#### The Curse of WhatsApp & Primary Pupils



WhatsApp has a minimum age of 16 as children do not have the maturity to use it effectively and have difficulty understanding messages out of context. This school, along with many over the country, have issues with parents allowing their children to use WhatsApp and then upset spilling into school. We are aware there are a number of pupil WhatsApp groups and there has already been upset in Year 5.



We are asking all parents to check their pupils' phones and delete WhatsApp. The school now has a policy that misuse of social media by pupils can result in immediate suspension which will go on your child's records so do take the action of deleting the app to prevent this happening and to keep your child safe.

#### **Internet Safety**




In a survey of our UKS2 pupils 100% said they would

not report inappropriate material that they had come across at home on the internet to their parents. This was a very worrying and concerning finding. When questioned on this the pupils said they would be scared that they would get in trouble. This is a large safeguarding concern.

We would urge parents to talk to their children that safety is paramount and is far more important than making inappropriate searches etc and that it is so important to report issues. If you have access to parental controls on your Wi-Fi or on your devices then please do ensure these are in place. You can download apps or software to computers that will help you to do this.

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

## 10 Incredible Benefits of Reading with Your Child

There are <u>so</u> many benefits of reading to and listening to your child read. It is one of the most special activities you can engage in. It is also one of the most important.

Research shows that children who are read to every day will have a 1<u>.4 million word</u> advantage over children who are not read to or read at home. So, what are the benefits of reading to your child every night or listening to them read?

## Vocabulary

Whether your child is reading a book about friends, sea creatures, or the adventures of an explorer, each book has its own set of vocabulary. Your child will be exposed to an endless array of genres and colourful language.

Children who are read to and who read have a far larger and more developed vocabulary than other children. This puts them at a huge advantage academically and will help them cope better at school.

## nowledge

Children are sponges, absorbing information from many sources during the first few years of their lives. In modern times, they learn from the television, internet, computer programmes, radio and other devices. And they learn from books. A lot.

Children who are read to tend to build a wide general knowledge and understanding of the world around them. They learn about different places, people, events and things.

Whether the stories are fiction or non-fiction, tales or information books, your children will learn a wide variety of concepts and ideas.

## Independent Reading

One of the benefits of parents reading with their children is that it encourages them to lead the themselves. Children learn from their parents before anyone else. If they see you reading, they will want to mimic you and learn to read as well. They will also experience the joy and fun of reading a story by listening to you and will want to learn to understand the words themselves.

## Writing skills

Reading improves language skills which in turn improves writing skills. Not only will your child understand correct sentence structure and be able to use parts of speech

correctly, but their increase in vocabulary will help them write creatively. Reading stimulates the imagination. Your child's writing will come alive when that imagination shows up in their stories.

## **Bonding time**

Is there anything better than snuggling together on the couch or tucking your child into bed with a mand book?

The time you spend together is precious and priceless. The time you spend together is precious and priceless. The process of reading to your child or listening to them read is a bonding experience that they will look forward to daily. They will appreciate and feel closer to you because of your effort and undivided attention.



## Concentration

When children listen to and read stories, they increase their ability to concentrate on what they are hearing. As they become enthralled in the details of a story, they push themselves to listen a little longer, thus increasing their attention span over time.

Reading can lengthen a child's overall concentration span. This spills over into other areas and helps them perform better at school and when working on activities. Sometimes it can seem as through a child has a long attention span as they are able

Sometimes it can seem as through a child has a long attention span as they are able to watch movies and TV programmes for hours.

Watching images flashing at a pace unnatural to the brain is not focusing. It is more like a trance and many children who watch hours of television struggle to concentrate in class.

Unlike watching screens, which negatively affects the brain, reading stimulates real focus.



## Listening Skills

The ability to listen is one of the most vital skills for success at school. Unfortunately, it is also a skill many children struggle with.

When you read to a child or they read and talk about their book to you, they are actively listening for your answers or details of the story. Doing this for a few minutes every day will have a massive impact on their overall listening ability and help them concentrate better at school and at home!

## Stress Relief

Reading is a calming activity and one that many adults engage in for relaxation. Some do it for stimulation and to learn, others just to relax and escape.

While using devices and watching screens before bed has been proven to negatively affect sleep, reading a book does the opposite. It calms the mind and is a healthy bedtime habit.

After a busy, active day, children look forward to reading their book or listening to a story, often. drifting off to sleep mid-story

These are great for developing your child's imagination and creativity. Creativity is one of the most necessary qualities for today's children living in a world far different from what their grandparents imagined it would be

There are so many benefits of reading books to children. If you make it a priority and find the time to do it every day, you'll be giving your children so many experiences and wonderful memories to look back on.

## Love of Reading

One of the great benefits of reading together every day is that you are forming a habit – a healthy habit – from a very young age.

Children who are surrounded by books grow into adults who read.

Quite simply, reading to your children and surrounding them with books will develop a lifelong love of reading. Reading will become a part of who they are and a routine activity that they look forward to every day.

Long after finishing school, your child will continue to learn, whether for business, pleasure or research, through books and online reading.

The Governing Body (pictured alongside) currently has 2 co-opted vacancies. They have plans to approach some community groups so there is representation from all areas of the school community on the Governing Body.

There is concern from Governors about the vehicles that are not recognising the School Crossing Patrol Officer on the Main Road and not stopping. They are writing to the Council to ask for a body camera so those not obeying traffic laws can be caught and dealt with.

To support community and help the pupils understand the value of community one of the Governors is setting up 'pen pals' between our year 5 children and children in the local old people's homes.

On a similar theme another Governor is supporting an initiative which will involve our children producing cards and Christmas pictures for wards in the West Cumberland Hospital

Finally, a key role of Governors is Health & Safety. A new robust and coherent policy was passed at the last meeting and it is hopefully re-assuring for parents that there is a lot of focus on all aspects of safetv.



#### **Extreme Weather/Heating Emergencies**

With winter here, it is to be hoped that inclement weather is not serious, and that the neating system works effectively. If this happens not to be the case and the school is forced to close, then the following will be sources of information;

- Radio Cumbria will be informed, and closure details will be included in their broadcasts
- If the school web site will be updated underneath the 'Weather Warnings' link

that we have a first day contact policy for any absences that we are unaware of to ensure the safety of all our pupils on roll. If the school has not been informed of an absence, then all contact numbers will be rung until we speak to a contact adult who can explain the child's absence. If there is no response there will be a home visit. If there continues to be no response the Police will be informed and the child will be treated as a 'missing person'.

#### **Attendance**

In line with DfE Policy we are monitoring attendance very closely. At a recent series of pupil progress meetings with teachers it was



attendance that is a key factor that is inhibiting progress and much of his is holidays in term time.

We have recently sent letters to pupils who already have less than 90% attendance (apologies to the Nursery parents, these were sent in error and need to be ignored). Please can all parents please note the details below:

#### Why is good attendance and punctuality important?

Education lays the vital foundations of a child's life.

Regular and punctual attendance at school is key to both academic and social development, which in turn will improve the life chances of children and young people.

#### So what does 90% attendance actually mean?

90% attendance over a school year = ½ school day missed every week!

#### It's your responsibility as a parent/Carer.

Parents and carers have a legal duty to ensure that their children attend school regularly and punctually in order to optimise their learning, achieve the best they can and get the most out of their school experience. Failure to do so is an offence under section 444(1) of the Education Act 1996.

Some of our friends where teachers and had to make a power - point to be able to teach the children lessons.


Our friend Ollie was Debbie and our other friend Jude was Mrs Beecroft from our class – which is 6CC.

#### Safeguarding/Child Protection

In addition to the above the school has a 'Safeguarding Zone' on its website which contains the above link as well as relevant school policies, further information and a diagram showing how we keep your child safe in school. It is well worth a look.

Sharing information is in the best interests of children and their safeguarding. The school reserves the right to share and receive information from other agencies that may have had dealings with your child.

If you ever have any concerns about the safety or wellbeing of a child, then you can ring your concerns

through to the County's 24 hour 'Safeguarding Hub' number and you can remain anonymous if you wish. Callers can outline their concerns and the Safeguarding Hub will give advice (consultation) and if necessary, undertake an assessment of need.





There is now also an adult NSPCC helpline where any concerned adult can seek advice if they are concerned about a child and would like advice on whether to make a referral. The number to call is

#### **Domestic Violence**

Debbie Cook, our Educational Support Manager has trained to

be a 'Domestic Violence Champion' and is a resource available to any adult who would like to confidentially share incidents with her and is a very good source of advice. Just contact the School Office to get in touch with her.

Domestic violence is on the increase and causes terrible harm to victims and the associated children.

It is everyone's responsibility to ensure it is eradicated. We are working closely with the Police and the school will learn of any incidents to support any children whose lives are affected by such an occurrence.

#### Food & Drink

School Meals cost £14.50 per week (£2.90 a day) payable on ParentPay. This is still great value when you look at prices of goods in supermarkets for packed lunches. We would recommend a hot meal for all the children during the winter and would encourage those on packed lunches to make a change.



• Milk is vital growing children as it strengthens bones and teeth. Children Reception and Nursery are entitled to free milk as are children who are eligible for free school meals and clothing

FS & KS1 children). The cost of milk for the first half of the spring term is £7.00 and needs to be paid by Friday, the 5th January 2024 via ParentPay NOT cash or cheque. 



#### **Lip Balm**

A text went out recently following some up-to-date advice from Health & Safety regarding lip balms. These are not to be used in school as they contain chemicals that can cause

reactions (apparently some lip balms from the USA available in this country contain banned chemicals). School cannot police all lip balms that enter the school building so please do not send them in with your child. Your child may be fine with them but if they are used on another child then there could be issues so safety of all is paramount.

If a child's does have really dry lips and you have medical advice that lip balms are needed then please complete a medication form and it can be kept in the school office. Please note the advice sates that Vaseline should certainly not be allowed as this has petroleum jelly as an ingredient.

#### Scooters, Politeness, Helmets & Bikes



It is great to see so many of our KS2 pupils coming to school by scooter using the back path. This is healthy and an enjoyable thing for them to do and we encourage it. Please, however, can parents note the following:

- The advice from the Police is that children riding scooters should be wearing helmets for their protection from head injuries.
- We have had concerns from other path users that some scooter users just plough through pedestrians rather than stopping/slowing and saying 'excuse me' which parents reporting say they would gladly do. As a consequence, if your child comes on a scooter, please remind them about politeness.

Children in the Early Years have scooter training and road safety lessons on scooters and very soon KS1 will have their scooters at play and lunch times and will be able to enjoy scooting with accompanying helmets if they want to and follow the safety rules.

Finally, is there anyone who could service the Early Years bikes and KS1 scooters for us...it isn't a big job but needs someone who knows what they are doing. Please let the Office know if you can do this.

#### **Homework**

Recent meetings on pupil progress have shown that some children who would really benefit from homework are not completing it. Please, please, please support your child in doing their homework. If you have problems please do speak to your child's class teacher.

#### **Letter Formation**

Another barrier to progress, in this case, in writing is children not forming their letters correctly. If they can't do this they will really struggle when they come to join up their writing as they move through school. Please can you use the Christmas holidays to do a check with your child and ask them to form their letter. They should follow the direction as shown on the diagrams at the bottom of the page for lower case and capital letters. Where they are not forming the letters in the right direction please try and support them in forming them correctly. The diagrams below show the direction of formation with arrows and where they should sit on a line on the page. This would be a great investment of your time as it would really help your child for their future academic success.
