




We currently only have national 2023 comparative data for KS2, other Stage comparisons compare to 2022 outcomes.

- Cohort achieved well against EYFS Outcomes across the curriculum
- 31 of the 44 pupils reached GLD and so are well prepared for the move into KS1
- The cohort is stronger in maths (number) than writing



**Resulting Improvement Targets =** 

- Writing outcomes were the weakest of all aspects for this cohort.
- Reception needs to plan for specific writing activities in the direct teaching and the continuous provision to address this next year for the next cohort
- Y1 teachers need to focus interventions and plan for the 13 children moving to Y1 who didn't achieve GLD and for the 12 children not achieving a GLD in Writing.

#### Analysis of outcome

- 45 children in Y1- each child is 2.2%
- 44 children took the test in Year 1 − 1 was disapplied as below standard (8 from Y2 who didn't pass in Y1 also took the check...2/8 passed this time)



- School performing well above national average
- Pupil Premium at 67% whereas non PP 87% so



#### Resulting Targets =

- No Nonsense Phonics to continue to be used from Reception to Y2 to ensure consistency of approach.
- KS1 team to meet with every month to monitor progress and interventions particularly for those who did not meet standard
- Aimee Flook to become Phonics Lead teacher
- Y3 teachers to continue Phonics with the 6 who did not meet standard in Y2



The school awaits the detailed analysis of ASP 2023 national data and performance of groups from further data analysis however the FFT Early Results Service provides very good analysis.



- Expected % for Reading, Writing & maths is 3% above national outcomes.
- Attainment at the end of KS1 is higher than national at expected levels for all subjects compared to last year, 2022 (the last release of national data)
- This above applies to the FFT national sample too apart from Reading which is 2% below their 2023 sample
- At the higher levels ('Greater Depth') the school is below national (FFT 2023) for Reading and Maths (as per last year) but above national for Writing and Science.
- Girls performed significantly higher than boys for Writing and boys significantly higher for Maths
  - In terms of closing the gap, the PP pupils' attainment at 'expected' is below their peers in all subjects



#### Resulting Improvement Targets =

- To focus on improving attainment at high ability levels in all subjects
- To continue to ensure children who don't read regularly at home are additionally supported with their reading at school.
- To carefully track progress of PP children across all subjects and target effective interventions to accelerate learning of this cohort.



## MULTIPLICATION TIMES TABLE CHECK (MTC)



There is no 'pass' mark. Scores are out of 25 and recorded on reports. – 32% got full marks, 25/25 compated with 19% last year.16/50 in 23

- 54% scored over 20 out of 25 (52% in 2022)



#### Resulting Improvement Targets =

- To ensure X Tables are a key focus from Y1-Y4
- Maths passports are embedded into Y4 as they have positively impacted on outcomes this year.




- % achieving expected in R, W & M was below national = 49% compared with 59% nationally.
- School below national comparisons in all subjects for the first time ever. The range is between 3 & 6% apart from Maths which is 18%. Maths is the key issue.
- 1 child missing for all tests so 2.4% below before starting
- 1 child left who was very strong academically. 1 child arrived late in Y6 who didn't achieve 'expected across the board'. This and the above point could have left the school in line with national.
- In reading 5 children missed by one scale point (scored 99) with similar in Maths & Spag for one child and equally for GDS. The parers are being reviewed.
- The Pupil Premium Cohort whilst achieving above national expectation of 100 did not make the progress expected from KS1 had there not been lockdowns. The lockdowns appear to have affected the PP Pupil and SEN pupils the most.



- Maths to feature prominently in school improvement/teacher appraisal/monitoring etc in 2023/24 in Key Stage 2
- To baseline classes at the start of the year in arithmetic to target gaps immediately at the start of the year.
- To focus on staff training through NCETM and block out staff meetings in the Autumn
- To continue to timetable daily 'Maths Revision/Assertive Mentoring' sessions across the school in 23/24 which use weekly formative assessment to address identified gaps in mathematical knowledge.
- To use Professor Assessor software to quickly identify gaps in knowledge and devise interventions to close the gap.
- To closely monitor mathematical standards across the school through pupil interviews, book looks and lesson observations.
- The Maths Action Plan for 23/24 will reflect the above.
- To embed UKS2 staff in 'Reciprocal Reading'
- To embed FFT 'Lightning Squad' interventions from Y1 to Y6 on
- To implement interventions using Rising Star's data and 'Shine' materials
- To support specific individual PP pupils' and their families' needs
  - ESM to contact parents and establish individual support plans e.g. free access to Breakfast Club
  - Access to Beckstone's Uniform Exchange
  - Ensure they know about homework support.




