#### PROPOSED PUFFIN CROSSING - A597 CHURCH ROAD/MAIN ROAD, HARRINGTON

I am writing to notify you of the Councils proposed introduction of a new Puffin Crossing on the A597, Church Road/Main Road, Harrington. This proposed crossing aims to improve safety for pedestrians, particularly schoolchildren, addressing a longstanding concern in the area.


The installation is scheduled to begin on 26th October 2025, and to facilitate the work, temporary traffic signals will be in place for approximately two weeks.

Your input is important to us, and we welcome your thoughts before proceeding with the installation.



The new crossing will be a light-controlled puffin crossing similar to that shown below:



It will line up with the back path and will make crossing the road for all our pupils who came that way so very much safer.

Please bear with the road works as there is no gain without pain and the result will be beneficial to pedestrians forever.

Cumberland Council have been very supportive and have worked closely with the school on this project and the Governing Body should be thanked for its consistent lobbying for a crossing that has finally come to fruition.

## Covernors' Board

For some, Autumn is a change in the seasons marked by colder and (even!) wetter weather, when the nights draw in and the fuel bills rise. For others, Autumn is a blaze of gold, amber, ruby and russet, when the trees hang low, laden with apples, pears and plums, and the morning chill freshen the warmth of the sun. To some extent it depends on whether you look to the future and see Autumn as a foretaste of the winter that is to come, or whether you live in the moment and look for the good that is all around us.

Our harvest festival is a time of looking back in gratitude for the good things in our lives. We tend to think of harvest as gathering the produce for our own benefit, but it's also about producing seeds for future growth. As a Governor, I love coming to Challenge Days when we have the opportunity to review the children's work and see the amazing progress they have made during the year; to see how the seeds planted at the start of the year are blossoming and bearing much fruit by the time they are ready to move on.

We all have a role to play in nurturing those seeds; teachers, governors and parents, working together to encourage our children, to create a positive environment where children are eager to learn, where their efforts are encouraged, and their achievements praised. We also need to nurture and protect those seeds when winter strikes, because sometimes children have a hard time and need extra love and care.

Harvest is a time for giving thanks, and I would like to thank, on behalf of the Governors, all the staff for their total commitment to the growth, wellbeing and support of all our children and for making Beckstone such a special place to learn.

#### **Attendance**

Please can all families ensure their child attends school as regularly as possible and on time - indeed this is a statutory duty on parents.



Again, sadly a number of our parents are receiving fixed penalty notices for holidays in term time. Please note repeat offences can lead to a criminal prosecution.

It is of the utmost importance to your child's education that they attend school consistently as learning is planned in a progressive way and one day follows on from the next in each subject. Of course, there will be times when a child is too poorly to come to school and this can't be helped but this should be a rarity.

#### Attendance and the Law

The Government's policy on attendance is much stricter now. Action against families who have



children with poor attendance will be taken by the County not the school and they now have access to school data. Action is particularly harsh against term time holidays - please be aware of this.

The Headteacher is not allowed to authorise absence and indeed any holiday absences in term time will be counted as 'unauthorised' (which equates to a truancy mark) and may be subject to a fixed penalty notice/fine.

Parents need to fill in a leave of absence form if their child is going to be missing from school (this is of vital importance as the school immediately chases up any unknown absences on the day itself and if the child's whereabouts is not known then the Police are notified – this is school policy). Parents can apply for 'exceptional circumstances' on this form if they so wish. It is imperative that school knows where your child is for safeguarding reasons.

#### **County Attendance Letter to all Parents**

We have been asked to distribute a letter to all parents about attendance by the County. This is reproduced on the next page for your information.



#### **Term Time Holidays & Tests**

There is active discouragement of taking holidays in term time as it disrupts a child's learning.

Taking time off at the statutory testing time needs to be avoided completely.

If you are planning trips next year, please avoid the following dates in 2025:

KS1 Optional SATs – The month of May 2026 KS2 SATs - Week beg. 11<sup>th</sup> May 2026

Y1 & Y2 Phonics Screening Check Week – Week beg. 8<sup>th</sup> June 2026

Y4 Times Table Check – 2 weeks from Monday 1<sup>st</sup> June

#### **Nasal Flu Vaccination**

Flu vaccinations took place early in the school year on Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> September for all years from Reception upwards. The children



were all very brave (in reality it feels like a tickle in the nose) and we were very proud of them. The uptake was 68.4%, a level down from last year. This will give these children protection from flu and their attendance and consequently their learning will not be impaired. It also helps to protect family members from the spread of flu. In addition, it provides additional protection with winter viruses as scientific research has shown that the body finds it hard to cope if trying to fight more than one viral infection at any one time.

If your child missed this valuable winter protection then please note that children aged 2 upwards and also in Nursery can receive their free vaccination through their GP or Pharmacies. Harrington Pharmacy offers this service and is very handy for school.

Flu vaccinations for adults are also available on request at Pharmacies or large supermarkets for an average £10 fee

#### **Safeguarding/Child Protection**

Full details on the county's policies, procedures and processes with regard to safeguarding plus analysis of outcomes of serious case reviews can be accessed through the Cumbria LSCB website at

<u>www.cumbrialscb.com</u> the site also has a parental information zone.

In addition to the above the school has a 'Safeguarding Zone' on its website which contains the above link as well as relevant school policies, further information and a diagram showing how we keep your child safe in school. It is well worth a look.

Sharing information is in the best interests of children and their safeguarding. The school reserves the right to share and receive information from other agencies that may have had dealings with your child.

If you ever have any concerns about the safety or wellbeing of a child, then you can ring your concerns through to the County's 24 hour 'Safeguarding Hub' number and you can remain anonymous if you wish. Callers can outline their concerns and the Safeguarding Hub will give advice (consultation) and if necessary, undertake an assessment of need.

There is now also an adult NSPCC helpline where any concerned adult can seek advice if they are concerned about a child and would like advice on whether to make a referral. The number to call is:

Dear Parent/Carer,

Parents have legal responsibility to ensure their child attends school regularly. Regular school attendance is essential for every child and young person. It supports their learning, wellbeing, and future opportunities. Regular attendance means attending every day that school is open unless absence is authorised by the school (eg illness). As the local authority, we work closely with schools to ensure that all pupils attend regularly and punctually, and that families are supported in meeting their legal responsibilities.

Under the current national guidance, parents and carers are required to:

- Ensure their child attends school every day it is open, unless there is a lawful reason for absence (eq illness)
- Inform the school promptly if their child is absent unexpectedly and the reason for absence
- Schedule medical appointments outside of school hours where possible
- Request leave of absence only in exceptional circumstances and submit requests in advance

(Please note: family holidays during term time are not generally considered exceptional and are unlikely to be authorised)

In accordance with the Department for Education's National Framework for Penalty Notices (effective from 19 August 2024), schools are required to consider enforcement action when a child or young person has 10 or more sessions of unauthorised absence (equivalent to five school days) within a rolling 10-week period. While support will always be offered in the first instance, continued unauthorised absences or term-time holidays taken without permission may result in a Fixed Penalty Notice (FPN), or lead to prosecution where appropriate.

In exceptional circumstances, the Local Authority may issue a FPN even if the national threshold has not been met. This may apply where there is evidence to suggest that a parent or carer is deliberately manipulating attendance patterns to avoid enforcement action.

In the last Academic year nearly 2000 FPNs were issued across Cumberland Local Authority for taking children out of school for holidays in term time.

Key points regarding those Fixed Penalty Notices:

- Each FPN issued is a direct alternative to prosecution (so if the Penalty is not paid prosecution is likely).
- Each parent/carer may receive up to two FPNs per child within a three-year period.
- If a third occasion arises, further legal action may be considered, including a prosecution.
- FPNs are issued individually to each parent/carer.
- A number of prosecutions were brought against parents who did not pay the FPN, or FPNs
  if more than one child was concerned, resulting in criminal convictions and fines/costs of up
  to several hundred pounds.

We understand that circumstances can vary, and our aim is always to work in partnership with families to support good attendance. If you are experiencing difficulties that may affect your child's attendance, we encourage you to speak with your child's school or contact our Access and Inclusion Team.

Thank you for your cooperation in helping us ensure that every child receives the full benefit of their education.



When returning the form, we need to see the Birth Certificate and proof of address.

\*\* Please note that a child can attend afternoon Nursery as soon as they turn 3 so can settle in prior to starting properly in the term after their 3<sup>rd</sup> birthday. Further information is available from Nursery or the School Office.

#### **Food & Drink**

◆ School Meals currently cost £15.50 per week payable on ParentPay. This is great value when you look at prices of goods in supermarkets for packed lunches and the hassle of putting them together. We would recommend a hot meal for all the children, particulalrly as we return to school in the Autumn and would encourage those on packed lunches to make a change.

Menus are always on our school web site.

• *Milk* is vital for growing children as it strengthens bones and teeth. Children in Reception and Nursery are entitled to free milk as are children who are eligible for free school meals and clothing vouchers (not the universal free meal for all Reception & KS1 children).

The cost of milk for next half term is £15 and needs to be paid by Friday 7th November 2025 ParentPay NOT cash or cheque. Due to the administrative burden of checking attendance and the inability to change the order daily unfortunately milk money cannot be refunded for absence.



 Snack money for Nursery and Reception is £15 for next half term. This is paid on ParentPay and please pay by Friday 7<sup>th</sup> November 2025.



• Fruit **£15.00** for next half term, again payable on



ParentPay by Friday 7<sup>th</sup> November 2025. This is for playtime snacks.

#### **Beckstone's Extended Services**

Our extended services include the Breakfast Club £5.50 from 7.30am and £5.00 from 8am. Last entry is at

**8.25am.** Prices have risen due to increased costs but are still very competitive.

Our popular afternoon childcare provision is afternoon Nursery – see table in next column please note these places (MUST BE BOOKED IN ADVANCE) with pick up times at 2.15pm and 3.15pm. Please note that unfortunately we are unable to offer facilities for packed lunches for **Nursery** children.





Beckstone Xtra runs from the end of the school day until 5.15pm (the cost is £5 per

#### Coats

We will soon be asking all children to wear their coats at lunchtimes and playtimes. We have an external thermometer and when the outside temperature drops below 13°C then coats are mandatory. Please ensure they come to school with a coat and one that has their name in - thanks!


#### **School Funds**




