxon if the children are outside but if it is an indoor practice you will not hear anything. You will however note that all doors are locked



and all blinds closed and the Office is empty. If you come across this situation we ask you kindly to leave the site promptly and return after 15 minutes.

Finally, no fire drills are planned for these times so if the fire alarm does sound please leave by the rear doors of the Sports Hall and muster on the back playground.

Nursery Intakes

Children born between 1 January 2020 and 31 March 2020 can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week Nursery education from April 2023.



Children born between 1 April 2020 and 31 August 2020 can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week from September 2023.

Children born between 1 September 2020 and 31 December 2020 can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week from January 2024.

If you know of any children with birth dates between these times and would like their child to come to this school, then please ask them to get in touch with the School Office as soon as possible.


anyway there is no need for different clothing on these days. The ones for this half term are Thursday 16^{th} and Friday 17^{th} February.

Social Media

We continue to strongly urge you to please keep your child away from social media apps. They have a minimum legal age for a reason. These apps can cause upset when being used at such a young age and children can type things out of context and without thinking that can cause upset and also could haunt them in later life as once posted the messages are always there.

Please note: Social media sites have a legal MINIMUM age for a reason, children's brains are not mature enough to understand texts out of context or share things that are inappropriate.

We strongly urge you not to let your children use these sites.



Please protect their childhood and innocence. There is a minimum age for a reason. Please blame the school and if they say "Everyone is on them" then that is certainly not true!

QR Codes

QR stands for 'quick response'. QR Codes, if you don't know, are those funny black and white boxes you see in newspapers and magazines such as the image alongside. These are placed within this newsletter at relevant points to give you quick access to websites mentioned. All you have to do is install a free QR code reader to your phone/tablet, just search the App/Play

Store using 'QR', and simply scan the code or you can just use your camera with more modern phones.
