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#### <u>Arabella</u>

As you are all aware Arabella, a pupil in Year 4, tragically died at the start of the holidays after sadly losing her long battle with a brain tumour.

She was such a popular little girl with a great sense of humour and love of school and will be truly missed. Indeed the packed funeral last week was testament to the huge number of lives she had been part of and had enhanced.

There will be many children who are experiencing death for the first time. As described in the letter sent in the holidays do talk to them and check they are ok and try to answer any worries or queries they may have.

We will do our utmost in school to help and support them too and this was described in an assembly yhis very morning.

Over the course of this term we will be collecting memories of her and sharing them in a Memorial assembly at the end of this half term to celebrate her life. In the longer term we hope to have a permanent memory of her so that she live on in name. An idea from Governors is to develop the allotment into a KS1 adventure playground and name it after her. We have as non-uniform day at the end of this half term (see later) to begin to fund such a development.

The family have shared the following link to a gofund me page in support of brain tumour research to help children and families into the future as brain tumours kill more children and adults under the age of 40 than any other cancer yet just 1% of the national spend on cancer research has been allocated to this devastating disease since records began in 2002. The recent 'Wear the Hair Day rungs (again see latter) have been donated

to this cause in Arabella's memory.

#### WhatsApp & Social Media Concerns

This seems to be a common theme in newsletters and it is very concerning that it is seemingly falling on deaf ears.

There have been many recent upsets with children falling out over items written out of context in WhatsApp groups in Year 3 (!!) up to Year 6. There is a minimum age for WhatsApp as the children are not mature enough to cope with written text out of context and can say things they regret or don't realise the implications of what they have written.

Written material on the web can always be re-found even if deleted and could impact on your child's future life.

Of major concern has been adult males being invited into a Y6 WhatsApp group. They have shared inappropriate images and befriended some children. The implication of this is that all members of this group had their first names and phone numbers exposed to inappropriate and unknown adults. School advice is for all Y6 children who were part of that group to have their phone numbers changed and to be taken off social media as there is a potential they can be contacted!

The Governors have discussed WhatsApp on many occasions. They have a policy that WhatsApp issues should not be deal with in school and if they spill into

school then children will be suspended and there will be no investigation as they should not be on WhatsApp - you have been warned. Exclusions will go down on your child's record!



In summary, recent concerns from this school and from the news:

- WhatsApp has a minimum age limit as Primary school children are not mature enough to understand some messages out of context.
- WhatsApp is the main cause of upset, anxiety and loss of friendships in Primary children
- WhatsApp groups are not secure. Adult males sharing pornographic pictures have been members of a Primary groups. This allows them to see first names and phone numbers of children as well.
- Contacts have been made between adults (who purport to be children) and befriend Primary pupils with clear dangers.
- Where security has been breached (which has happened at this school with a Y6 group) all parents of children in that group should change their child's phone number for their safety.

#### Please protect your child.

Social media apps and smart phones are exposing your child to unnecessary risks, bullying, depression, misogyny, porn to extreme levels and self-harm or worse.

# WHATSAPP

WHAT ARE THE RISKS? WhatsApp is a free messaging service owned by Meta which allows users to send text and voice messages, make video calls, share multimedia – such as images, videos, documents and polls – and have group chats. WhatsApp messages are encrypted, meaning only you and the recipient can view what is sent. While this privacy may sound attractive on paper, this app unfortunately comes with several risks that must be considered – especially for younger users.

ROF RESTRICTION

#### **EVOLVING SCAMS**

WhatsApp's popularity makes it a lucrative hunting ground for scammers. Recent examples include posing as the target's child, requesting a money transfer because of a spurious 'emergency' and even cons where fraudsters trigger a verification message by attempting to log in to your account, then, posing as WhatsApp, call or text to ask you to repeat the code back to them, giving them access to your private messages and personal information.



Channels let users follow interests without sharing their phone numbers or sending direct messages, allowing only votes on polls and reacting to posts with emojis. However, fraudulent channels can impersonate legitimate organizations, tricking people into sharing personal data and even spreading misinformation or hate speech. Additionally, WhatsApp may collect details about followed channels and sell this information to third parties, raising data privacy concerns.

#### **FAKE NEWS**

WhatsApp's connectivity and ease of use allows news to be shared rapidly – whether it's true or not. To combat the spread of misinformation, messages forwarded more than five times on the app now display a "Forwarded many times" label and a double arrow icon. This makes users aware that the message they've just received is far from an original – and might not be entirely factual, either.

#### CHAT LOCK

Another new feature named 'Chat Lock' allows users to store certain messages or chats in a separate 'locked chats' folder, saved behind a passcode, fingerprint or face ID authentication. While this usually functions as intended, it can potentially be exploited by younger users to hide conversions and content that they suspect their parents wouldn't approve of – such as the sharing of age-inappropriate material.

#### DISAPPEARING MESSAGES

Disappearing messages are useful for sharing personal or sensitive information, but young people may have a false sense of privacy regarding the content they share. These messages disappear after anywhere from 24 hours to 90 days – depending on the user's preference – or can even be set to be viewed ont time only. However, the recipient can 'keep' the message by bookmarking or screenshotting it, making them not as private as they may first appear.

#### **VISIBLE LOCATION**

WhatsApp's 'live location' feature lets users share their current whereabouts, which can be helpful for friends meeting up or parents checking that their child's safely on the way home, for example. However, children are able to share their location with anyone in their contacts list or a mutual group – potentially letting strangers identify their live location.

# Advice for Parents & Educators

ONLINE

#### **EMPHASISE CAUTION**

Encourage children to treat unexpected messages with caution. Get them to consider, for example, whether it sounds like something a friend or relative would really send them. Make sure they know never to share personal details over WhatsApp, and to be wary of clicking on any links in messages. Setting up two-step verification adds a further layer of protection to their WhatsApp account.

#### ADJUST THE SETTINGS

It's wise to change a child's WhatsApp settings to specify which of their contacts can add them to group chats without needing approval. To do this, go to Privacy, then Groups. You can give permission to My Contacts or My Contacts Except ... . Additionally, if the child needs to use Live Location, emphasise that they should enable this function for only as long as they need – and then turn it off

#### THINK BEFORE SHARING

Help children understand why it's important to stop and think before posting or forwarding something on WhatsApp. It's easy – and all too common – for content sent to one user to then be shared more widely, and even publicly on social media. Encourage them to consider how an ill-judged message might damage their reputation or upset a friend who sent something to them in confidence. Real-life friendships are far more important than likes after all

#### **CHAT ABOUT PRIVACY**

Have a conversation with youngsters about how they're using WhatsApp, emphasising that it's for their own safety. If you spot a Locked Chats' folder, you might want to talk about the sort of messages that are in there, who they're with and why a child might want to hide them. Also, if a young user has sent any 'view once' content, discuss their reasons for using this feature.



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
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#### **Sporting Success Continues**

This is wholly inappropriate and we urge those parents to teach their child resilience and encourage them and say they will get a turn at competitive events at school or beyond.

Please think before upsetting staff and children!

#### **Ear Piercing**



Given you cannot take earrings out for a few weeks after ear piercing it would make sense that if you are thinking of getting your child's ear pierced you wait until the summer holiday so it can heal when at home. This would then mean you don't need to provide them with plasters to

cover their earrings for PE.

# Governors Blog

On behalf of the Governing Body at Beckstone Primary School, I wish to pass our deepest and sincerest condolences to the parents and family of Arabella. The tragic loss of Arabella will leave a void in the hearts of everyone who were lucky enough to have had her in their lives. She was a caring, strong and determined young girl who did not let her health preclude her from taking part in anything.

She will be so sadly missed by everyone at Beckstone.

Our thoughts are with you at this very difficult time.

Mr Warbrick provides important information about the use of social media platforms and their age restrictions every month and it is up to us, as parents, what we choose to do with that information, to keep our children safe. Some may prevent their children from accessing age restricted apps, some may allow limited access, and some may be unaware of their children's social media profiles or presence.

Times have changed and children appear to want to grow up so quickly or keep up with their friends. As parents we are pressured to decide, so our child / children aren't isolated because they are not keeping up with the trend. As such, Santa, the Tooth Fairy and the Easter bunny are soon forgotten, replaced with TikTok, Facebook and WhatsApp on mobile devices.

The threat from social media has been receiving a lot of media coverage during the last couple of weeks and unfortunately, a recent incident involving Beckstone pupils has shown it can happen to anyone.

This is a very brief summary of the incident. A pupil was contacted by someone, unknown to them, on WhatsApp. The individual engaged in conversation then added one of their 'friends' to a private group before posting pornographic images and videos. The content was shared in a larger WhatsApp group of school children before the poster and their 'friend' were invited into that larger group. Worryingly, those individuals suddenly had access to children's first names, the school they attend and their phone numbers. We understand that by entering a mobile number into Snap Chat someone's location can apparently be traced.

Sadly, Cumbria Constabulary did not pursue this further, so it is not known whether these people were members of a larger paedophile / grooming ring.

This incident occurred two weeks prior to anyone reporting it. While staff can't police children and their use of social media outside of the school, we decided it was important to share what information we could with you.

Do you know enough about your child's online presence? Who they're communicating with? or, might there be something going on that they are uncomfortable talking with you about?

While a minority have vocalised their disagreement with the School and Governing Body's stance on children having access age restricted social media platforms, I hope the above information has helped explain why.


#### **Egg Dumping**

#### **Attendance**

#### Family holidays and term time leave

Parents/carers should ensure that family holidays and any

term time leave are arranged outside of school term time. Parents/carers should not remove their child from school during term time without having first filled in a leave of absence form in advance. (The 'Leave of Absence Form' can be obtained from the main reception or on the school website.)

Failure to notify school of your child not being at school may result in Police involvement.

Planning holidays in term time is to the detriment of your child's education.

The school <u>now has a duty to report</u> any unauthorised absences of 5 days+ within a year to the County Attendance Officer who may issue fines to each parent. This was a policy agreed by the previous Government and has been adopted by the new one so there is political agreement on the importance of children not missing school.

A number of fines have already been issued to some of our families and one court order so please think hard before taking time out of school.

There have been some recent updates to school attendance that you need to be aware of:

Attendance at sporting events is now just for the event itself in this country. 'Travel' days are counted as 'holidays'. For example those going away for a football weekend now need to take note, as the tournament is on a

Saturday any time off school will be counted as 'holiday'. For those taking part in sporting events overseas then the sporting event and travel for one day either side is allowed, the rest is counted as holidays.

- There are concerns that parents are claiming 'illness' and then going on holiday to avoid fines. This clearly is morally wrong and is teaching children it is OK to lie. Schools are now being asked to contact homes on the 3rd day of absence and if no-one is home and it is then found to they are on holiday then the fine is likely to be transmuted into a criminal prosecution.
- 15 days of holiday will result in an immediate prosecution and will bypass the staged approach.



Please note – this is now particularly important.... taking time off at the statutory testing time needs to be

avoided completely.

#### **Safeguarding/Child Protection**

If you ever have any concerns about the safety or wellbeing of a child, then you can ring your concerns through to the County's 24 hour 'Safeguarding Hub' number and you can remain anonymous if you wish. Callers can outline their concerns and the Safeguarding Hub will give advice (consultation) and if necessary, undertake an assessment of need.



There is also an adult NSPCC helpline where any concerned adult can seek advice if they are concerned about a child and would like advice on whether to make a referral. The number to call is

We are again running our successful Summer Camp that offers childcare at a very competitive price. It will run for the first 2 and last 2 weeks of the Summer holidays.





#### **New Prices**

A reminder that due to increased costs from contractors due to National insurance increases and other costs rising in the new financial year the school has very reluctantly been forced to increase some prices. The price increases are simply to cover costs and we have strived to keep these to a minimum.

- School meal costs for those not on free meals are now £3.10 a day or £15.50 a week.
- Breakfast Club costs £5.50 from 7.30am until the start of the school day or £5 from 8am.





For Nursery children staying over lunchtime the cost of a meal and lunchtime care between the end of morning Nursery and start of afternoon Nursery is £4

Despite the recent price rises we are confident that the costs still show good value when compared to alternative provision.


Winners received recognition and Easter eggs in the final assembly of last term. The job of the judge, our cook Christa, was very hard this year and took ages to decide.

#### **Nursery Intakes**

Children born between **1 January 2022** and **31 March 2022** can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week Nursery education from **April 2025**.


Children born between 1 April 2022 and 31 August 2022 can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week from September 2025.

Children born between **1 September 2022** and **31 December 2022** can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week from **January 2026**.

If you know of any children with birth dates between these times and would like their child to come to this school, then please ask them to contact the School Office as soon as possible.

#### Food & Drink

**School Meals** currently cost £15.50 per week payable on ParentPay. This is sgreat value when you look at prices of goods in supermarkets for packed lunches. We would recommend a hot meal for all the children and would encourage those on packed lunches to make a change.

#### Beckstone Primary School Nursery

Morning nursery sessions run every day from:

8:45 a.m.-11:45 a.m. (3 hours)

If your child is staying in afternoon nursery after the morning session a charge of £4.00 per day will be required to cover the cost of a school dinner and lunchtime care from 11:45 a.m. to 12:15 p.m. payable via Parentpay.

Unfortunately we are unable to offer facilities for packed lunches

for nursery children.

Afternoon nursery sessions run every day from:

12:15 p.m. — 2:15 p.m. (2 hours)

12:15 p.m. — 3:15 p.m. (3 hours)

If you are entitled to 30 hours there will be no charge for these sessions.

If you are not entitled to 30 hours and your child attends afternoon nursery after the morning nursery session you will be charged as follows:

£4.00 per day will be required to cover the cost of a school dinner and lunchtime care from 11:45 a.m. to 12:15 p.m.

Afternoon nursery sessions run every day from:

12:15 p.m. - 2:15 p.m. = £10.00 (plus £4.00 for dinner & care)

12:15 p.m. - 3:15 p.m. = £14.00 (plus £4.00 for dinner & care)

There would only be a charge if you go over your 15 hours in the week.

15/30 hours can be used for Breakfast Club and Beckstone Xtra (after school care), with another setting or banked for Summer Camp.

Please inform the office if you are doing this.

Afternoon nursery places must be booked in advance either in person to the office or via email bookings@beckstone.cumbria.sch.uk

Bookings can be made in advance.



• *Milk* is vital for growing children as it strengthens bones and teeth. Children in Reception and Nursery are entitled to free milk as are children who are eligible for free school meals and clothing vouchers (not the universal free meal for all FS & KS1 children).

The cost of milk for this

half term is £7.00 and needs to be paid by Friday 25<sup>h</sup> April 2025 via ParentPay NOT cash or cheque. Due to

the administrative burden of checking attendance and the inability to change the order daily unfortunately milk money cannot be refunded for absence.



 Snack money for Nursery and Reception is £10 for this half term. This is paid on ParentPay and please pay by Friday 25<sup>h</sup> April 2025.



 Fruit is £10.00 for this half term, again payable on ParentPay by Friday 25<sup>h</sup> April 2025. This is for playtime snacks.

Children in EY & KS1 also get free fruit during the day.

#### **Beckstone's Extended Services**

Our extended services include the Breakfast Club £5.50 from 7.30am and £5.00 from 8am. Last entry is at 8.25am. Prices have risen due to increased costs but are still very competitive.

Our popular afternoon childcare provision is afternoon Nursery – see table in next column –please note these places MUST BE BOOKED IN ADVANCE) with pick up times at 2.15pm and 3.15pm (please see prices poster on the previous page). Please note that unfortunately we are unable to offer facilities for packed lunches for Nursery children.
