### 2023-24 Procedures & Organisation

Please can all parents note the following:

### Start of the Day

- The school gates open to all year groups from 8.45am daily. Please can all parents ensure the punctuality of their child(ren). The start of the day procedures will be the same as the end of last term. Early Years and KS1 to line up the hill. Nursery and Reception children to go through the yard, Reception to classes and Nursery (see below), KS1 children to come through the playground gate and make their way to class. KS2 to line up outside the gate and make their own way into class once the gate is opened.
- Nursery Drop Off Arrangements change from last term today with all Nursery parents leaving their children in the Nursery cloakroom and picking them up from their child's zone in the classroom.
- School must be notified before the start of the day
  of any absence. Registers are checked first thing
  and families are contacted if there is an
  unexplained absence. If no response from families
  is forthcoming then the Police will be contacted.

### **End of the Day**

The school day finishes at 3.15pm. Nursery, Reception and Key Stage 1 children need to be collected by an adult from the front yard. KS2 children have the option of leaving by the front or through the gate at the back and along the path. Please ensure KS2 children know their collection arrangements. Please also can you instil in your children that if the usual collection arrangements are not in place that they come back to school as a place of safety and we will sort from here. In addition, if there is human error or a child forgets a

club the same applies. Beckstone Xtra is available from 3.15 to 5.15pm for anyone who books in advance via bookings@beckstone.cumbria.sch.uk or simply use the QR code.



#### School Uniform

All children MUST be in school uniform. Full details about our uniform are on our web site but in a nutshell The uniform consists of:

- School or dark blue sweat shirt, school or dark blue fleece, school or light blue polo shirt. Please ensure these are the right colours either through Border embroideries or without logos from Asda, Matalan etc. The uniform from Haig Embroideries is the wrong colour and they have assured us and the Legal department of the County they will stop selling it until they can source the correct colour.
- Grey or black tailored trousers or knee length skirts (not sports trousers/tracksuit trousers UNLESS it is a PE day)
- Dark deck shorts or blue gingham or pinafore dresses
- Low heeled footwear, shoes or trainers.
   These need to be black with no promotional logos.

The school now has a well-stocked set of good quality used uniforms that are available FREE to any family that would like to use this service. Please see the details on the poster on the top of thispage if you would like to use this service. Uniforms can be collected from the School Office.

Please also note that:

- Only natural hair colours are allowed
- the only jewellery allowed are stud ear-rings (which have to be covered for PE) and watches. No bracelets, necklaces etc are allowed for health and safety reasons
- Nail varnish should not be worn

PE Kits - Your child can come in PE Kit on 2 days a week from KS1 up...school or light blue T shirt (NOT football tops or branded sportswear), leggings or tracksuit trousers. They MUST wear a school uniform sweatshirt or cardigan on top unless it is a non-uniform day and black trainers. Your child will need plimsolls that can be left in their locker. PE Kits will be monitored and RAG ratings included in the end of year report.

EY children will need to have their PE Kit in school as they will learn to change too (a life skill). Their PE Kit is a light blue T shirt and black shorts plus plimsolls.

### Free school meals and clothing grant

£500,000 worth of additional funding has been allocated to the school clothing grant fund as part of a new £2m cost of living reserve fund. This means that eligible parents will now receive a clothing grant worth £50 for each primary school child, up from £25, and £100 for each secondary school child, up from £35.

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- **Income Support**
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

We ask that ALL ELIGIBLE PARENTS OF PUPILS FROM NEXT YEAR'S RECEPTION UP TO YEAR 6 fill in the school meals registration form that is available online through the Cumbria County Council 'Citizen Portal'. This can be found by searching

for it on the internet, using the link below or following the QR code. If you need help please ask the School Office.

If you're eligible, make sure you apply for free school meals if you haven't already so that you receive your school clothing grant too. It only takes 5 minutes.

To apply then follow this link or the QR code. Once completed the system will let you know if you are eligible.

### **Industrial Action**

The good news for the term is that all Unions are ceasing industrial action so there will be no further strike days. A pay rise for teachers for the coming year was agreed (there was no change



to last year's award which was the focus of the strikes). Despite claims in the media the pay rise is not fully funded, the Government is funding 3% of the rise and the school has to find the other 3.5% from its existing budget.

### **Playground Safety**

In order to ensure everyone's safety please can we remind all families that dogs are not allowed on site. In addition, scooters or bikes should also not be used in the playground areas of the school.

For the safety of all our children please can all parents who may access the school via the front yard please ensure they close the playground gate as they go in






### **Platinum Sports - National Recognition**






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### **Sporting Success**

Each of the UKS2 classes has a week of swimming during next half term (dates on back page). The sessions will be an intensive one week of one-hour sessions with an aim to get all children being able to swim 25m before the week is out (the minimum National Curriculum expectation). Swimming times are 2 to 3pm so the class will arrive slightly later than normal finish time on these weeks.

Children will need a bag, a towel, appropriate swimwear and a hair brush or comb. Time is tight and the children will not have time for any 'beauty' treatments before returning to school on the bus!

Please note that spectators are not allowed in for these sessions.

### <u>Y1 –Y6 Meet the Teacher –</u> Wellbeing & Progress Update

Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> October & Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> 2023



Please make a note of the dates for the 'Meet the Teacher Wellbeing & Progress' update meetings at school.

These appoinments will allow you to discuss how your child is settling into their new class and how they are progressing towards their projected end of year outcomes at this stage of the year.

Also within this time there will hopefully be an opportunity to try some small tasters of the school meals and discuss them with canteen staff. Our aim is to get as many children on to school meals as possibly as they fully comply with Government nutritional advice.

Please Note: There is one time slot per child so where there is split parenting there needs to be agreement on attending together.

Details on how to book appointments will be sent home towards the end of this month.



Educational Research shows that where schools and families work closely together the child's perfortmance at school is invariably improved. As a result we would very strongly urge all families to make an appointment as soon as possible.

There will be a crèche on these days as we would like your child to accompany you to the appointment so they are part of the discussions and siblings are out of earshot. The crèche will be in Nursery.

Please let us know if you have any difficulties booking your appoinment and we will be happy to help.

### Reception Parental Phonics Training and Follow Up



On Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> or Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> there is a Phonics training session for Reception parents from 3.30 to 4pm. This session is aimed at helping parents support their children in learning their phonetic sounds and representation which is the key to success in early reading.

There are optional open sessions after each phonics training session to discuss any concerns they may have about their child with the teacher.

Nursery will be meeting parents next half term.

### Parent Pledge

Last year the Department for Education asked all schools to issue a pledge to their parents that they will be kept informed of



their progress in English and Maths termly and also to be informed if they are falling behind and what the school is doing to help them 'catch up'. As a school we fully back this pledge particularly as it is nothing new to us and what we have had in place for years. Our pledge is reproduced on the next page for your information. We hope you agree that we also strive to engage you in the support of your children and keep you informed.

### **Attendance**

## PARENT PLEDGE

Each child is a unique learner with strengths and needs in all subjects. Each teacher is committed to planning a responsive learning experience in their class that meets each child's needs, and that is both challenging and inspiring. Our teaching aims to always be of high quality, in all subjects and we are passionate about enabling your child to reach their potential. We understand that occasionally some children need extra support to stay on track, so our 'Parent Pledge' outlines what this might look like for your child.

We will provide timely, targeted, evidence based and appropriate support to any pupil falling behind in English or Maths and have ensured our budget plan allows for this. As a parent you can expect regular feedback on your child's attainment and progress based on ongoing regular assessment and any additional support being given using our 'Wave' model as described below



### Wave 1 – Quality First Teaching – Universal Support

Wave 1 is the effective inclusion of all children in a daily, high quality Literacy and Mathematics lesson. Wave 1 Strategies at Beckstone Primary would include:

- 1. Effective differentiation / Success Criteria and clear Learning Objectives
- 2. Use of practical resources, diagrams and frames to support learning
- Planning in small steps using recall and retrieval strategies
- 4. Peer and self- assessment
- 5. Use of Literary Curriculum and Literacy Leaves for reading
- Clear modelling and use of examples 6.
- Regular and systematic teaching of reading
- Explicit and unpicking of vocabulary
- Ensuring 100% participation

### Wave 2 Intervention – Additional support in class

Wave 2 is additional time-limited provision, in the form of small-group intervention (4-8 children), to accelerate progress and enable children to work at age - related expectations. Wave 2 interventions are supplementary to quality first teaching. You will be informed of what strategies may be being used by your child at the regular face to face meetings or via SeeSaw. These may be one of these but these are not exclusive and other tailored strategies may be used:

#### Wave Three – Academic Interventions


Wave 3 is additional provision, if gaps have not closed in Wave 2. This will take the form of very small-group intervention (1-3), to enable children to make accelerated progress. Wave 3 interventions are short term, focused interventions with a planned staged structure to ensure children do not become dependent on adult support.



Individualised packages of support will be deployed for targeted periods of time to accelerate progress. These academic interventions may take place at times when others are in assembly, singing, at lunch etc. They may also involve additional school staff who may not be the child's classroom staff. Progress and impact of the interventions will be carefully tracked. You will be informed if your child is receiving this support and you may be asked to support your child at home too with guidance from school.

### PARENTS' PLEDGE TO THE SCHOOL

We expect our community to uphold the school's vision and values to promote learning and excellence. As a result this means parents working in partnership with us to ensure:



- Your child accesses the full curriculum through aiming for 100% attendance and not taking your child out of school for holidays
- Celebration of positive attitudes and achievement at home
- The school is informed of any issues affecting your child's health or welfare.



Our Promise To You.



It is of the utmost importance to your child's education that they attend school consistently as learning is planned in a progressive way and one day follows on from the next in each



subject. Of course, there will be times when a child is too poorly to come to school and this can't be helped but this should be a rarity.

However, these should be rare events as prompt regular attendance will really help your child do well at school.

Planning holidays in term time is to the detriment of your child's education.

### Term Time Holidays and the Law



The Government's policy of not allowing families to take holidays in term time and those that do being liable to prosecution and a fine is still in operation. We would like to ensure all families are aware of this law.

The Headteacher is not allowed to authorise absence and indeed any holiday absences in term time will be counted as 'unauthorised' (which equates to a truancy mark) and may be subject to a fixed penalty notice/fine.

Parents need to fill in a leave of absence form if their child is going to be missing from school (this is of vital importance as the school immediately chases up any unknown absences on the day itself and if the child's whereabouts is not known then the Police are notified — this is school policy). Parents can apply for 'exceptional circumstances' on this form if they so wish. It is imperative that school knows where your child is for safeguarding reasons.



### **Term Time Holidays & Tests**

There is active discouragement of taking holidays in term time as it disrupts a child's learning.

Taking time off at the statutory testing time needs to be avoided completely.

3 weeks from week beg. 5<sup>th</sup> June – Y4 Times Table tests

Week beginning 12<sup>th</sup> June -Y1 Phonics Screening Check

If you are planning trips next year please avoid the following dates in 2024:

KS1 Optional SATs – The month of May 2024 KS2 SATs - Week beg. 13<sup>th</sup> May 2024

Y1 & Y2 Phonics Screening Check Week – Week beg. 10<sup>th</sup> June 2024

Y4 Times Table Check - 2 weeks from Monday 3rd June

### **Term Dates to Summer 2026**

The new Cumberland Council has been very pro-active with term dates and has



published them well in advance so it should help all families planning holidays so they don't affect their child's learning. The dates are freely available on our web site and are published in full on the back page of this newsletter.



### Respect

We all want what is best for your child. As a school we are striving

hard to ensure we support your child and in turn you support the school in its endeavours. The school is very approachable and we will do our utmost to sort any problems or issues, all has to be dealt with in a courteous manner though.

Following some disrespectful instances last academic year we have changed our policy and any abusive

behaviour either verbally, on the phone or in writing will be taken very seriously and sanctions will be put in place to prevent any further instances. We would expect that the sanctions would be very rarely needed as all should now be aware we now have a zero-tolerance policy for any such behaviour.

### ZERO TOLERANCE

Our staff have the right to be treated with respect and dignity at all times.

Aggressive and abusive behaviour will not be tolerated.

We are here to help you, please treat others as you wish to be treated.

### WhatsApp/Social Media

We are finding that social media is often used to air grievances about school decisions and protocols when reasons for these decisions are multi-faceted and are

always underpinned by having the best interests of children and families at their heart or been driven by external



circumstances beyond our control e.g. the weather. If you are on group WhatsApp concerning school it may be beneficial to scroll through messages and check if any positive messages are being shared otherwise the group is in danger of becoming a platform that is feeding on negativity.

On platforms such as WhatsApp staff at school have no recourse to address issues. When staff hear about the content of such messages (which they generally do) it is really upsetting when they are working so hard at school for many hours at home to provide the best education they can, especially at a time when Government and media support is sadly lacking.

Teaching is an extremely demanding yet incredible

rewarding and job. Our staff are committed to supporting the community they serve. Please support them by talking directly to us if you have an issue rather than resorting to social media. We have again updated policy following some instances from last year and sanctions



for posts that are negative towards the school will result similar to the above as all should be respectful and offensive posts will also have to be removed.

### **Social Media & Pupils**

Following on from some inappropriate use of WhatsApp out of school by older pupils that then spills into school we have changed our policy with regard to these incidents. The solution is simple...parents need to ensure that that children are not illegally accessing social media apps as they do not have the maturity to use them appropriately. The legal age limits are shown here:

It is abundantly clear that no Primary aged child should be accessing any of the apps shown. Access is illegal. Children may say 'Everyone has it' but that is not the case. The Governors have reviewed the social media policy and please be aware that it is not the



school's responsibility to police or investigate mis-use of social media apps when the child should not be accessing them by law. It is important to note that to prevent social media upset spilling into school the policy now states that there will be an immediate exclusion for pupils mis-using these apps and causing issues in school. This will go on their school records forever.

It is your responsibility as parents to ensure your child is NOT using these apps to keep them safe and prevent this from ever happening to them.

Each year group winner will receive a book and chocolate for the parent(s) who have supported at home. Please use this as an incentive to read regularly with your child ©



### **Coats**

We will soon be asking all children to wear their coats at lunchtimes and playtimes. We have an external thermometer and when the outside temperature drops below 13°C then coats are mandatory. Please ensure they come to school with a coat and one that has their name in – thanks!

School coats which are fully waterproof and have a hood and reflective strips are available online from Border

If your child needs an inhaler at school please ensure you have completed an 'Asthma Card' at the School Office, these will be sent out this week and please return



immediately. If your child has a new diagnosis please see the office. It is a parents' responsibility to check the pumps are in date and not empty. It is also advisable to write your child's name on using a permanent pen.

### **Plasters**

If your child is allergic to plasters then please do let the School Office know. Plasters are effective in

controlling bleeding and securing wounds from infection and they will be used for minor cuts and grazes unless you have let us know otherwise. We use non-allergenic ones.

### **Medicines**

The school will administer medicine <u>only</u> when it is **4** times a day and has an <u>appropriate prescription sticker with the child's name on</u>. We will disinfectant wipe the bottles.



Please note that cough medicines/lozenges etc., <u>are not</u> <u>allowed unless they have been prescribed</u>. If you wish the school to administer medicine then please complete a form available from the School Office.

### Nasal Flu Jabs



Flu vaccinations will take place at school on Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> October for all years from Reception upwards. It is important all children get vaccinated this year so

there is no confusion between flu and Covid symptoms and for health reasons as scientific research has shown that the body finds it hard to cope if trying to fight more than one viral infection at any one time.



It is a nasal spray vaccination (Fluenz Tetra®) and will not only help protect the children from getting flu but it also stops them spreading the disease to their family, carers and the wider population. As flu viruses change each year last year's

immunisation for those that had it will not be effective.

The vaccination is a nasal spray and is not painful. The school pupils have been brilliant at receiving it in recent years.

Consent forms will be sent out this week, please ensure they are promptly returned to school. PLEASE ENSURE THESE ARE RETURNED TO SCHOOL. only children who will be excluded are those where there is contra-indicated medical advice and there are very few this will apply to across the country.

Parents of younger children may like to know that children aged 2 upwards and also in Nursery can receive their free vaccination through their GP or Pharmacies. Harrington Pharmacy offers this service and is very handy for school.

Flu vaccinations for adults are also available on request at Pharmacies or large supermarkets for an average £10 fee.

championships held in Egremont at the 'Crab Fair' on Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> September.





If you ever have any concerns about the safety or wellbeing of a child, then you can ring your concerns through to the County's 24 hour 'Safeguarding Hub' number and you can remain anonymous if you wish. Callers can outline their concerns and the Safeguarding Hub will give advice (consultation) and if necessary undertake an assessment of need.





### **High Harrington Community Centre**




The Community Centre is in Crooklands, High Harrington and is colloquially known as the
