Y1 -Y6 Meet the Teacher -Wellbeing & Progress Update

We hope you found the recent round of parents' evenings useful and informative.

It is very important school and home keep in close touch to support the development of each child.

Following on from those evenings however the Governors have reaffirmed the school policy of only one appointment per child unless there has been domestic violence (the school is informed of these cases by the Police). The reasons for this are twofold...the main one is it is important the child sees that both parents are working together to support them (there was very positive feedback from pupils whose split parents came together). A second reason is teacher workload, it is simply untenable for teachers to have more than 30 appoinments over the times of the evenings. This policy was breached at the recent evenings and this cannot happen again. If there are multiple appointments made then they all will be cancelled. Please can split families agree to come together for the benefit of their child(ren) next time.

Teachers have been chasing up parents who didn't attend the nights. If you still haven't spoken about your child's progress please contact school.

Remembrance Day

Like last year we are hoping to decorate the school hill with poppies and weather permitting have the whole school out on the hill for the silence at 11am on Friday 11th November. 


Remembrance Parade

Chair of Governors' Blog

Hi,

Firstly, I would like to welcome everyone back to a new school year and welcome the new pupils, parents and staff who have recently joined us.

We held our Governor Annual General Meeting on October 18th; in this meeting we agree Governor appointments and discuss our governing plans for the school year. We discussed multiple topics with varying feedback, some exciting success stories, and some disappointing stories.

I wanted to use this blog as an opportunity to keep you informed of topical issues and to share our thoughts on the feedback we received.

Governing Body: It saddens me to say we received confirmation that one Governor will be leaving the governing body with immediate effect and one Governor will not be renewing their term next May. Both individuals have selflessly supported the school for several years and will be greatly missed. We did however make some changes to the structure of the body to make sure its operation is successful for years to come. It is exciting to see existing governors taking up positions to support the school, as we rely on volunteers sharing their spare time.

School Performance: We reviewed the academic performance of pupils at Beckstone; in most measures we have very good performance often exceeding national average. However, on one or two measures we have unfortunately slipped below the national average due to the impact of Covid 19 lockdowns. I am pleased to report that the school has already implemented improvement plans in these areas to ensure all our pupils succeed.

One measure where we dropped below is a measure over which the school has no control: school attendance scores, with us now sitting below the national average. We understand some non-attendance days are unavoidable, but others are. Evidence is readily available to support the notion that reduced time in education has a direct impact on educational outcomes. The Governors would ask you consider this when planning term time breaks.

Behaviours: We received feedback from the results of the recent parents evening with positive comments on the pupils returning and transitioning through the school. We have had some of our emergency arrangements reviewed by external people and they have commented on how well the pupils respond to things like fire drills. We did however spend some time discussing some difficult conversations which have occurred between school staff and a small minority of parents. Some instances have occurred where staff members have been verbally abused. This can't be right......

The school has set policies and rules, and, in most cases, these are well supported, and we thank you for this. When not supported the school needs to intervene to ensure fairness and consistency. The governing body fully supports the staff in ensuring policies and rules in the school are adhered to. If you have a concern with the way something is being handled, please refer to the complaints policy as the process is available for you to use.

Funding: We are all aware of and feeling the impact of ever-increasing material, food, and energy costs. The school is no different and the budget is causing sleepless nights for the leadership team. The school staff and the Governors want every pupil to have a fulfilling and enjoyable education. We are however mindful that some planned events bring additional costs to families, we have therefore agreed to scale back on some of these things. We are still balancing this against the pupils having exciting experiences while at school.

Takeover Morning

The Children's Commissioner encourages schools to allow its pupils to 'run' their establishments to give a taster of responsibility and accountability. These sessions give Y6 children an exciting insight into the working life of adults at the

Food & Drink



School meals cost £13.50 per week (£2.70 a day) payable on ParentPay. This still represents good value when you look at prices of goods in supermarkets for packed lunches.

The meals menu for next half term is on the next page. The menu has resulted from discussions with the School Council. Lots of their ideas have been taken on board, a summary of their discussions is below.

In addition to these choices there are also jacket potatoes and sandwiches on regularly as additional choices.

There will also be vegetarian options including beans on toast, mac and cheese, Quorn sausages or chicken etc.

 Milk is vital for growing children as it strengthens bones and teeth. Children in Reception and Nursery are entitled to free milk as

are children who are eligible for free school meals and clothing vouchers (not the universal free meal for all FS & KS1 children). The cost of milk for next half term



is £9.50 and needs to be paid by THIS Friday, 4th November via ParentPay NOT cash or cheque. If you need help with this please see the School Office. Due to the administrative burden of checking attendance and the inability to change the order daily unfortunately milk money cannot be refunded for absence.



 Snack money for Nursery and Reception is also paid by ParentPay and is due also by THIS Friday, 4th November, the cost is £13 for next half term.




 Fruit tuck shop money from Year 1 up is also paid this way, £9 for next half term by THIS Friday 4th November.





Reading with Your Child

We want to promote 'Share a book every day' with children at home with their family and friends.



it can be a time for closeness, laughing and talking together and it can also help your child to become a lifelong reader and have a love of books.

There is no right or wrong way of doing it and it is never too early to start reading to your child

Tips for sharing a book

- Try and find somewhere away from noise and television and make sure you are not using your mobile phone
- Make sure you take time to look and talk about the pictures on the pages
- If your baby chews books to start with, it doesn't matter. They will soon enjoy helping you to turn the pages
- The use of sound effects for example animal noises will help to bring the story to life and make you both laugh
- Encourage family members such as siblings to join in and share a book with your child
- For older children, ask some questions when reading together, for example; what can you see on this page? How do you think Goldilocks felt when she saw the bears? What do you think is going to happen next?

- As your child's language develops encourage your child to tell the story. They can read the pictures to you and talk about what's happening on the page
- If you think you are not a brilliant reader it doesn't matter because just hearing and listening to your voice is comforting for your child.

How to read aloud to older children

1. Keep it fun

Reading shouldn't be a chore! When children's experiences are pleasant they are more likely to develop a life-long love of reading

2. Read with energy

Use lots of energy! Using facial expressions and emotion: different voices for different characters; and varying the tempo and volume that you read with will help to create an immersive storytelling experience your children will love.

3. Ask questions

Asking questions as you read can improve understanding and get the child to be an active participant in the reading experience

4. Explain as you go

Explaining what is happening on the pages and allowing time to talk about it as you go through the book can deepen your child's understanding and expand their vocabulary

5. Point out words

Pointing out words can really help younger children when it comes to learning to read. Scanning from left to right, as well as showing what a letter and a word is, has been shown to help develop advanced reading skills.

6. Look at the pictures/illustrations in the book Talking about the pictures in the book is just as important as reading the words


7. Get them to read along with you

This would work especially well with your favourite rhyming books that you have read so many times with them that they can remember parts

8. Reread the same book

This is linked to the above point as it will give them the confidence to join in and helps build fluency and a better understanding of rhythm and language

Encourage the child to retell the story to you
 When they are confident with the story see if they
 can recite parts of it to you or someone else on
 their own. This will improve their confidence and
 help develop their memory and speaking skills.

Winter, Covid Guidance & Heating

The current Government guidance to schools is very clear that they should be well ventilated and have windows open at break and lunchtimes to ensure a free flow of air. There are of course some issues that arise from this guidance once the air temperature outside falls.

Firstly, the school will naturally be colder than normal



so it is perhaps prudent for your child to wear a vest or T-shirt under their usual uniform. We are allowing children to wear navy fleeces on top of their uniform in class for added warmth if needed. Ones with a school logo on can be ordered

Coats

Free revision classes for Year 6 children now take place weekly on Wednesday at 8.15 – 8.45 and Wednesday lunchtime 12.15 – 12.45. The timings were changed due to concerns from a couple of parents that the cost of putting siblings into Breakfast Club was costly for a lot of families. We looked at various different options but due to small number of staff being onsite around 8.15am we could not offer another service for the siblings and did not have capacity in Breakfast Club. Y6 pupils have the choice to attend either club.

Safeguarding/Child Protection

Full details on the county's policies, procedures and processes with regard to safeguarding plus analysis of outcomes of serious case reviews can be accessed through the Cumbria LSCB website at

www.cumbrialscb.com the site also has a parental information zone.

In addition to the above the school has a 'Safeguarding Zone' on its website which contains the above link as well as relevant school policies, further information and a diagram showing how we keep your child safe in school. It is well worth a look.



Sharing information is in the best interests of children and their safeguarding. The school reserves the right to share and receive information from other agencies that may have had dealings with your child.

If you ever have any concerns about the safety or wellbeing of a child, then you can ring your concerns through to the County's 24 hour 'Safeguarding Hub' number and you can remain anonymous if you wish. Callers can outline their concerns and the Safeguarding Hub will give advice (consultation) and if necessary undertake an assessment of need.



There is now also an adult NSPCC helpline where any concerned adult can seek advice if they are concerned about a child and would like advice on whether to make a referral. The number to call is

Domestic Violence

Debbie Cook, our Educational Support Manager has trained to be a 'Domestic Violence

Champion' and is a resource available to any adult who would like to confidentially share incidents with her and is a very good source of advice. Just contact the School Office to get in touch with her.

Domestic violence is on the increase and causes terrible harm to victims and the associated children.

It is everyone's responsibility to ensure it is eradicated. We are working closely with the Police and the school will learn of any incidents to support any children whose lives are affected by such an occurrence.

Nursery Intakes

Children born between 1 September 2019 and 31 December 2019 can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week from January 2023.

Children born between 1 January 2020 and 31 March 2020 can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week Nursery education from April 2023.

Children born between 1 April 2020 and 31 August 2020 can receive their free 15 or 30

hours a week from **September 2023**.

If you know of any children with birth dates between these times and would like their child to

come to this school, then please ask them to get in touch with the School Office <u>as soon as possible.</u>

Forms for applying for any of these intakes can be downloaded from the Cumbria County Council website

Beckstone's Extended Services



Our extended services include the Breakfast Club (£4.00 from 7.30am, £3.50 from 8am) Last entry is at 8.30am; Educare (our

popular afternoon child care provision for morning Nursery children – see table at the top of the next page – please note these places **MUST BE BOOKED IN ADVANCE**) with pick up times at 2.15pm and 3.15pm Please note that unfortunately we are unable to offer facilities for packed lunches for Nursery children.

Beckstone Xtra (again £3.50 an hour) runs from the end of the school day until 5.15pm with an earlier pick up time of 4.15pm if required. Beckstone Xtra is available from 3.15 to 5.15pm for anyone who books in advance via

Carer & Toddler Club

This runs every Thursday afternoon from 1.30 to 3pm and is a very popular club. It is a great way to meet new friends. There is no cost to join but a £3.00 levy is charged to cover the cost of refreshments etc.



The prices for our extended services are extremely competitive to support families in these difficult economic times. The price per hour is only £3.50. This is very good value and an extremely competitive rate for child care.



There have been some families not paying for extended services and building up a debt. At a recent meeting the Governors were shocked at this and agreed this should not be happening and non-payment will result in the immediate withdrawal of the service until debts are settled. As was noted people would not do this with e.g. with their hairdresser after their hair was cut. If you order a service then it needs to be paid. It was also shared that school chasing debts was portrayed on social media as a negative — this was felt totally inappropriate and any posts should be taken down as they were grossly unfair.

Attendance



It is of the utmost importance to your child's education that they attend school consistently as learning is planned in a progressive way and one day follows on from the next in each subject. Of course there will be

times when a child is too poorly to come to school or they have to isolate (the latter does not count as an absence on their attendance records). However these should be **rare events** as prompt regular attendance will really help your child do well at school. **Planning holidays in term time is to the detriment of your child's education**.

Herbs

The herbs are sheltering for the winter and will return in the Soring. A very big 'Thank Yu' goes to Mrs Susan Murray who cultivates and looks after them.





Term Time Holidays & Tests

There is active discouragement of taking holidays in term time as it disrupts a child's learning - see


