### 2022-23 Procedures & Organisation

Please can all parents note the following:

#### Start of the Day

- The school gates open to all year groups from 8.45am daily. Please can all parents ensure the **punctuality** of their child(ren). The start of the day procedures will be the same as the end of last term including hand washing for KS1 & KS2. KS1 to line up the hill and KS2 to line up at the back.
- EY Drop Off Arrangements change from last term today with all EY parents going through the Nursery gate, dropping their children off and exiting through the Reception gate.
- School must be notified before the start of the day of any absence. Registers are checked first thing and families are contacted if there is an unexplained absence. If no response from families is forthcoming then the Police will be contacted.

#### School Uniform

All children MUST be in school uniform. Full details about our uniform are on our web site but in a nutshell The uniform consists of:

- School or dark blue sweat shirt, school or dark blue fleece, school or light blue polo shirt
- Grey or black tailored trousers or knee length skirts
   (not exectly trousers LINE ESS)

(not sports trousers/tracksuit trousers UNLESS it is a PE day)

- Dark deck shorts or blue gingham or pinafore dresses
- Low heeled footwear, shoes or trainers. These need to be black with no promotional logos.

The various items of uniform are modelled below.

The school now has a well-stocked set of good quality used uniforms that are available FREE to any family that would like to use this service. Please see the details on the poster on the top of the next page if you would like to use this service. Uniforms can be collected from the School Office.

A BIG thank you goes to the School Governors who have proactively set up this service and to the Laundry Studio who have cleaned all donations free of charge!







Please note that <u>only natural hair colours</u> are allowed and the only jewellery allowed are stud earrings (which have to be covered for PE) and watches.

**PE Kits** - Your child can come in PE Kit on 2 days a week from KS1 up...school or light blue T shirt (NOT football tops or branded sportswear), leggings or tracksuit trousers. They MUST wear a school uniform sweatshirt or cardigan on top unless it is a non-uniform day and black trainers. Your child will need plimsolls and shorts that can be left in their locker.

EY children will need to have their PE Kit in school as they will learn to change too (a life skill). Their PE Kit is a light blue T shirt and black shorts plus plimsolls.

#### Free school meals and clothing grant

£500,000 worth of additional funding has been allocated to the school clothing grant fund as part of a new £2m cost of living reserve fund. This means that eligible parents will now receive a clothing grant worth £50 for each primary school child, up from £25, and £100 for each secondary school child, up from £35.

If you're eligible, make sure you apply for free school meals if you haven't already so that you receive your school clothing grant too. It only takes 5 minutes.

To apply then follow this link or the QR code. Once completed the system will let you know if you are eligible.

Food & Drink



• School meals cost £13.50 per week (£2.70 a day) payable on ParentPay. This still represents good value when

you look at prices of goods in superarkets for packed lunches.

The meals menu for this half term is on the page after next. There are loads of choices so your child should always find something they like.

 Milk is vital for growing children as it strengthens bones and teeth. Children in Reception and Nursery are entitled to free milk as

are children who are eligible for free school meals and clothing vouchers (not the universal free meal for all FS & KS1 children). The cost of milk for this half term

- Snack money for Nursery and Reception is also paid by ParentPay and is due by the same Friday, 9<sup>th</sup> September, the cost is £13 for this half term and is payable by THIS Friday 9<sup>th</sup> September.
- Fruit tuck shop money from Year 1 up is also paid this way, £7 for the first half term by THIS Friday 9<sup>th</sup> September



#### End of Day


All classes will finish at 3.15pm with EY classes to be collected from Nursey Yard / Reception Garden & KS1 classes to be collected from the front yard. KS2 children

#### **Free School Meals Application**

Eligibility for Free Meals brings other benefits such as a uniform grant, free milk, free instrumental hire and also provides the school with additional funding. Eligibility criteria:

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- **Income Support** •
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance •
- income-related Employment and Support • Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and • Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit ٠
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after • you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April • 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)



We ask that ALL ELIGIBLE PARENTS OF PUPILS FROM **NEXT YEAR'S RECEPTION UP TO** YEAR 6 fill in the school meals

#### **School Payments & Politeness**

As mentioned earlier there is a squeeze on everyone's finances, this includes school where the budget is under immense pressure from a rise in gas bills (391%) to having many other immense budgetary pressures.

At the end of last term there were some unpaid balances from the use of our extended services. No business would allow services to be taken without payment and this applies to schools too. Despite reminders there are still some outstanding balances and we will have to

prevent access to services for those that have taken the service and not paid.

What is concerning is that there has been some impolite phone calls with office staff which is not acceptable as they have been instructed to chase up debts and it is not their



fault an individual has used a service and not paid, the responsibility is with that individual.. On top of this there has apparently been some abusive posts in some parents' online social media groups complaining that the school was chasing up debts as well as some unsubstantiated and false information which as well as being shocking is also not acceptable.

If there is an issue with the school then the headteacher &/or Governors should be contacted in the first instance to resolve any issues. We insist that the school should not be portrayed in a bad light on social media.

As times get harder please can all maintain politeness towards staff at ALL times, in person, on the phone or on social media.

#### Playground Safety



In order to ensure everyone's safety please can we remind all families that dogs are not allowed on site. In addition scooters or bikes should also not be used in the playground areas of the school.

PLEASE CLOSE For the safety of all our children THE CATE please can Nursery parents who collect their children at various times from lunchtime



onwards please ensure they close the playground gate as they go in and when the leave.

Thank you for your co-operation in these matters.

#### Social Media & Parents

If you have an issue with the school then please do not air it on social media but discuss it with school. The school staff are a welcoming and supportive group of people who will do their utmost to resolve any concern you may have.

In addition please do not name any children in any posts or indeed share images of children who are not your own either from your own camera or from our learning platforms, Seesaw and Tapestry.



#### <u>Coats</u>

We will soon be asking all children to wear their coats at lunchtimes and



playtimes. We have an external thermometer and when the outside temperature drops below 13°C then coats are mandatory. Please ensure they come to school with a coat and **one that has their name in** – thanks!

#### <u>Asthma</u>

If your child needs an inhaler at school please ensure you have completed an '**Asthma Card**' at the School Office BEFORE the end of this week. It is a parents' responsibility to check the pumps are in date and not empty. It



is also advisable to write your child's name on using a permanent pen.



#### **Plasters**

If your child is allergic to plasters then please do let the School Office know. Plasters are effective in controlling bleeding and securing wounds from infection and they will be used for minor cuts and grazes unless you have let us know otherwise.

#### **Medicines**

The school will administer medicine only

when it is **4** times a day and has an <u>appropriate prescription sticker</u>. We will disinfectant wipe the bottles.



Please note that cough medicines/lozenges etc., <u>are not</u> <u>allowed unless they have been prescribed</u>. If you wish the school to administer medicine then you will need to complete a form available from the School Office.

#### Nasal Flu Jabs

Flu vaccinations will take place at school on Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> October for all years from Reception upwards. It is again particularly important all children get vaccinated this year so there is no confusion between flu and Covid symptoms and for health reasons as scientific research has shown that the body finds it hard to cope if trying to fight more than one viral infection at any one time.



It is a nasal spray vaccination (Fluenz Tetra®) and will not only help protect the children from getting flu but it also stops them spreading the disease to their family, carers and the wider population. As flu viruses change each year last year's

immunisation for those that had it will not be effective.

The vaccination is a nasal spray and is not painful. The school pupils have been brilliant at receiving it in recent years.

You will receive consent forms. PLEASE ENSURE THESE ARE RETURNED TO SCHOOL. The only

children who will be excluded are those where there is contra-indicated medical advice and there are very few this will apply to across the country.

Parents of younger children may like to know that children aged 2 upwards and also in Nursery can receive their free vaccination through their GP or Pharmacies. Harrington Pharmacy offers this service and is very handy for school.



Flu vaccinations for adults are also available on request at Pharmacies or large supermarkets for an average £10 fee.

#### Covid Update

Children and young people aged 0-18 testing positive: should stay at home for 3 days after testing positive for COVID-19 (with the day of the test being counted as day '0'). They can return to the setting on day 4 after



testing positive for COVID-19 as long as they do not have a high temperature and feel well enough to do so.

The current guidance to reduce transmission is shown below.

#### Term Time Holidays and the Law

The Government's policy of not allowing families to take holidays in term time and those that do being liable to prosecution and a fine is still in operation. We would like to ensure all families are aware of this law.

The Headteacher is not allowed to authorise absence and indeed any holiday absences in term time will be counted as 'unauthorised' (which equates to a truancy mark) and may be subject to a fixed penalty notice/fine.

Parents need to fill in a leave of absence form if their child is going to be missing from school (this is of vital

importance as the school immediately chases up any unknown absences on the day itself and if the child's whereabouts is not known then the Police are notified – this is school policy). Parents can apply for 'exceptional circumstances' on this form if they so wish. It is imperative that school knows where your child is for safeguarding reasons.



#### Term Time Holidays & Tests

There is active discouragement of taking holidays in term time as it disrupts a child's learning – see

article above. <u>Taking time off at the statutory testing</u> time needs to be avoided completely.

The key dates this school year are:

May – KS1 SATs Month Week beg. 8<sup>th</sup> May – KS2 SATs 3 weeks from week beg. 5<sup>th</sup> June – Y4 Times Table tests Week beg. 12<sup>th</sup> June – Y1 Phonics Screening Check

#### <u>Gurning</u>

Classes will be taking part in a 'Gurning' (face pulling) contest in the week beginning the 12<sup>th</sup> September culminating in a 'Gurn Off' final on Friday 16<sup>th</sup> September. The Gurning competition is an ancient local competition with the world championships held in Egremont at the 'Crab Fair' on Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> September.

### Preventing COVID-19 in education and childcare settings

- Everyone should wash their hands regularly, ideally with warm water and soap.
   E-bug resources can help younger children learning about bugs and hand washing.
- · Encourage use of tissues for coughs, sneezes and runny noses. Bin used tissues straight away.
- Keep indoor areas well ventilated.
- Support people to get any vaccines they are eligible for.
- Advise those testing positive to stay at home for the recommended period of time. If they have a high temperature (regardless of whether or not they have tested), they should stay at home until their temperature is back to normal.
- If someone tests positive for COVID-19, they should limit their contact with people who may be at greater risk (especially if they have a compromised immune system) for 10 days. Anyone with a high temperature should also avoid contact with people at greater risk.



#### Safeguarding/Child Protection

In addition to the above the school has a 'Safeguarding Zone' on its website which contains the above link as well as relevant school policies, further information and a diagram showing how we keep your child safe in school. It is well worth a look.



Sharing information is in the best interests of children and their safeguarding. The school reserves the right to share and receive information from other agencies that may have had dealings with your child.

If you ever have any concerns about the safety or wellbeing of a child, then


you can ring your concerns through to the County's 24 hour 'Safeguarding Hub' number and you can remain anonymous if you wish. Callers can outline their concerns and the Safeguarding Hub will give advice (consultation) and if necessary undertake an assessment of need.



There is now also an adult NSPCC helpline where any concerned adult can seek advice if they are concerned about a child and would like advice on whether to make a referral. The number to call is

#### **Domestic Violence**

Debbie Cook, our Educational Support Manager has trained to be a 'Domestic Violence



her and is a very good source of advice. Just contact the School Office to get in touch with her.

Domestic violence is on the increase and causes terrible harm to victims and the associated children.

It is everyone's responsibility to ensure it is eradicated. We are working closely with the Police and the school will learn of any incidents to support any children whose lives are affected by such an occurrence.



#### Social Media

The school often has to sort out all sorts of issues that spilled over from the use of social media by children out of school. Some of the issues are completely age inappropriate and there is a real concern that early use of social media is robbing children of their childhood and indeed innocence.

Social media sites have a legal MINIMUM age for a reason, children's brains are not mature enough to understand texts out of context or share things that are inappropriate. Whatever they post could haunt them for their rest of their lives. See the minimum ages here;

#### School Glossary

For new parents the following are terms you may see in this or other newsletters with their explanations!

**Nursery age** – Children are entitled to a 'free' 15 hours a week Nursery place starting from the term after their 3rd birthday. Depending on when a child is born they could spend up to 5 terms in the Nursery. Children are able to access our Educare service immediately on or after their 3rd birthday.

**Educare** – This is a service which is offered by the school for parents of children in the Nursery. Educare provides further Nursery provision up to the full school day. This can be purchased or accessed through the FREE 30 hours scheme set up by the Government. Parents need a registration code. Further details are available from the School Office. Alternatively Educare is also available at a very competitive cost, please see the costings listing on the next page. Child care vouchers from employers are also welcomed.

**Reception** – This is the school year after Nursery and before Year 1, the year in which a child has their  $5^{th}$  birthday.

**Foundation Stage or Early Years** – This is the first phase in a child's educational career and comprises of the Nursery and Reception years. Children in Reception will undergo a **Baseline Assessment** early in September which is a national assessment.

**Key Stage 1 (KS1)** – This is school Years 1 & 2. There is a nationally standardised test in phonics at the end of Year 1 (repeated in Year 2 if a child doesn't pass first time) and nationally standardised and locally moderated learning outcomes at the end of Year 2.

Year 1 Phonics Screening Check – This is a specific check on the progress of children in Year 1 in learning how to read. It is called the Year 1 Phonics Screening Check. The check is a list of 40 words that children read one-to-one with the teacher. Some of the words are real words that are likely to be known to the children. Some of the words are non-words which are aimed at helping test whether children are using only their knowledge of letter sounds to build up what the word says (and not other clues). Support for phonics and further information is available in the parent information zone of our web site.

This will take place in the **week beginning the 12<sup>th</sup>** June 2022.

**Key Stage 2 (KS2)** – This is school Years 3, 4, 5 & 6. There are ongoing summative assessments throughout these years and at the end of every year. At the end of year 6 the children are nationally tested (known as the SATs);

- In English there will be a national test in reading plus spelling, grammar and with writing being teacher assessed.
- In Maths (3 papers, one on arithmetic and 2 on mathematical reasoning) and on occasion
- Science (which is a national sample test)

On occasions KS2 may be subdivided into **LKS2** – Lower Key Stage 2 or Years 3 & 4 and *UKS2* – Upper key Stage 2 or Years 5 & 6.

**SATs** These take place at the end of Year 2 and Year 6. Results will be reported in the form of **raw scores** which is the sum of the marks awarded in the test and **scaled scores** where national data is analysed and the average raw score is awarded '100' which becomes the national average. Other raw scores are then scaled to give a number above or below this to compare outcomes with national averages. In addition the end of year report in these years will show whether or not your child has achieved the **nationally expected standard** i.e. the outcome as pre-determined by the Government for a 7 year or an 11 year old child. There is a lot of information about assessments and samples of end of year tests in the Revision zone of the web site. You will need to use the username: **bps** and the password **home**.

## The SAT test week for this school year is the week beginning the 8<sup>th</sup> May 2023.

Across the school your child will be assessed formatively i.e. as they go along to pinpoint future progress needs. Their assessment levels and progress will be communicated to you each term through a report and parents' meetings.

Year 4 Times Table Check This will take place in a 3 week window from the  $5^{\text{th}}$  June 2022. All children in year 4 will undergo a national times table speed challenge check. Please do help your children learn their times tables up to 12x12 off by heart.

If you know of any children with birth dates between these times and would like their child to come to this





#### **Road Safety in General**

In addition to the above please be careful with cars around all school exit routes. The zig zags on Church Road should be free

from cars at all start and end times of school to enable

clear areas for children to cross. Again we ask all who collect in cars NOT to park on the zig zags.

Finally please do park responsibly and do not block other's drives or use private parking facilities such as Wesleyan Court. Your help in this matter is much appreciated as it is the school that receives irate phone calls from local residents when such uncourteous parking takes place.

#### **Homework**



All classes give out weekly homework. This will be a blend of online work on Tapestry/Seesaw and on paper.

The work should always have been explained and discussed in class before coming home; it will consist of some English work, some Maths work (the calculation policy on our web site can help with this) and also a mix of times tables, spellings or phonics depending on where your child is in the school. Your child's teacher/Stage Leader will keep you informed about expectations and the nature of the homework. Please support your child if you can to complete these tasks by the due date, their response will be RAG rated on their report.

The most important homework of all though is **READING** – this is the key to everything and all



knowledge. It is so important for your child to read (or be read to) for at least 20 minutes a day. We would urge every parent to ensure this happens. As

explained above we need parents to check the understanding of the text they have read by asking pertinent questions about it. Below are some ideas to ensure this time is a useful learning experience -READING is the key to all learning and it is the main thing that parents can really do to support their child (ren) with their school work.

- \$ Reading together – sharing books and stories should be an enjoyable experience for you both. Choose a time that is suitable for both parent and child and choose books that appeal to the child.
- \$ Praise and encouragement are the most important words to remember. Make praise specific where possible.
- \$ Talking about books, authors, pictures, stories and characters is every bit as important as 'de-coding'. Take time to introduce the book before reading and ask questions about it afterwards e.g. 'How do you think Lucy felt when .....?'
- \$ The initial (first) letter sound of a word is often a good clue to an unfamiliar word. Take care when asking children

to sound out the letters in a word as they may not be successful.

- Encourage children to use the **meaning** of what they have read to guess an unknown word.
- B When your child gets stuck get them to read from the beginning of the sentence again to have another try or skip the word, go to the end of the sentence and come back for another try.
- B Have regular checks for understanding.
- Try to avoid too many interruptions. If the child says a different word to the printed word but it still makes sense then let them carry on and come back to it at the end of the page or paragraph.
- \$ If the child is making too many errors they may need a different book. As a rough guide, if the child is making about 1 error in every 10 words then the book is probably too hard.
- 6 Read to the child even when they can read for themselves, they benefit from hearing stories well-read and talking about them.
- Try reading alternate pages to add interest and to pick up the pace.
- Make it easy for children to practise reading take them to the library, buy them books of their own, swap comics and magazines with friends and look at the printed word all around e.g. posters on car journeys.
- \$ Let them see you reading sometimes...& enjoying it!
- \$ There is also a lot of information to help your child with reading in the 'Help Your Child to Read' zone on our web site.



Finally, as a reward for those reading at least 5 times a week at home they become eligible to be part of the fortnightly 'Strive for Five' draw (dates on back page). Each year group winner will receive a book and chocolate for the

parent(s) who have supported at home. Please use this as an incentive to read regularly with your child ©




'Circuits Days' will take place each half term this school year. They will be on a Thursday or a Friday


