



Social Media & Pupils

Despite regular newsletter features, talks at curriculum evenings, texts home and now many national disturbing events and reports on the harm social media apps are causing to children's mental health there are STILL families that are allowing their children to have unfettered use of them. The age ratings as shown below are clear and are there as children below those ages are not mature enough to understand remote conversations out of context and the harm they can cause. Anything written on these apps can be found years later and could spoil a child's future.



In response to some recent concerns the following letter was sent to parents of children in Upper Key Stage 2 but we feel it is important all parents see it: Dear Parents,

Social Media & Children

I am writing specifically to you as a group of UKS2 parents. We have grave concerns as a school about children accessing social media apps and being in chat groups. It is illegal for them to be used and they do not have the maturity or sense to use them sensitively.

We already have had some upsets about their use this year with children being deliberately ignored, belittled and most recently grossly insulted (using an AI chat bot that issues insults and can be added as an extension to one of these apps).

Children's mental health, wellbeing and happiness and selfworth are being affected by the use of these apps which is devastating to see and is robbing them of a care free childhood.

The media currently is full of articles on how dangerous the use of these apps is and how they have led or are leading to an increase in sexism, racism and homophobia as well as suicides. Indeed, many papers carry such articles today on safer internet day. There is currently a national petition for children to have phones unable to access these apps set up by the mother of a child who was recently murdered, Brianna Ghey, as a result of it being planned using these apps. The petition is already close to reaching the 1,000-signature mark, and if you would like to sign, visit change.org/p/change-the-law-to-make-phone-companies-more-responsible-for-children-s-online-welfare

The school's position cannot be clearer. Children should NOT be accessing these apps. <u>We have a clear policy now which is</u> <u>that if upset from use of these apps spills into school then</u> <u>users involved will face a one-day suspension that will appear</u> <u>on their records.</u> The school will not investigate as it is a parent's responsibility to ensure their children are not using these apps as it is illegal for them to be used underage, nor will it consider appeals from parents if this happens as the position is clear – stop them accessing these apps. This is a final reminder!

In short, we expect all children's access to social media to be restricted and our aim is to have a school where all children are completely safe from online bullying and harassment.




Following some disrespectful instances last academic year and ongoing staff concerns raised with Governors on the Challenge Day we are re-stating our policy that any abusive behaviour either verbally, on the phone or in writing will be taken very seriously and sanctions will be put in place to prevent any further instances. We would expect that the sanctions would be very rarely needed as all should now be aware we now have a zero-tolerance policy for any such behaviour.

We are very pleased that the 99% of you reading this do treat staff with respect and many are often praising the good work staff do. This was reflected in the overwhelmingly positive outcomes of the parent questionnaires.

Please note that the vast majority of issues can be solved in step 1. If a parent has an issue please contact the child's teacher in the first instance, this should resolve most issues. Please do not resort to social media and only contact the headteacher if matters are unresolved.

(It is all to do with whether the Patron is a landowner or the Bishop, so Rectors tend to be the incumbent of older parishes). I have been taking assemblies at Beckstone over the last year and have been so deeply impressed by so many aspects of the school. There is a fantastic heart to the school, and this is evident in the joy and enthusiasm I see among the children (and teachers!). The children have been polite and well-behaved in assemblies, and their commitment to school life is fantastic. I was particularly impressed by the outstanding performance of Macbeth last year.

St Mary's church hosts the Key Stage 2 Christmas productions, and it was lovely to welcome the children and their parents in December, and to hear their enthusiastic signing and recital of poetry. Some of the children also came into the church during the year to learn something about what is what in a church and engaged with lots of questions.

We have just started the period of Lent and are looking forward to Easter at the end of March. I will be talking to the children about Easter at an assembly nearer the end of term. Easter is rather more than a celebration of chocolate eggs, chicks and bunny rabbits! Although these do give us a clue about what Easter is all about. They are symbols of the new life that we see all around us in Spring, and they speak not only of the resurrection of Jesus Christ, but also of the new life that Christians believe can be found in him.

I am really looking forward to being a part of the team that help to ensure that Beckstone Primary School provides the best educational experience possible.

Mobile Phones

In line with recent Government

Guidance the school continues to have a Governor agreed no mobile phone policy unless there are exceptional circumstances e.g. split families and a child changing residence mid-week. Where there are exceptional circumstances, a form needs to be completed and this has to be agreed by the Headteacher.

- If collection arrangements change then please ring the School Office, the children don't need a phone.
- Children are found to be less safe if they carry a phone as they can be attacked and stolen. If parents are worried about safety on the way to and from school, then please accompany them.

Non-compliance with this policy will result in a range of sanctions which can include confiscation of phones for a period of time.

Year 6 families had their parents' evenings on the last 2 Thursdays of last month.

The appointments are for <u>you and your child</u> (one appointment per child...if there are difficult circumstances then a Zoom appointment at the same time as the in person one could be set up on request

but only on an acute need basis). It really is important parents do attend so they hear the same message and so can support their child effectively. The appointment will focus on an interim report on your child's progress along with RAG ratings for attendance, behaviour, uniform

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compliance etc. as well as reviewing school life in general following on from the Autumn evening. The report will look like the one displayed for Y1 to Y5 at the bottom of the last column and the second Reception for one alongside.

Please note that brothers and/or sisters



should not be at these meetings but should be in the FREE crèche provided. We will also be asking you to support your children by setting targets for you to support them at home

Summer Camp

We are again hoping to run our successful Summer Camp that offers childcare at a very competitive price. It is intended to be run for the first 2 and last 2 weeks of the holidays.

Non-Uniform Day

The non-uniform day for this half term is on Friday 15th March where



we will be asking for donations of chocolate in return for wearing no uniform. The chocolate will be used for Bingo prizes and for egg and bonnet prizes, see below. Children are also invited to come in non-uniform or as a book character on World Book Day (7th March) see later.



Easter Competitions



Children in Nursery & Reception are invited to bring bonnets that they have decorated at home with a

parent in the last week of term. There will be prizes for the most original and they will go on display outside the classrooms.



Children in Key Stage 1 & 2 are invited to bring in <u>hard boiled</u> eggs (i.e. they will need 2, one for decorating and one for dumping) in the last week of

term. They will decorate their eggs in school and they will be judged by the cook towards the end of that week.

Egg Dumping



Children are invited to take part in an egg dumping competition in the last week of this term in their classes. Each class winner will then go through to the 'Grand Final' on the last Thursday (28th March) morning assembly where the 'School Champion' will be crowned. Children wishing to take part will need to bring a <u>hardboiled</u> hen's egg to school (not duck, not dinosaur or concrete and not varnished!) on the Monday of the last week– we will endeavour to remind you about this.

Bingo Night

The Easter Bingo Night will take place on Wednesday 20th March from 5.30pm. It is for one night only numbers were capped at 120 and sold out very quickly.



All tickets were priced at £3.50 (which includes a



rather than dressing up. Our theme is cosy up to read so children can come in pyjamas, tracksuits, hoodie blankets etc or they can simply come in non-uniform or can come dressed as a book character if they so wish but it is purely optional.



Most importantly your child is invited to bring their favourite items to read to school from home as they will have the opportunity to read for pleasure at various points throughout the school day. The school tannoy will announce ten-minute reading sessions within each lesson across the course of the day. They

can bring in comics, picture books, novels or factual books. We will also provide reading material for them.

Your child will also receive a free keepsake, World Book Day book, during the day to take home and keep. It is a book they chose themselves earlier this year and has been funded by the school.

Attendance



It is of the utmost importance to your child's education that they attend school consistently as learning is planned in a progressive way and one day follows on from the next in each subject.

The issue of school attendance has been prominently featured in many news items since the start of the year. We want to ensure all our children are good attenders as this will ensure they have better chances of academic attainment and personal achievement. Equally important is the fact that regular attendance promotes positive peer relationships, mental health and overall wellbeing.

At the upcoming parents' evenings you will receive a report on their attendance, it is important they have a green rating. When attendance falls below 90% then this is classed as persistent absenteeism even if it is a result of health or holidays and it is incumbent on schools to contact families when this occurs.

As always, if there are issues with your child and attendance please do contact school and we will do our utmost to support you.

If you ever have any concerns about the safety or wellbeing of a child, then you can ring your concerns through to the County's 24 hour 'Safeguarding Hub' number and you can remain anonymous if you wish. Callers can outline their concerns and the Safeguarding Hub will give advice (consultation) and if necessary, undertake an assessment of need.



There is now also an adult NSPCC helpline where any concerned adult can seek advice if they are concerned about a child and would like advice on whether to make a referral. The number to call is:

Reception Intake Numbers

The school is increasingly popular and combined with the number of new houses it


is now almost at capacity. We understand there may be more applications than our published admission number of 45. If this is indeed the case we will do our utmost to include more Reception children however our 2 Reception classrooms which, in their day, were designed for 30 pupils now can only take a maximum of 24 & 27 pupils. This means we have a have an absolute maximum capacity of 51. If the number of applications exceeds this then the final decision on the allocation of places is made by Cumberland Council and NOT the school. There really needs to be investment in the school building to enable us to take 2 classes per class year group in the right size classrooms given the numbers we are dealing with.





Food & Drink

School Meals cost £14.50 per week (£2.90 a day) payable on ParentPay. This is still great value when you look at prices of

goods in supermarkets for packed lunches. We would recommend a hot meal for all the children during the winter and would encourage those on packed lunches to make a change.

Please note that your child cannot change from packed lunches to school meals or vice versa without a week's notice.



Milk is vital for growing children as it strengthens



bones and teeth. Children in Reception and Nursery are entitled to free milk as are children who are eligible for free school meals and clothing vouchers (not the universal free meal for all FS & KS1 children). The cost of milk

for the first half of the spring term is **£7.00** and needs to be paid by Friday, the 19th April 2024 via ParentPay NOT cash or cheque. Due to the administrative burden of checking attendance and the inability to change the order daily unfortunately milk money cannot be refunded for absence.

Snack money for Nursery and Reception is **£12** for this half term. This is paid on ParentPay and please pay by

Friday 19th April 2024.



Fruit is £7.00 for the second half of spring term, again payable on ParentPay by Friday 19th April 2024. This is for playtime

snacks. Children in EY & KS1 also get fruit free during the day.

When using ParentPay please can you check your payment has gone through – you should get an email to confirm payment. The school does not receive notifications of attempted payments. Thank you!

<u>Uniform</u>

The only supplier that is currently providing the school uniform colours with our logo is Border Embroideries (the colours can be found in shops like Matalan and Asda without the logo and that is acceptable uniform too). Border Embroideries will have a 'Savings Window' next month (see displayed information) with a 20%


