Dear Parents/Carers

Welcome to the last school newsletter of the current academic year.

What a busy and action-packed year it has been! The enthusiasm and hard work from pupils and staff alike deployed consistently over the year makes my job easy and makes me very proud. I would like to thank each and every one of them for making this school such a special one. Indeed, we have had a swathe of visitors recently including the new Senior Adviser, KS2 SAT Moderators, the Youth Club chairperson and many more. Industrial Action

The industrial action we have seen this term sadly continues as the Government refused to re-open negotiations with the teaching Unions. The strike affects members of the National Education Union which is most of the teaching staff, other Unions will become involved in the autumn if no progress has been made. The next strikes are on Wednesday and Friday this week (the 5th and 7th July). **As a result, all classes apart from Nursery are closed.**

The school is open only to those groups we have been told to prioritise with low levels of staff. This time we are unable to open to Year 2 and Year 6 but can, on limited staffing, be open to benefits eligible free school meal children, looked after children, children with an Education Health Care Plan and those registered as essential worker children.

If your child falls into any of these groups you will have received a text on Thursday 22nd June informing you of this. In addition, the County coding competition and a LKS2 football competitions are on Friday 7th July so the teams will be attending on that day. All other activities on the Wednesday and Friday have had to be re-scheduled so please note the dates page on the back of the newsletter.

Let us all hope however that the dispute is resolved as soon as possible for everyone's benefit.



School Budget Pressures

The high rates of inflation that we all are very aware of effect schools as well. We have seen huge prices, particularly in gas and electricity (e.g. the school spent less that £9,000 on gas 2 years ago and is forecast to spend over £51,000 in this financial year) as well as increases in pay coming from budget allocations. The Government is saying schools have not been better funded but on the flip side they have never faced the costs they face now and the funding nowhere near matches the shortfall.

We are consistently analysing what we do and are trying our utmost to ensure any financial demands on our parental community are at the minimum they can possibly be.

Now more than ever we need your support in ensuring no reading books are lost or damaged, if they are we ask you to pay for their replacement. Anything that is broken as a result of a non-accident we will also have to chase payment for as we simply have no additional funds, all budget lines are cut to the minimum.

Impact of Rising Costs

Following on from the above there are some areas that will impact families, unfortunately the budget cannot subsidise losses on care services or meals even if we had the funds to do so.

The charge for extended services has been £3.50 an hour for many years (schools in the locality all charge £5 per hour) and we have tried to maintain that. Increased labour and food costs have no longer made this price viable and we are going to have to raise the cost from September to £4 an hour. The cost is still way below rates in other schools and almost half that of some private providers so still provides value for money.

This price increase will affect Breakfast Club where the cost will be £4.50 from 7.30 and £4 from 8am and Beckstone Xtra where the cost will be £4 per hour from 3.15pm until 5.15pm.

After school clubs are also subject to the increase in costs (additional labour charges, heating & lighting etc) and the cost for an after school clubs will rise to £2.50 a session from September. This charge applies half termly to each club apart from those related to revision for statutory tests or sports practises for competitions.

Finally, the school's caterer has met with the school and have said the increased food inflation has left them no option but to increase their per meal charge. We have tried our hardest to negotiate a minimum acceptable rise for both sides. This will result in paid meals rising to £2.90 per day or £14.50 per week. The price of meals is still less than the Workington schools average of £3.00 so we are still doing our best to ensure our families

receive value for money. In turn the cost of a Nursery meal will rise to £2.20 a day.



Respect

Following the article in last month's newsletter there have been no incidents of disrespect to staff and all, communications have been pleasant and professional, just as they should be. As stated last month we all want what is best for your child on both sides and are striving hard to ensure we support your child and in turn you support the school in its endeavours.

We are aware that life is busy and payments can be forgotten. Please settle your account quickly if you are contacted about any debts and please settle with good grace. This is particularly acute at this time of year as financial regulations mean we have to ensure all accounts are finalised and balanced at the end of the school year. **Please make sure your account is settled before the end of term.** Within the last 12 months we have had some disrespectful instances with some parents who have not paid and we don't want any repeat of that as it is upsetting for our staff.

WhatsApp Parent Groups

We are finding that social media is often used to air grievances about school decisions and protocols when reasons for these decisions are multi-faceted and are always underpinned by having the best interests of children and families at their heart or been driven by external circumstances beyond our control e.g. the weather.

If you are on group WhatsApp concerning school it may be beneficial to scroll through messages and check if any positive messages are being shared otherwise the group is in danger of becoming a platform that is feeding on negativity.

On platforms such as WhatsApp staff at school have no recourse to address issues. When staff hear about the content of such messages (which they generally do) it is really upsetting when they are working so hard at school for many hours at home to provide the best education they can, especially at a time when Government and media support is sadly lacking.



Teaching is an extremely demanding yet incredible and rewarding job. Our staff are committed to supporting the community they serve. Please support them by talking directly to us if you have an issue rather than resorting to social media.

Organisation 2023/24



A lot of thought has gone into classes for next year. Friendship groups as well as grouping children who work well together have been the driving force behind the class compositions. It is important you support your child in their transition to their new class **and be positive** about their placement. Classes are full so there is no 'wiggle room' and no movement across classes. Do let your child settle into their new class and please be assured that we always strive to make sure your child is happy in school and in their class.

Please do not appeal against their placement.

A lot of thought has also gone into how the school is organised as the intake of a class and a half (45 pupils in general does not make for easy class groupings or straight year groups across the school).

The school is organised into 4 Stages with Stage Leaders meeting weekly and reporting back to their Stages to ensure consistency of approach and ongoing review and evaluation of the effectiveness of school policies and procedures. The Senior Leadership Team is as follows from September:

Where there are mixed age classes these are being set up as mixed ability classes and not based on academic ability so are certainly not 'sets'. Indeed, the reasoning underpinning the class structure for next year is likely to be discussed at the Curriculum Evening (see below).

Your child's class will have already been shared with them if they are in Years N to 2 to fully comply with the Early Years Framework transition arrangements. All other children will visit their new classes on Thursday 13th July and again on Friday 14th July. Again, please do not appeal against their placement. Please rest assured that children's friendships have been closely considered and that school staff will have placed

children well to ensure they can make maximum progress.

Curriculum Evening & Reports

There are 'Curriculum Meetings' on the last Monday of this term (Monday 17th July). Please make a note in your diary. We expect an adult from every family to attend so that you can meet your child's new teacher, learn about their areas of study in 2023/24 and what is expected from them and from yourselves as well as see your child's new room so you can picture them in it. Your child's end of year report will be issued at the end of these meetings on Tapestry/Seesaw.

A big congratulations needs to go to the Key Stage 1 children who had a phonics screening check recently. We are very proud of the progress they have made and the school achieved

a **pass rate of 82%**, just above last year's national average and an improvement from last year's school outcome.

Key Stage 1:

There will be a comparative breakdown of data along with your child's report in Key Stage 1. This is the last year they are statutory and will be reported in this manner. Going forward KS1 tests are optional and are for use to moderate teacher assessment judgements only.

Year 4 Times Table Check:



Comparative data for this test is not published. The Government released the results last week and 32% of the Year group got 100% of the questions correct and 54% got over 20 out of 25. Both of these figures are higher than

last year!

Key Stage 2

Unfortunately we are unable to release any end of Key Stage 2 outcomes until the Department for Education release them on the 11th July. These will be reported to Y6 parents in the end of year report and available on our school web site soon after. The results this year will be affected by 2 children who were absent for the tests and in Government data these count as 'fails' so we are already 5% down before they are released. **Please do not take your children out of school at SAT time as this really places not only them but also the school at a great disadvantage.**

Summer Camp

It is not long until the Summer Camp starts.

The camp runs for the first 2 days and 2 weeks of the Summer holidays and the last 2 weeks.

Debbie Cook, our Educational Support Manager has trained to be a 'Domestic Violence Champion' and is a resource available to any adult who would like to confidentially share incidents with her and is a very good source of advice. Just contact the School Office to get in touch with her.

Domestic violence is on the increase and causes terrible harm to victims and the associated children.

It is everyone's responsibility to ensure it is eradicated. We are working closely with the Police and the school will learn of any incidents to support any children whose lives are affected by such an occurrence.

Keeping Your Child Safe

We do a lot in school to support your child in keeping themselves safe through assemblies, circle times, Kidsafe etc. Please support us by regularly talking to your child about...

- What to do if they were expecting someone to collect them and they are not there or if they have gone home and no-one is there...please tell them to return to school. School is a place of safety, there will always be someone there and we will sort things out from them.

With summer holidays on the horizon please also talk to them about the following:

- Keeping safe from strangers. Explain to your child never to go with anyone they don't know. If they feel scared to go into the nearest shop and ask them to phone you (make sure they have your number) or have a phone with them if they are out and about.
- Keeping safe near roads, with warm and light nights they may be playing out on school days but also during the day in the summer holidays. Please instil



into them the Highway Code and NEVER to run into a road after footballs etc.

- Not to go near railway lines. The West Coast line has had a number of incidents with children getting injured. Please ensure they know to keep well away.
- Finally, please ensure they are safe online. We continue to have to deal with issues that have resulted from children using social media sites that quite simply they are accessing illegally. Please have a good look at the chart below and ENFORCE it for your child's safety and their mental health and to preserve their innocent childhood years:

Reminder - Helping with Living Costs



Everyone at Beckstone Primary School is doing their best looking at ways we can help support financial pressures on families during the cost of living crisis. We have been limiting non-uniform days, dress up days, Christmas fair, subsidising school trips and offering free second-hand uniform to children as and when required.

The Government have issued a 'Food Poverty Grant' to all schools to be used at their own discretion. At Beckstone we looked at the best way of using these limited funds and we decided we wanted to support and help children's nutrition. We are doing this by offering the following from NOW until the end of the school year.

- free fruit to all children
- free fruit and snacks to children in Nursery and Reception provide KS2 children with a FREE school meal on a Monday at no cost to the parent

Sadly, there is no further government funding to support this initiative so the 'free' items listed above will no longer be free from September apart from fruit for the children in EY and KS1.

Food & Drink



- **School Meals** from September will cost £14.50 per week (£2.90 a day) payable on ParentPay. This is still great value when you look at prices of goods in supermarkets for packed lunches.



- **Milk** is vital for growing children as it strengthens bones and teeth. Children in Reception and Nursery are entitled to free milk as are children who are eligible for free school meals and clothing vouchers (not the universal free meal for all FS & KS1 children). The cost of milk for the first half of the autumn term is **£9.00** and needs to be paid by **Friday, 8th September 2023** via ParentPay NOT cash or cheque. Due to the administrative burden of checking attendance and the inability to change the order daily unfortunately milk money cannot be refunded for absence.



- Snack money for Nursery and Reception is **£14** for next half term.



- Fruit is **£9.00** for the autumn term.

Beckstone's Extended Services

Our extended services include the Breakfast Club (£4.00 from 7.30am, £3.50 from 8am) Last entry is at 8.30am; Educare (our popular afternoon child care provision for morning Nursery children – see table at the top of the next page – please note these places **MUST BE BOOKED IN ADVANCE**) with pick up times at 2.15pm and 3.15pm Please note that unfortunately we are unable to offer facilities for packed lunches for Nursery children.

However, these should be rare events as prompt regular attendance will really help your child do well at school.

Planning holidays in term time is to the detriment of your child's education.

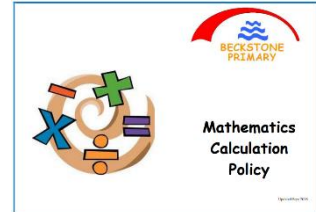

Calculation Policy

The school has a detailed calculation policy that reflects the National Curriculum as well as the methods taught in school for calculation.

The relevant sections for your child will be shared at the Curriculum meeting on Monday 18th July with your child's new teacher.



Perhaps use it to dip into and help your child with Maths over the summer to prepare them for their next class.

Holiday Homework

Your child will receive some basic skills tasks to learn in readiness for their new curriculum year before the end of term. Please help them ensure they have the necessary skills to make a success of their next school year.



The most important homework of all is to **ensure you read with your child for at least 20 minutes daily** or ensure their day is structured to allow them to, read on their own, when they are able for sustained periods. Indeed reading to your child at bed time for example is also extremely valuable. The world of books will develop your child's imagination, vocabulary and knowledge of the world around them. It is quite simply the key to learning!

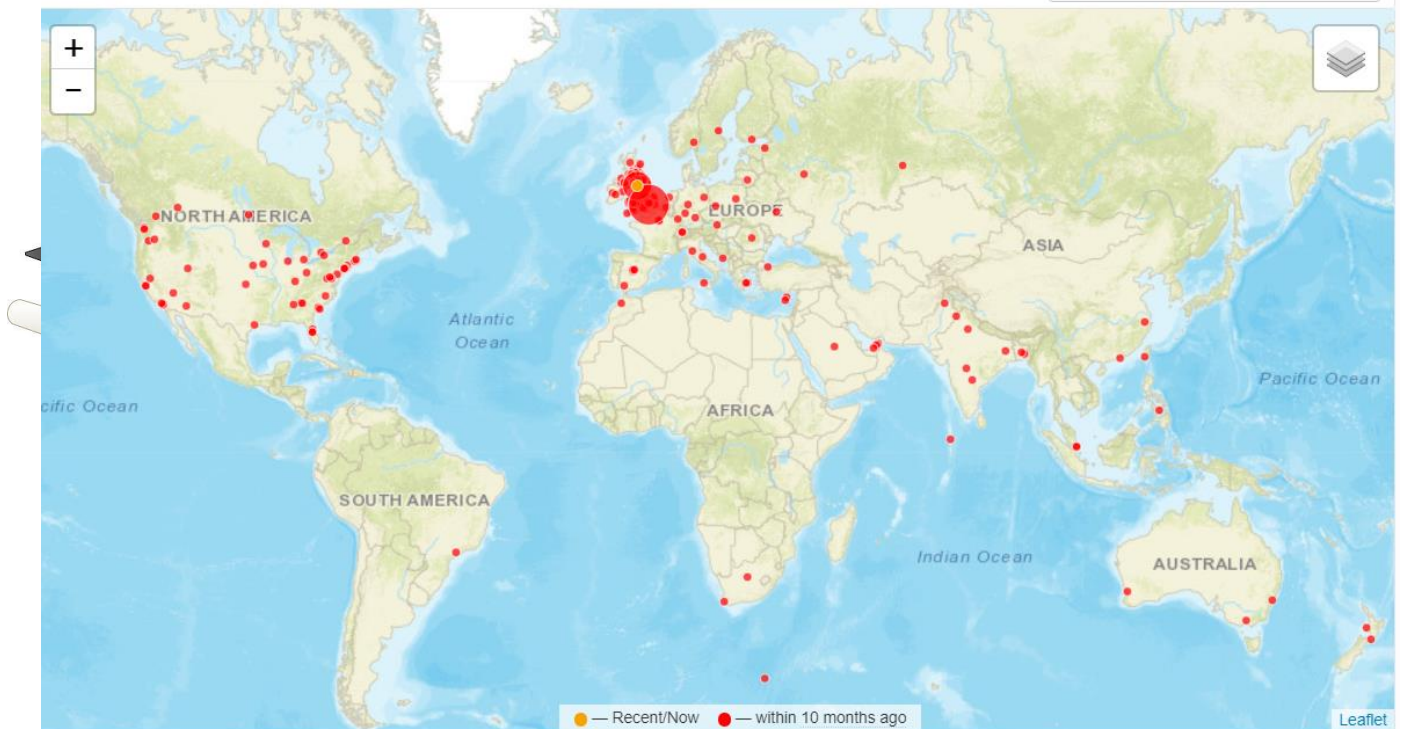

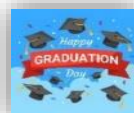
